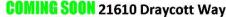

Facts about the Red-Shouldered Hawk

- The Red-shouldered Hawk is named for its reddish upper wing coverts, or shoulders.
- Another distinctive field mark: translucent wing crescents, or "windows", near the base of the wingtips, visible when the bird soars or glides overhead.
- This attractive raptor is smaller and slimmer than the more widespread Red-tailed Hawk, almost resembling an accipiter such as the Cooper's Hawk.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are typically between 15 to 19 inches long, with a wingspan of 37 to 43 inches wide, and weigh between 17 and 27 ounces.
- In the eastern United States, the Red-shouldered Hawk and the Barred Owl often share the same swampy woodlands and riparian areas and they pray on similar animals. The conflict between these two animals is kept to a minimum because the owl hunts at night and the hawk hunts during the day.
- The subspecies in South Florida has paler markings and a lighter overall appearance than other Redshouldered Hawks. The subspecies in the West Coast of the United States has an especially striking black-andwhite checkerboard pattern on their back.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are among the noisiest of North American raptors. They have a repertoire of at least seven different calls. Their distinctive calls are often mimicked by Blue Jays.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are very vocal when disturbed at their nests, especially if a potential predator is nearby. They tend to also be noisy while courting. During one courtship display, a pair soars in broad circles while giving a series of three to four screaming "kee-aah" calls. Males also vocalize during a solo display, circling high into the air, then descending in a steep dive, followed by a rapid, spiraling ascent.
- After mating, both birds of a pair build a large stick nest, which they often reuse from year to year. The nest construction is a process that takes 1 to 5 weeks. The nest will be two feet in diameter and lined with bark, lichen, moss and conifer sprigs. The adults



will also add fresh green leaves throughout the nesting season.

- Both parents aggressively defend the nest and incubate the eggs. The female broods the chicks during their nestling stage, while the male brings food to the nest. Both parents feed the young after they fledge.
- Red-shouldered Hawks prefer to hunt from a perch in the forest understory; they also fly fairly low through the forest so they can pounce on their prey in a stealthy surprise attack.
- Aquatic and semi-aquatic animals, including frogs, small fish, snakes, and crayfish are the main items in the Red-Shouldered Hawk's diet.
- By the time they are five days old, nesting Redshouldered Hawks can shoot their feces over the edge of their nest. Seeing bird poop on the ground in an area that they frequent, is a sign of an active nest.
- A group of hawks has many collective nouns, including; a "boil", a "knot", a "spiraling", a "stream", and/or a "tower".
- These birds are a stable species and are not threatened or endangered as of now.

HOA News

The Wilderness Lake Preserve Homeowners' Association Annual Membership Meeting was held on February 25th. Many thanks to all who attended the annual meeting or sent in their proxies. We had sufficient proxies to hold the meeting without any last minute shuffling.

Our liaison with the Highway Patrol spoke at the annual meeting. He explained their process and reported that in the 6-month period from August to January, 276 tickets were issued for speeding, 61 for running stop signs, and 127 for other miscellaneous violations. The HOA contracts with Florida Highway Patrol for 4 hour shifts at varying times and days in an effort to help with speeding issues and be a visible presence in the neighborhood. Troopers have discretion in ticketing and often give warnings in lieu of tickets unless the violation is flagrant. Warnings are tracked in their system so repeat offenders are ticketed for subsequent infractions.

Highway Patrol cannot ticket for parking as that is under Pasco County. Parking violations should be called in to the non-emergency number of the Pasco County Sheriff's Office. Golf carts were discussed, and this community is not a golf cart community. Driving golf carts on sidewalks is prohibited by law. Only licensed golf carts are allowed on streets by the county and any violation of this needs to be reported to the Pasco County Sheriff's Office non-emergency number. Per state law, children under 14 are prohibited from driving any kind of golf cart.

Pool Season News



Pool season is here and the pools are a great place to unwind and enjoy a relaxing BBQ with your family and friends. Upon arriving at the Aquatics, you will notice a Pool Attendant stationed at the front gate. The Pool Attendant will ask to see your Lodge Access Card ID; you will sign in yourself, family and guests. After signing in, the Pool Attendant will issue you a wristband. The wristband must be worn at all times while using the Aquatics. This process ensures compliance with the Board mandated Aquatics rules.

Just a few friendly reminders...

Aquatics Safety Reminders

- *Pools & Jacuzzi close at dusk each night.
- *No food or beverages within 10 feet of pools (FL. Statute).
- *Shower before entering the Pools and/or Jacuzzi (**FL. Statute**).
- *Smoking is prohibited.
- *Glass containers are prohibited.
- *Anyone under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- *Flotation devices are not permitted.
- *Residents ages 12 17 are allowed one guest with parental permission. (Guests must be at least 12 years of age.)
- *Residents ages 12 17 must check in with the Lodge Staff and obtain a wristband upon arrival at the Lodge.
- *Safety equipment is in place to meet **FL. Code** and should not be used for recreational purposes.
- *Each WLP family is allowed to bring up to 5 non-resident guests.
- *Swimming from the community owned docks is prohibited.

