



Facts about the Red-Shouldered Hawk

- The Red-shouldered Hawk is named for its reddish upper wing coverts, or shoulders.
- Another distinctive field mark: translucent wing crescents, or "windows", near the base of the wingtips, visible when the bird soars or glides overhead.
- This attractive raptor is smaller and slimmer than the more widespread Red-tailed Hawk, almost resembling an accipiter such as the Cooper's Hawk.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are typically between 15 to 19 inches long, with a wingspan of 37 to 43 inches wide, and weigh between 17 and 27 ounces.
- These hawks have rounded wing tips that do not reach the tip of the tail.
- First-year mortality rates of Red-shouldered Hawks are high. In one study, only about 50% of hatched Redshouldered Hawks survived to be one year old. For those that survive their first year, Red-shouldered Hawks can live to be 15-19 years old in the wild, with one report of a 26-year-old hawk!
- In the eastern United States, the Red-shouldered Hawk and the Barred Owl often share the same swampy woodlands and riparian areas and they pray on similar animals. The conflict between these two animals is kept to a minimum because the owl hunts at night and the hawk hunts during the day.
- The subspecies in South Florida has paler markings and a lighter overall appearance than other Redshouldered Hawks. The subspecies in the West Coast of the United States has an especially striking blackand-white checkerboard pattern on their back.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are among the noisiest of North American raptors. They have a repertoire of at least seven different calls. Their distinctive calls are often mimicked by Blue Jays.
- Red-shouldered Hawks are very vocal when disturbed at their nests, especially if a potential predator is nearby. They tend to also be noisy while courting. During one courtship display, a pair soars in broad circles while giving a series of three to four screaming "kee-aah" calls. Males also vocalize during a solo display, circling high into the air, then descending in a steep dive, followed by a rapid, spiraling ascent.
- Scientists don't know which sex originally selects the nest site, although the male typically arrives back at the nest site first and defends the territory until the female arrives.

- After mating, both birds of a pair build a large stick nest, which they often reuse from year to year. The nest construction is a process that takes 1 to 5 weeks. The nest will be two feet in diameter and lined with bark, lichen, moss and conifer sprigs. The adults will also ask fresh green leaves throughout the nesting season.
- Both parents aggressively defend the nest and incubate the eggs. The female broods the chicks during their nestling stage, while the male brings food to the nest. The female will feed the nestlings.
- The young leave the nest at about 5-7 weeks after hatching, and are fed by their parents for another 8-10 weeks.
- Red-shouldered Hawks prefer to hunt from a perch in the forest understory; they also fly fairly low through the forest so they can pounce on their prey in a stealthy surprise attack.
- Aquatic and semi-aquatic animals, including frogs, small fish, lizards, snakes, and crayfish are the main items in the Red-shouldered Hawk's diet.
- They also occasionally eat birds and sometimes from bird feeders. Some of their recorded prey include sparrows, starlings, and doves.
- By the time they are five days old, nesting Redshouldered Hawks can shoot their feces over the edge of their nest. Seeing bird poop on the ground in an area that they frequent, is a sign of an active nest.
- A group of hawks has many collective nouns, including; a "boil", a "knot", a "spiraling", a "stream", and/or a "tower".
- Red-shouldered Hawk populations increased throughout most of their range between 1966 and 2015, according to the North American Breeding Bird Survey.
- Partners in Flight estimates a global breeding population of 1.1 million with 97% spending some part of the year in the U.S., 17% in Mexico, and 1% breeding in Canada.
- The species rates an 8 out of 20 on the Continental Concern Score. These birds are a U.S.-Canada Stewardship species and were not on the 2016 State of North America's Birds' Watch List. They are a stable species and are not threatened or endangered as of now.


HOA News

This is one of our favorite times of the year in WLP. Aren't you looking forward to fall, pumpkins, scarecrows, and hopefully a breath (or promise) of cooler weather? Remember that everyone benefits from a well-maintained neighborhood. Fall is an excellent time in Florida to plant and renew tired lawns and shrubs. Shrubs and perennials do not really last forever. Take a critical look at your own curb appeal as you plan those holiday decorations or ready your home for visitors. Fall is also a good time to renew your landscape. Remember, right plant, right place. Choose something deer resistant. All properties are required to have landscaping. Bare mulch and weeds are not considered landscaping.

As summer rains diminish, it may be time to pressure wash your driveway and sidewalk. Does your house

need pressure washing? Maybe it's time to paint. Paint protects your concrete and stucco. Submit an ARC application if you are painting, getting a new roof, installing a new fence, considering ground cover instead of grass, and many other such changes. ARC review is done at no charge. This committee meets every other week so that you can get your project going in a reasonable timeframe. Check out the ARC rules, community standards and DCCRs on our Greenacre website.

Holidays, all kinds, are upon us. A reminder that our DCCRs state that decorations can go up 25 days before the holiday and must be taken down no later than 15 days after the holiday. It's easy to go wild with this stuff, but please observe our community standards. And that applies to ALL holidays.

