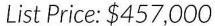

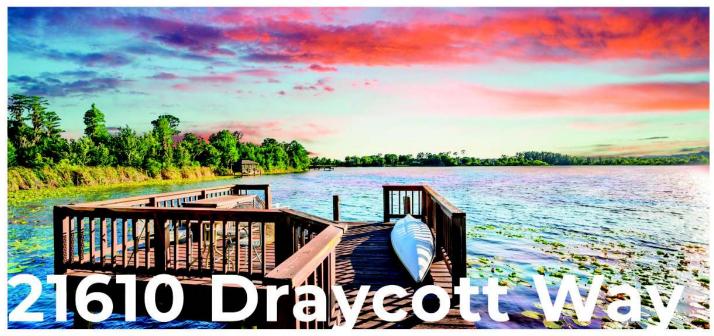

# Little Blue Heron

- This is a fairly small heron with a slight body, slender neck, and fairly long legs. It has rounded wings, and a long, straight, spear-like bill that is thick at the base.
- On average, they weigh around 11.5 oz and their fully stretched wingspan can measure up to 40 inches.
- The Little Blue Heron is between the sizes of a crow and a goose; approximately the size of a Snowy Egret.
- Adult Little Blue Herons are very dark all over. At close range or in good light, they have a rich purplemaroon head and neck and dark slate-blue body. They have yellow eyes, greenish legs, and a bill that is pale blue at the base, black at the tip.
- Juveniles are entirely white, except for vague dusky tips to the outer primaries. Immatures molting into adult plumage are a patchwork of white and blue.
- Inhabiting much of the Americas, this species is found from southern California and in the southeastern part of the US to Central Brazil and Peru. Outside of the mating season it may travel as far north as Canada.
- A row of "teeth" along this heron's middle toe acts as a grooming comb. It uses this useful tool for scratching its head, neck, and throat.
- The Little Blue Heron is a stand-and-wait predator, rather than a dashing-about predator. They watch the water for fish and other small morsels, changing locations by walking slowly or by flying to a completely different site.
- They usually forage in water 2–6 inches deep, often gravitating toward densely vegetated foraging sites.
- Look for Little Blue Herons on quiet waters ranging from tidal flats and estuaries to streams, swamps, and flooded fields. They are usually found in only small numbers at any one water body, often tucked into hidden corners.
- Little Blue Herons nest and forage in many kinds of wetlands, including swamps, marshes, ponds, streams, lagoons, tidal flats, canals, ditches, fish hatcheries, and flooded fields. They nest mostly in shrubs and small trees in standing water or upland sites on islands, including artificial islands created from dredged material.

- A courting male points his bill straight upward, suddenly extending and retracting his neck.
- Little Blue Herons of both sexes, when courting, may occasionally grasp, pull, and shake branches while simultaneously erecting the feathers along their head, neck, and back.
- After pairing up, a male and female spend 3–5 days building a porous platform nest of long, mostly leafless twigs and sticks lined with greener vegetation. Usually the male finds nesting material and passes it to the female, who constructs the bulk of the nest; he occasionally assists her, or performs ritual twig-shaking displays nearby. The nest has an outside diameter of 1–1.5 feet.
- In wintertime, Little Blue Herons make especially frequent use of mangroves, lagoons, salt ponds, and mudflats.
- Little Blue Herons eat mostly small fish, supplemented by a variety of small amphibians as well as crustaceans, grasshoppers, dragonflies and other invertebrates. Types of fish prey vary by region, and may include anchovies, killifish, gobies, perch, darters, bass, minnows, carp, and others. Invertebrate prey may include crayfish, prawns, isopods, crabs, and a wide variety of insects.
- Little Blue Herons have an incubation period of 22-23 days and a nesting period of 35-49 days. They usually lay 3-5 pale bluish green eggs per clutch and each egg is approximately 1.8" in length and 1.4" in width. She will lay these eggs over a period of 5-8 days, not all at once.
- When they are born, Little Blue Heron hatchlings are covered with sparse white down and their eyes are partially open.
- Parents feed their young by dropping food into their nest, and later, putting it into the chicks' mouths.
- At about three weeks chicks leave the nest, starting with short trips around the area of the nest. At 30 days old, they are able to fly out of the nesting area. They become independent at around 42 to 49 days, and are able to breed at one year old.
- Much like chickens, a female Little Blue Heron is named a hen, a male is named a cock, and a baby is named a chick.

