Step 1: Apply for a Certificate of Eligibility beginning January 1, 2025. Visit the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco & Hernando and complete the online application for a Certificate of Eligibility (voucher). For more information, please call the Early Learning Coalition at (727) 233-8291.

Step 2: Enroll at School Site - Call the school to verify your address for zoning and registration hours. Starting Monday, March 3, 2025, bring the following documents to your zoned school:

- Certificate of Eligibility (voucher)
- Birth Certificate/proof of child's age
- Florida Certificate of Immunization (DH Form 680)
- Physical examination certificate signed by a licensed examiner
- Proof of Florida residency

FREE full day program for students living in the following school zones:

- Deltona Elementary

- J.D. Floyd Elementary
- Moton Elementary




