2022-2023 Seabrook School Board Goals

Goal #1: Academic Excellence The Seabrook School Board will work with administration and the SAU in the continued pursuit of academic excellence for all students in Seabrook schools by:

- Providing continued support for the consistent articulation of K-8 academic programming, measured through implementation of programming and board presentations.
- Providing continued support for pK-8 literacy, measured through the implementation of programming and professional development.
- Providing continued support for tiered interventions and extensions for all students in Seabrook schools, measured through articulation & implementation of Tier 1, 2 & 3 supports for students.

Goal #2: School Culture The Seabrook School Board will work with administration and the SAU to promote a positive and supportive school culture at both elementary and middle levels by:

- Providing continued support for Social Emotional Learning (SEL) for students that emphasizes connection with both peers and adults, including trauma informed teaching and learning, measured through implementation of programming and board presentations.
- Providing continued support for behavior remediation for students, including Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), measured through implementation of programming and designation of resources.
- Providing continued support for a positive school culture that fosters teamwork between students, staff, faculty, and school board.

Goal #3: Community Connections The Seabrook School Board will work with administration and the SAU to promote positive communication connection with the larger Seabrook community by:

- Providing continued support for connection with local businesses, community organizations, trade schools, and nonprofits through personal goal setting, internships and/ or Extended Learning Opportunities (ELOs), measured through implementation of programming and board presentations.