# Little Blue Heron continued

- Message From The HOA Board

- Little Blue Heron populations declined by 55% between 1966 and 2015, according to the North American Breeding Bird Survey. The species rates at 14 out of 20 on the Continental Concern Score.
- Little Blue Heron is on the 2016 State of North America's Birds' Watch List, which includes bird species that are most at risk of extinction without significant conservation actions to reverse declines and reduce threats.
- Habitat loss and human-caused changes in local water dynamics pose the most serious threats to regional populations.
- The Migratory Bird Treaty Act as well as state wildlife laws protect herons from harassment, killing, or collecting. However, Little Blue Herons that forage at fish hatcheries are vulnerable to illegal shooting; and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and some states issue permits to legally shoot them.



Now that the afternoon rains are firing up, grass and weeds are growing, well like weeds. Make sure that your grass mowing and edging schedule are keeping up with the growth. Inspect driveway seams for weed growth and take appropriate action. Trees need to be trimmed up over roadways and sidewalks. And while you're out there, say hi to your neighbor. This is the greatest place to live!

Extensions of deadline are always available for almost any violation, and certainly some issues and resident circumstances will require extra time to be dealt with. We ask that you contact our Manager via email for two important reasons: he is frequently driving properties and not in a position to look up your property or adequately address your issue while he's on the road; and an email trail protects you and your attempt to comply or get clarification. Also keep in mind, neighbors can forward deed restriction problems to the Manager. We've seen some folks get upset because their violation cites evening or weekend issues, but a violation is a violation regardless of evening, weekend, or holiday.



# Recipe of the Month Healthier Chicken Pot Pie

Total: 1 hour & 5 min / Yield: 4 servings (3 per person)

### **Ingredients**

- 1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breast halves - cubed
- 1½ cups sliced carrots
- 1 cup frozen green peas
- ½ cup sliced celery
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon celery seed
- 1 ¾ cups chicken broth
- 2/3 cup low-fat (1%) milk
- ¼ cup chopped Italian parsley
- 2 (9 inch) unbaked whole wheat pie crust

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F (220 degrees C).
- 2. Combine chicken, carrots, peas, and celery in a saucepan. Cover with water. Boil until chicken is no longer pink in the middle and vegetables are fork tender, about 15 minutes. Remove from heat, drain, and set aside.
- 3. Cook and stir onions in butter in a saucepan over medium heat, until soft and translucent, about 5 minutes. Stir in flour, salt, pepper, and celery seed. Slowly stir in chicken broth and milk. Simmer over medium-low heat until thick, about 5 minutes. Stir in parsley and remove from heat. Set aside.
- 4. Place chicken mixture in bottom pie crust; pour hot liquid mixture over. Cover with top crust, seal edges, and cut away excess dough. Make several small slits in top to allow steam to escape.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven until pie is golden brown and filling is bubbly, 30 to 35 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes before serving.

