Celebrate your Child's Success

Let's celebrate your child's incredible achievements, both personal and academic! Their hard work, dedication, and growth deserve to be recognized. From overcoming challenges to excelling in school, every step they take is worth honoring. Congratulations to them on

- 1. Capture a picture of your child reaching their goal whether it's holding up a report card or a photo from their last day of school. You could also have your child draw a picture of the accomplishment. Hang it on the fridge. When children frequently see images of themselves succeeding, they begin to see themselves as achievers.
- 2. Plan a special surprise. On one side of a piece of paper, write down a goal your child

wants to achieve. On the other side, write down a small reward—such as having a friend over for a sleepover or a one-on-one activity with you. When they reach that goal, they can turn the paper over and see their reward.

3. Let your child choose a celebratory meal to honor their success or set up a table with some of their favorite foods. During dinner, encourage your child to share a few words about how great it feels to achieve their goal. 4. Sticker charts are another great way to track accomplishments. Your child can add a sticker to the chart, and once they complete a row, they can earn a reward.






## Parents make a difference
