

RSU 16 School Board Administrative Report

- **Enrollment** - We have had 29 academic student registrations to date this school year. These learners are participating in classes toward high school completion, college transitions, English language acquisition and/or workforce planning. Currently, over half of these students fall into the 16-20 age range. We also have 6 students enrolled in a computer class with our Business Skills Instructor (and newest team member), Christine O'Donnell.
- **Tech Opportunities** – We are an approved assessment center for 'TechHire', a grant-funded, national initiative to connect high school graduates with Tech jobs through non-traditional pathways. *TechHire Maine* supports and facilitates training, internships, courses and/or career coaching for qualified individuals who have an interest in computers and want to work in middle or high-skill, tech-based jobs.

Professional Development

As Hub 6 Androscoggin & Oxford County Adult Ed programs work together to advance our students using Maine College and Career Access (MCCA) Grant funds, we have recognized the need for shared expectations and more consistency in programming. Directors across the Hub are working mindfully to provide our staffs with opportunities to collaborate. On Friday, October 19, our program will host a networking event for Hub 6 professionals to share instructional materials and best practices in Advising, Math Instruction and English/Language Arts. As a smaller program, events like these are a great opportunity for RSU 16 Adult Education staff to collaborate with others.

Community Enrichment Classes

Approximately 75 people have attended one of our Enrichment classes since school began. Another 80 are already registered for future classes including outdoor safety education, notary, arts and crafts, real estate, self-employment and more! These numbers are higher than what we were experiencing last year at this time.

McKinney Vento Homeless Liaison Report

To date this school year, we have identified 4 McKinney Vento youth in our schools – students who lack a FIXED, ADEQUATE and REGULAR nighttime residence.