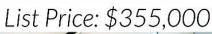

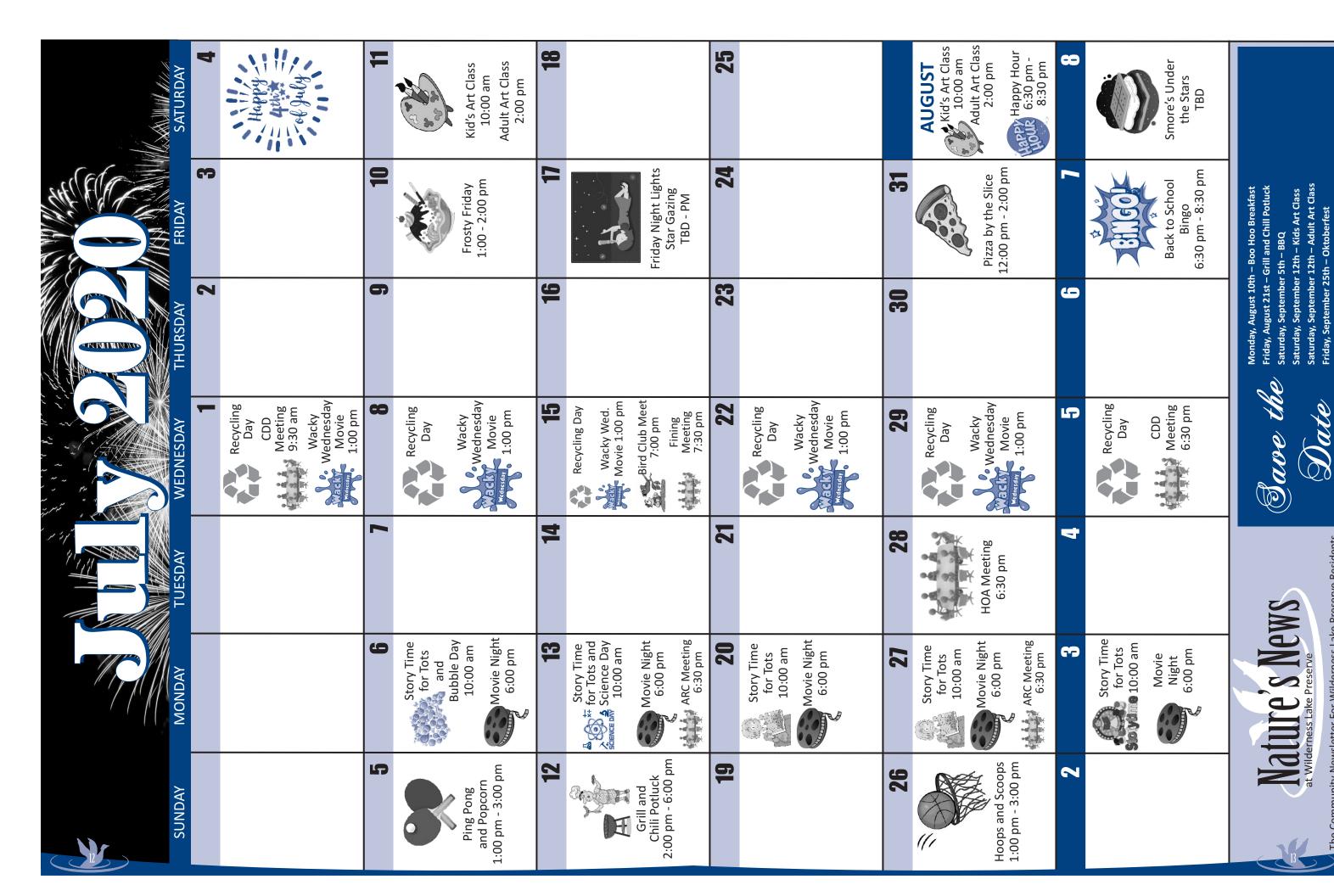

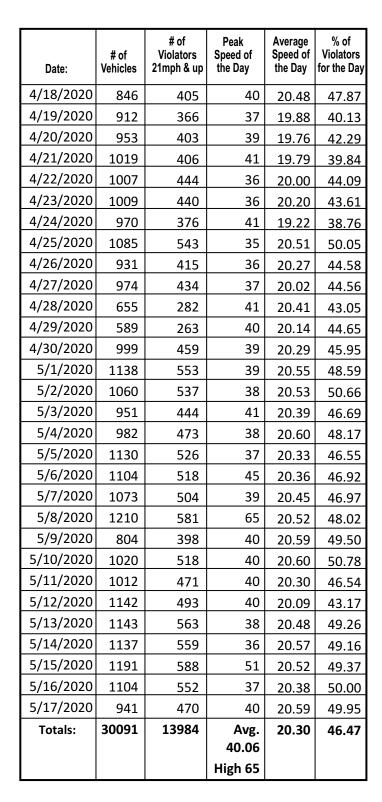

The special meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District was held on Wednesday, June 3, 2020 at 9:30 a.m. conducted by means of communications media technology telephone pursuant to Executive Orders 20-52 and 20-69 issued by Governor DeSantis on March 9, 2020 and March 20, 2020, respectively, and pursuant to Section 120.54(5)(b)2., Florida Statutes.

