City of Brooksville Proclamation

WHEREAS, the City of Brooksville recognizes the importance a providing a high-quality education for every child, and family engagement in a child's educational journey is crucial to their academic and social emotional success; and

WHEREAS, parents are a child's first teacher, creating and environment where learning takes place not just in the classroom, but as an essential part of family life; and

WHEREAS, Florida Executive Order 91-32 ensures that students are prepared to become civically engaged and knowledgeable adults who make positive contributions to their communities; and

WHEREAS, family-school partnerships provide many benefits that are essential to building community support for education and improving students' academic experiences, increasing graduation rates, and the likelihood of students enrolling in postsecondary educational and career opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Florida empowers parents to make the best educational decisions for their child and encourages schools and families to work together for all students throughout the school year; and

WHEREAS, there are many ways schools can foster connections with families to include sharing classroom expectations and their child's learning goals including offering volunteer, in-classroom activities and parent-school opportunities that support education; using multiple methods of communications to establish effective home-school collaborations; and providing opportunities for parents and families to support their child's learning; and

WHEREAS, this year, The Family Empowerment Scholarship Program, established to increase educational opportunities to students and families, is the largest first-year implementation of a private school choice program in Florida, with 18,000 students benefitting; and

WHEREAS, funding increases passed by the Florida Legislature cleared the waitlist for Gardiner Scholarship Program, benefitting students with special needs; and

WHEREAS, Florida Family Engagement in Education Month is an opportunity to recognize the exceptional contributions made by families who foster a love for learning in their child, and by educators who acknowledge the importance of family engagement as an integral part of the mission of all schools.

This program is a "Weekend Backpack" program for our students who are in need. "Operation Heartfelt" is dedicated to helping out our students in Hernando County. The "Fill-the-Backpack" program is aimed at combating childhood hunger by providing nutritious and easy-to-prepare food (and hygiene products) for our students who may not have access to sufficient amounts of food for the weekend and/or holidays.

Weekend Blessings is a program designed to provide four meals and snacks to school age children on weekends. In schools where this program has been in operation for at least one full school year, it has produced dramatic results for children enrolled. Some of the benefits include increased attendance, higher test scores, fewer behavioral problems, and increased parent participation. Weekend Blessings works with several organizations and schools.

The People Helping People in Hernando County, Inc.'s program for Weekend Blessings selection criteria includes students who may not have access to adequate food resources on the weekend. These are students who without this additional food resource would be arriving at school hungry on Mondays.

Criteria that may be used for selection in the Weekend Blessings program are those students who have any of the following characteristics:

- Family is determined to be homeless.
- Parents/caregivers who are seeking assistance from the school.
- Student is living with grandparents/relatives and generally considered to be at risk.
- Family is headed by single and/or disabled parent.
- Families in distress due to unemployment, recent job loss, foreclosures on homes, etc.



Any person using, operating, or driving a vehicle on or over the roads or highways of this state shall, upon approaching any school bus which displays a stop signal, bring such vehicle to a full stop while the bus is stopped, and the vehicle shall not pass the school bus until the signal has been withdrawn.
