

General Statement:

The Technology Coach inspires and participates in the development and implementation of a shared vision for the comprehensive integration of technology to differentiate and enhance student learning and support transformational change throughout the instructional environment.

Professional development is the formal means through which you will promote the continuous learning and improvement among educators and educational leaders. Elevating the role of technology in the classroom from that of supplement to a core teaching component requires a shift in instructional practices. The technology coach will provide structured support and necessary "just in time," embedded, and ongoing technology-related professional development for teachers, instructional leaders. Much of the work will be self-directed and within flexible parameters.

Qualifications:

- Preference for past experience as a Technology Coach
- Comfortable integrating technology into instruction, willing to learn, and spread knowledge; AND
- Experience educating teachers or other adults in the integration of technology for instruction, management, and productivity using all of the following modes: modeling, one to one, small group or large group; AND

- Uses technology on a regular basis within his or her own classroom for instruction, classroom management, and as a tool to help differentiate instruction; AND
- Understands key learning theories and methods of research-based instruction as related to technology integration; AND
- Possess thorough knowledge of Federal and State regulations as they relate to instructional technology and student data privacy.

Responsibilities:

- Assist instructional staff with technology integration strategies and/or lessons. Technology Coach assists teachers in the selection of appropriate district owned software and helps the teacher plan and/or work through lessons that integrate technology in the curriculum in a thoughtful student-focused manner.
- Model technology integration strategies with building faculty through the course of the year. Each coach will work with their building principal to establish and schedule opportunities.
- Maintain a log indicating their coaching activities, that the instructional staff has worked with, and the outcome of those meetings.
- Act as a liaison for the needs of staff (and students) through serving as a member of the district technology steering committee.
- Conference and collaborate with other coaches and instructional leaders for the purpose of planning professional development activities.
- Collaborate with individual teaching staff to define their specific technology training needs.
- Assisting staff in selecting the best technologies to use to meet instructional needs of students.
- Assist in the compliance with software licensing laws and privacy regulations.