#### First Order Of Business - Call to Order

Mr. Huber called the meeting to order confirming a quorum for the meeting.

#### Second Order Of Business - Audience Comments

Rich Franconeri relayed to the Board how great of a job Ms. Dobson has done with the re-opening of the amenities.

### Third Order Of Business - Discussion Of Full Phase Re-Opening

A lengthy discussion ensued between all board members regarding full phase re-opening.

Ms. Edwards requested a definition of "Emergency Meeting" from District Counsel. Mr. Vericker explained that an Emergency Meeting can be called at any time as long as there is a 24-hour advance notice given to the Board of Supervisors. The legal ad can be run after the fact of an Emergency Meeting unlike a regular or special meeting.

Mr. Estel asked Mr. Vericker to explain the current rules of procedure that allow the Chair or Vice Chair to call these meetings.

Mr. Diver mentioned that The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD has never held an emergency meeting and that he would like these kinds of meetings to be called only when at least two board members are in agreement.

Ms. Edwards asked District Counsel how the CDD should

address future updates from Government.

Mr. Vericker suggested authorizing the Chair/Vice Chair authority to make these changes or advertise additional updates.

On a motion by Mr. Diver, seconded by Ms. Edwards, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved all actions from the Emergency meeting for the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District.

Further discussion ensued regarding Staff making changes to re-open. Ms. Edwards does not want one Board Member to have sole ability to make changes, included Vice Chair at this point. Mr. Weissing suggested if there is any action taken there must be concurrence by the Chair/Vice Chair. This was added to the original motion.

On a motion by Ms. Edwards, seconded by Mr. Diver, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors authorized the "Management Team" to re-open and will require concurrence from Chair and Vice Chair. This must include all Federal requirements and guidelines pursuant the latest updates given by Governor DeSantis for the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District.

#### Fourth Order Of Business - Review of May 2020 PSA Report

Several proposals were presented by Ms. Dobson and the following discussion ensued.

Ms. Edwards wanted recommendations from Ms. Dobson on which proposals to approve.

Ms. Dobson informed the board of the Red Tree proposal for Hardwood tree pruning is \$1,925.00 which is equal to \$275.00 per tree. She also mentioned that there are trees on the main boulevard that have limbs hanging low and are hit by heavy trucks driving by. Ms. Dobson will have a tree inventory by July's meeting.

On a motion by Mr. Diver, seconded by Mr. Weissing, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved up to 20 trees for the main Blvd. at \$5,500.00 for the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District.

On a motion by Mr. Weissing, seconded by Mr. Diver, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved the Red Tree proposal at \$1,925.00 for Hardwood tree pruning with a total of seven trees, for the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District.

GHS report and hers. Multiple violations were presented at this time. Mr. Burnite brought it to the board's attention that Texas Aquatics are concerned with putting their machinery in the Wetland "T" area.

Ms. Edwards asked Ms. Dobson for an update on new plant enhancements.

Mr. Watson requested to replace an area with a new tree and the wetlands team will replace it as Red Tree will not replace it or pay for it. Ms. Edwards asked Ms. Dobson to speak with Pete L. about this issue as it has occurred in the past.

Mr. Diver asked about the hedge fill in on Oakhurst, wondering if it is still up to the board.

### Sixth Order Of Business - Lodge Manager's Report

Ms. Dobson presented her Manager's Report to the Board of Supervisors.

Mr. Watson asked Ms. Dobson about the woods area being cut into and asked if there were any further updates. Ms. Edwards would like an update on the sauna, Hayley's return, and activities for the summer. 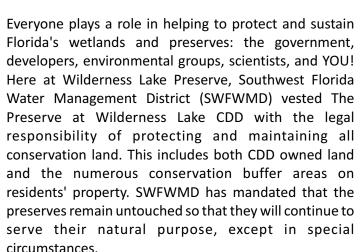
Ms. Edwards said that his statement was very vague and asked for more of a detailed explanation on what he would

# Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas



Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously, they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in

compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact the District Office to discuss any questions you may have, 813-994-1001.

\*\*Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

### AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any nonauthorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.
