PROGRAM GOALS

- Support the overall health and well-being of teenage mothers, fathers and their infants, through the provision of educational and ancillary services.
- Educate TAP program students in prenatal and postnatal healthcare, parenting skills, benefits of sexual abstinence, and the consequences of subsequent pregnancies, without increasing their academic disadvantage.

- Transportation –is provided to and from TAPP Enrichment Center (NCTHS) regardless of distance.
- Life Skills (Budgeting / Token Economy) Students will receive "baby bucks" to purchase items such as diapers, wipes, blankets, etc.
