The content includes but is not limited to communication skills, leadership, human relations and employability skills, safe and efficient work practices; Florida barber law and rules, knowledge of barbering and its related chemistry, bacteriology, anatomy and physiology; development of skill in performing the manipulative technique required in the practice of barbering.

Program Requirements

The State of Florida requires students to meet the basic skill level requirement prior to program completion. The basic skills grade levels for this program are: Math: 9, Communications: 9
