#### Data point of the month:

ODR's entered from February 26 to March

- •58 total referrals
- 13/48 took place between 12:15 and 12:30 (recess overlap for grades 4,5,and 6)
- •10 were for one student now on an intensive behavior plan.

#### Highlights of the past Month:

Have you heard of Superflex? He's a superhero in our new social-thinking curriculum being used with 50 of our students in grades 1-6. The goal is to provide a fun and engaging way for students to improve their behavioral flexibility and ultimately develop better self-monitoring. The concept is based on the idea that we all have a superhero - SUPERFLEX - in our brains - and he is constantly battling the "Team of Unthinkables" - a variety of unexpected behaviors that try to take over. The students have been eager to take part in these activities.



#### Data point of the month:

March ODR Data 3/1-3/30:

- -Average of 2.6 ODRs per day (National Average is 1.08)
- -52 total referrals
- -92% of students received no ODRs for the month of March. (This shows that PBIS is working at the Tier 1 Level.) 2.4% received 3 or more ODRs in March and account for 67.3% of March ODRs.
- -Four of the six students with 3 or more ODRs are currently on individual behavior plans. Staff will work on interventions for the remaining two.

#### Highlights of the past Month:

88 total referrals
