SCENARIO 1- BLENDED LEARNING



This maintains our normal learning model with AM/ PM sessions.

Procedures for social distancing and PPE will follow the required protocols by the state. Students are on campus for 4 hours a day, 4 days a week.

Increased Social-Emotional supports.

This plan would be in effect when the region is set at a phase 4 or above

SCENARIO 2-

SELECTED REMOTE LEARNING



This is used for families that request to maintain a virtual learning environment based on personal beliefs or feelings.

Students would work virtually, still participating in scheduled classes through remote options. This is also for times when outbreaks may happen through the year

This plan is available for all students with a signed/ Approved Ed Development Plan

SCENARIO 3-

REMOTE LEARNING



This would happen with a stay-at-home order by the Governor. This would require students and staff to work from home with required live instruction.

Students will have options for one on one supports along with regular class interaction

This plan is for when the region moves to a phase 3 or below.
