Needs: K-6 Coaches for Teachers

• When you do something right it takes time. I would like to advocate for one **math coach/specialist to be shared by the K-6 schools** for the 2019-2020 school year. A math coach/specialist would support teachers in the area of curriculum, assessment, and instruction of mathematics by fostering collaboration, reflection, and professional growth.

Goals and Expected Benefits of a K-6 Math Coach:

- 1. Work with teachers to plan, implement, and reflect on mathematics instruction using EM4
- 2. Model best practice in mathematics instruction with teachers as active participants
- 3. Plans and implements mathematics professional development sessions
- 4. Analyzes data and assists administrative team in developing corrective plans
- 5. Facilitates the review, evaluation, and integration of mathematics resources
- 6. Assists teachers in interpreting assessment data
- 7. Keeps a log of their work and develops a weekly coaching calendar
- 8. Provides daily coaching and mentoring support to teachers
- 9. Meets regularly with the leadership team, EM4 team, and Math task force
- 10. Keeps a coaching binder documenting all support services
- 11. Assumes responsibilities for ConnectEd (the online component of our mathematics program).