Recipe of the Month

Pumpkin Spice Latte Coffee Cake

Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups white whole wheat flour
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 3/4 cup canola oil
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup pumpkin puree
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/4 cup brewed espresso or strong coffee
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup finely chopped pecans
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

DIRECTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350° F.
- In a stand mixer {use the whisk attachment}, add flour, brown sugar, white sugar, vegetable oil, salt, and pumpkin pie seasoning. Mix together until combined.
- Remove 1½ cup of mixture and add to a small bowl, this is for your topping.
- Next add finely chopped pecans to the topping mixture in the small bowl and then add cinnamon. Stir topping and set aside.
- In the stand mixer, add milk, pumpkin puree, brewed espresso or coffee, egg, baking soda, and baking powder.
- Mix at slow speed until there are no more lumps.
- Grease and flour a 9" springform cake pan (or you could use a 13×9" glass pan) and add cake batter.
- Next, evenly spread pecan topping over batter. Place in oven 55-60 minutes (or until a toothpick come out clean) if using a springform pan or 35-40 if using a 13×9" pan.

Turkey Pumpkin Chili

The Spooky-Season Turkey Chili Recipe You Didn't Know You Needed

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp Vegetable oil
- 1 Large onion
- 1 Green bell pepper, small dice
- 1 Yellow bell pepper, small dice
- 2-3 Cloves garlic, minced
- 2 lbs Ground turkey
- 2 14.5 oz cans fired roasted diced tomatoes
- 4 cups Sugar pie pumpkin, cubed
- 2 1/2 cups Chicken stock
- 2 tbsp Adobo sauce (from a 12 oz can of chipotle peppers in adobo sauce)
- 2 tsp Cumin
- 1 tsp Ground black pepper
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 14.5 oz can black beans, drained and rinsed

Garnish

- 2 cups Mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 1 cup Sour cream
- Cilantro
- Avocado
- Pepitas

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat oil in a large soup pot over medium heat. Sauté the onion and bell peppers until tender, about 5 minutes. Add the garlic and sauté 3 minutes longer.
- 2. Add in the turkey, and cook until evenly brown. Mix in tomatoes, pumpkin, and chicken stock. Season with adobo sauce, cumin, pepper, and salt. Reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer 20 minutes or until pumpkin is tender.
- 3. Add black beans and simmer for 5 minutes longer. Serve topped with cheese, sour cream, cilantro & avocado.

If desired, gently smash pumpkin chunks against the side of the pot before adding the black beans. This gives the chili a creamier texture.

From the CDD Board of Supervisors

These are the highlights of the September 2nd, 2020 CDD meeting. The official meeting minutes will be posted on the District website after they have been voted on and approved by the CDD Board.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 AM. All five Supervisors, District Manager, Lodge Manager, and several audience members were present via Zoom.

After the meeting was called to order, Chairman Estel requested a moment of silence for Lodge maintenance employee, John Del-Gais. John worked at WLP for 2 years and lost his life in a diving accident.

The meeting continued with audience comments. The majority of comments were regarding the Dog Park. Some in favor, while others opposed. Others had no issues to discuss but were attending to keep informed of what is going on in the community.

After audience comments the Board began their discussion of the Dog Park.

Lodge Manager's Report:

Dog Park Pre-application meeting: The Tuesday, August 11th meeting was canceled by Pasco County after researching the current zoning for both parcels. Provided the following information.

- * The Pre-application fee of \$256.06 will be refunded, due to meeting being canceled.
- * Site 1 Parcel #: 36-25-18-0020-00000-0L40 Location: South side of WL Blvd. near Lakewood Retreat. The parcel is designated/zoned as a Green Space Only, which does not permit the lot to be used as a Dog Park. Rezoning would be required for a Dog Park.
- * Site 2 Parcel #: 36-25-18-0020-00000-0L70 Location: North side of WL Blvd. near the roundabout and Egret Glade. The parcel is zoned as a Park, which permits the lot to be used as a Dog Park.

Under the current zoning of a Park or Green Space, parking is not permitted at either site. Rezoning of the lot(s) is required for parking and Pasco County highly discouraged the rezoning of either site.

* Site 3 (Alternate Option - 2 Lodge Lots) - Parcel #: 36-25-18-0010-00000-RC10 & Parcel #: 36-25-18-0020-00000-0L10 - Location: Lodge overflow parking field. Currently under review with Pasco County. This area also includes the entrance into the Maintenance & Conservation Dumpster Storage Yards.

The addition of a Dog Park would be considered a Capital Improvement and is not currently

allotted for within the 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 budgets. After a lengthy discussion with all Supervisors giving their opinions and concerns, it was decided a survey should be sent out to the community to find out how many residents would be in favor of a Dog Park and their willingness to pay for it. Chairman Estel volunteered to work with the Lodge Manager to come up with survey questions for the community.

The Board approved the request, and added that they want the questions to be ready for Supervisor's review at the October meeting.

Pool Repair Update:

The Board ratified Challenger Pools' addendum for additional work on the Lagoon pool. The Lodge Manager stated, pending any weather-related delays, the Lagoon pool should be completed in the next 10 to 14 days. The Board requested the District engineering firm to approve any new change orders that may come in from Challenger Pools.

Front Entrance Paver Project:

The Board approved ACPLM's proposal for the street paver repairs at US Hwy. 41 and Wilderness Lake Blvd., as well as around the Ranger Station.

Wetland T Update:

Supervisor Edwards and the Lodge Manager updated the Board on Wetland T and recommend a cut back of 10' from the bank and going forward to have that area maintained at the 10' mark.

Holiday Lighting:

The holiday lighting was approved and requested to be put up before Thanksgiving.

Oakhurst/Woodsmere Park Enhancement Update:

Enhancement items on order: Garden Swing - 2 grills, 2 round picnic tables, 6 Florida Red Maple trees, and 3-gallon Suspensum Viburnum replacement shrubs.

Business Administration:

The meeting minutes for the August 5th meeting were approved. The Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for July were also approved.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:00 PM.

Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously, they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

**Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.


