Programming

We will be offering an intensive Customer Service and Retail Fundamentals training during the month of March in conjunction with the Retail Association of Maine and the National Retail Federation Foundation. Successful completion of this class will provide students with two nationally recognized 'RISE Up' retail credentials, as well as a Maine DOE WorkReady credential and a digital literacy certificate. Several local employers have indicated an interest in supporting this initiative in some way, and we will be reaching out to them this month to ask for assistance with presentations, mock interviews, tours, and any other contributions they may be willing to make. We are currently working to figure out a cost for the course and are having conversations with the Lewiston CareerCenter about possible Department of Labor funding sources to help low-income and/or unemployed individuals access the course.

McKinney Vento Homeless Liaison

To date this school year, we have identified 16 McKinney Vento youth in our schools. These are students who lack a FIXED, ADEQUATE and REGULAR nighttime residence.
