Point of View

The perspective from which a story is told.

Knowing who is telling a story gives you its point of view. The best way to determine a story's point of view is to investigate its pronouns.

For example, if the narrator

uses the pronoun /, that means the story is being told in the first person.



Examples

- First Person: Events are told by one character, using the pronoun I. Readers step inside the character's shoes and see events only through his/her point of view.
- Third-Person Limited: Events are told through the eyes of one character using third-person pronouns, such as he or she. Readers see events only from his/her point of view.
- Third-Person Omniscient: Events are told by someone outside the story, using pronouns such as he or she. This narrator can magically read everybody's mind.




Directions: Write a rhythm using the note groupings at the top. Notice there is only 2 beats in each measure. Clap it using ti ti's and Tah's.




