#### **School Goals for Student Achievement**

- <u>Pre-K:</u> Build confidence and independence in the school setting for preparation for kindergarten.
- <u>Kindergarten</u>: ELA: Recognize/write letters, identify word sounds, master high-frequency words, and identify rhymes. Math: Count to 100, understand number relationships, connect counting to cardinality, represent addition/subtraction, and add/subtract to 5.
- 1st Grade: ELA: Match letters and sounds, write simple words, read/write first-grade words, and follow English rules. Math: Solve addition word problems (sums up to 20), understand subtraction, and read/write numbers.
- <u>2nd Grade:</u> ELA: Decode complex words, write narrative/opinion/expository texts, and follow English rules. Math: Determine unknowns, use addition in array, count within 1000, skip-count, and add twodigit numbers.
- 3rd Grade: ELA: Decode words/suffixes, read fluently, compose texts, and use grade-level vocabulary. Math: Interpret whole number products, use multiplication/division, understand division, solve 2step word problems, and represent with equations.
- 4th Grade: ELA: Apply phonics skills, read fluently, create narratives/expository texts, and use planning/revision. Math: Solve word problems, assess answer reasonableness, add/subtract whole numbers, multiply fractions, use decimals for fractions, and apply area/perimeter formulas.
- <u>5th Grade:</u> ELA: Apply phonics/word-analysis, read fluently, write personal/fictional narratives, claims, and expository texts. Following the rules of standard English, use planning, revising, and editing. Math: Use parentheses, brackets, or braces, interpret decimals, measure volumes, use and analyze place value, and round decimals.