Recipe of the Month April Fools Meatloaf "Cake"

Ingredients

FOR THE BISCUITS:

- 2 lbs lean ground beef
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup breadcrumbs
- 2/3 cup sliced green onion
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh parsley
- 3 large garlic cloves, minced
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 (12 ounce) jar roasted red peppers, drained and patted dry
- 3 1/2 cups hot mashed potatoes
- 8 cherry tomatoes, stems removed

DIRECTIONS:

Preparing the Meatloaf:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F In a large bowl, combine ground beef, eggs, bread crumbs, green onions, milk, parsley, garlic, Worcestershire sauce, salt and pepper just until blended.
- 2. Divide mixture between two 8-inch round cake pans, patting to cover pans evenly and make level.
- 3. Bake meatloaves until juices run clear when meat is pierced with a fork, or meat loaves register 170F on a meat thermometer, 20–25 minutes. Remove pans from the oven; cover loosely with foil and let stand for 10 minutes.

Decorating the Meatloaf:

1. Pour off juices from pans. Invert 1 meat loaf onto a flat serving plate. Using a small sharp knife, trim red peppers so that they lie flat. Cover top of meatloaf with a single layer of roasted red peppers.



2. Invert second meatloaf onto red pepper layer. Using a spatula, spread 2 1/2 cups mashed potatoes over top and sides of meatloaf. Spoon remaining potatoes into a pastry bag fitted with a large star tip. Pipe swirls around top edges of cake. Pipe stars around bottom of cake.

3. Place cherry tomatoes, stem-ends down, in a ring around top of meatloaf "cake" to resemble cherries. Cut meatloaf into wedges; serve immediately. Drizzle with gravy "sauce" (optional).

Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously, they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the

wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact the District Office to discuss any questions you may have, 813-994-1001.

**Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.



March 4th, 2020 CDD Highlights

The meeting was called to order at 9:30am, with all Board members in attendance, along with: Peter Lucadano (arriving after the start of the meeting), Greg Woodcock, Tish Dobson and Matthew Huber.

Mr. Estel led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

During Supervisor Requests and Walk On Items: Ms. Edwards mentioned that the agenda had items mixed up in it, as well as she gave direction on how she would like any future revised Dropbox items sent out, the Board agreed with her on this request. Mr. Diver mentioned the new radar sign, as well as, the missing streetlight. Mr. Weissing mentioned he would like an update on the SWFWMD inspection performed by the Engineer.

Under the Landscape Report: Mr. Lucadano reviewed their progress for the month and answered the Board's questions pertaining to the landscape.

The District Engineer, Mr. Woodcock, gave the Board an update on the recent inspection of the lakes and ponds. Mr. Woodcock stated he would have proposals for the next CDD meeting to clean the silt out of some of the pipes, but most appeared to be operating correctly. Mr. Woodcock reported the skimmer on Pond #8 needs work (that it was not defective) it needs updating to account for the changes in water levels. Mr. Woodcock presented two proposals for the Board's review recommending the Sitemasters proposal for \$1500.00. The Board approved this proposal and directed Staff to pay for this work from the Special Projects line under Lake Wetland Management. Mr. Woodcock gave the Board an update on the HVAC project, indicating that the truss repairs and Test & Balance should be completed by the end of the next week.

Under Lodge Manager's Report, Ms. Dobson gave the Board an update on the removal of trees by Duke Energy. Mr. Estel brought forward a discussion regarding the Pickleball Court and the use of temporary lines vs permanent lines. After a discussion, the Board approved an increase in the amount of \$1000.00 for the purchase of permanent painted lines and all of the materials associated with Pickleball. Ms. Dobson presented the Extreme Concrete proposal to remove the rust stains from the sidewalk

in the community. Mr. Watson indicated he had a way for Staff to work on this in-house and the Board agreed to test this prior to moving ahead with Extreme Concrete.

Under Business items, Mr. Huber and Ms. Dobson reviewed the concrete sidewalk repair proposals for the Board. The Board choose to remove the sidewalk ramp at the Lodge Playground/Pool area. The Board approved the Romaner Graphics proposal in the amount of \$10,300.00 which will be paid from the Reserve Account.

Mr. Huber opened the discussion of Landscape for the Board, with the Board ultimately deciding to add \$5,000.00 to the Plant Replacement line in the proposed draft budget for FY20-21.

Mr. Huber opened the discussion of Additional ADA Website Documents, with the Board approving an additional \$1,000.00 to be added to it presently for additional uploading of PDFs.

Mr. Huber opened the discussion of Increased Community Events for Children with Mr. Watson suggesting ways to improve events for children in the community.

Mr. Huber presented the Minutes from the February 5, 2020 CDD meeting, with Mr. Diver mentioning that the wrong minutes were in the agenda but he had reviewed them and there was only a minor change. The Board made a motion to approve the minutes as described by Mr. Diver.

Mr. Huber presented the Operation and Maintenance expenditures for January 2020, in the amount of \$154,683.69, the Board approved these as presented.

Mr. Huber presented the Reserve Study report, the Board had no comments or questions.

Mr. Huber presented the January 2020 Financial Statements, the Board had no comments or questions.

Under District Manager's report, Mr. Huber reviewed all updates pertaining to the transition of the prior CDD website and emails. Ms. Edwards requested that Mr. Huber confirm all emails, old and new, are being saved. Mr. Huber reminded the Board that their next regular meeting would be April 1, 2020 at 9:30am.
