Fun activities that will keep your child learning all summer long

Children are ready for learning during the summer as they are throughout the rest of the year. So don't miss out on the chance to boost your child's knowledge during the summer months. Here are four brain-building activities to enjoy this summer.

1. Plant a garden together. Your child will have a real-world chance to use reasoning and math skills. "We have a 12-foot by 10-foot plot in the yard. If tomatoes need to be planted at least two feet apart, how many should we buy? What else should we plant?"
2. Participate in a library program. Summer library programs often include storytelling sessions, interactive read-aloud, book clubs and arts and crafts.

3. Have a family game night, set aside one evening each week to play board games together. Classics like Scrabble and Boggle are good for keeping language skills sharp. And more complex games like Monopoly and chess require your child to use reasoning and think critically.
4. Backyard stargazing can be a fun experience for all. Learning the constellations or the planets of the solar system. Listen to your child's questions about space and the night sky and answer the best you can.

As the bell rings on the last day of school and students transition from the rigorous pace of the classroom to summer, an opportunity presents itself to accelerate learning in fun and engaging ways. Your child is more likely to spend time reading this summer if the whole family does this together. To add to the fun, have a:

- **Beach-read day.** Wear swimsuits and read on beach towels or in lawn chairs. Stories about ocean life will keep them intrigued.
- **Reading campout.** Get into pajamas and get your flashlight. Set up in your living room or backyard. S'mores can be an extra tasty treat. Spooky tales or adventure books will keep them snuggled up close.
- **Superhero-read day.** Make a superhero mask or a blanket superhero cape. Everyone will have magical powers or fight villains, let your imagination wander as you read a Marvel comic book or fictional creations that inspire all of us.
