- Successful candidates must have taken or be registered to take the Fundamentals of Engineering Exam administered by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering & Surveying (NCEES) prior to appointment.
- SPECIAL NOTE: For continuing eligibility, all trainees must obtain an Engineering Intern License issued by the Florida Board of Professional Engineers within twelve months of appointment.
- The Program is not open to individuals who are licensed Professional Engineers or who are qualified for licensure.
