What is Title I?

- ⇒ Work with our families to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of family engagement.
- Collect feedback from families at all events, post feedback form on the school website in order to respond to families' request for additional support for family engagement activities/events.
- Provide alternate meetings times or digital copies of meeting materials upon request.

Who is it for?
