

Sandhill cranes are hatching all around the community and it's up to you to help keep them safe in their environment. These cherished members of the Florida ecosystem stand almost 4 feet tall when fully grown, and are present in many urban areas, similar to Wilderness Lake Preserve.

It is important to be vigilant while navigating around these beautiful birds, as many new baby cranes are scurrying all over the community. Did you know that typically only one out of the two babies that hatch survive their first year of life?

People inadvertently put these birds in harm's way when they attract these birds to their yards with feed, while others deliberately feed them. In 2002, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission made it illegal to feed sandhill cranes (Florida Fish and Wildlife Code 68A-4.00(3)). Please remember, Sandhill cranes have an abundance of natural foods throughout the community, and they do not need to rely on food they receive from humans.

Please use caution while navigating the community.

Spring Reminders and Pool Rules

Pool Season News

Pool season is upon us, and the pools are a great place to unwind and enjoy a relaxing BBQ with your family and friends. Upon arriving at the pool, you will notice a pool attendant stationed at the front gate. The pool attendant will ask to see your Lodge Access Card ID; at that point you will sign in yourself, family, and guests. After signing in, the pool attendant will issue you a wristband. The wristband must be worn at all times. This process ensures compliance with the Board mandated Aquatics rules.

(Pool attendant on staff March – September).

Aquatics Safety Reminders

- *Pools & Jacuzzi close at dusk each night.
- *No food or beverages within 10 feet of pools (FL. Statute).
- *Shower before entering the pools or Jacuzzi (FL. Statute).
- *Smoking is prohibited.
- *Glass containers are prohibited.
- *Anyone under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- *No flotation devices allowed in the pools.
- *Residents ages 12 17 are allowed one guest with parental permission.
- *Guests must be at least 12 years of age.
- *Residents ages 12 17 must check in with the Lodge Staff and obtain a wristband upon arrival at the Lodge.
- *Safety equipment is in place to meet FL. Statute and should not be used for recreation purposes.
- *Each WLP family is allowed to bring up to 5 non-resident guests.
- *Swimming from the community owned docks is prohibited.



Swallowtail Butterflies in Florida

Fun Facts

Do you Know that...

Swallowtails are a little different from other butterflies due to the distinctive tail on their hindwings. This extension or "tail" identifies what scientists call the "true swallowtail" and it aids the butterfly during flight. Swallowtails have a particular style of flight. They have large wings and are known to be strong fliers with

the ability to glide long distances between wing flaps. Scientists speculate that the hindwing tail assists with diverting airflow over their wings which enables the swallowtails with to glide at higher angles than other butterflies. Another distinctive feature that helps to identify this butterfly is that they flap their wings continuously when sipping nectar from flowers.

The Swallowtail population has a large worldwide population. Across the world, there are between 460 and 490 species of "true" swallowtail butterflies. However, there are only 28 species in North America. In the East Coast region which extends from Maine to Florida, there are 12 species with 9 of those being year-round residents. Florida has more varieties of the Swallowtail Butterfly than any other state and is home to 10 swallowtail butterfly varieties. In Florida, swallowtails are larger than other Florida Butterflies.

A most unique characteristic of the swallowtail butterfly is their tiny orange/reddish Y-shaped glands or horns. Located on their head, these glands provide a defense against predators. They give off a strong, bad odor to keep birds, wasps, dragonflies, lizards, spiders and other enemies away.

To have a successful Butterfly Garden, Nectar sources must be available for adult butterflies and a food source for developing butterfly larvae is needed. Vegetation must be incorporated into the landscape as it is necessary for sleeping, roosting, and protection from predators.

The Following List of Swallowtail Butterflies Are Found in Florida:

Florida residents are lucky! The sub-tropic climate here in Florida, enables us to grow many plants that attract butterflies. These butterflies add beauty to our surroundings and year-round color to our yards. Most importantly, they help to maintain a healthy local ecosystem!





March 3, 2021 CDD Meeting Highlights

The official minutes will be posted on our website after they have been voted on and approved by the CDD Board.

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District was held on **Wed.**, **March 3**, **2021** at **6:30 P.M.**

Audience Comments:

There were no comments.

Board Supervisors' Requests and Walk-on Items:

Mr. Sailer requested an update of the front entrance monument and back entrance. Ms. Edwards stated that this could be discussed at the Budget Workshop.

A resident on Minnow Brook Way discussed diseased pine tree replacement.

Adding a snack bar at the pool was discussed. Ms. Dobson discussed a plan for food trucks in 2021 and a snack trailer at the pool for 2022.

Landscaping Reports:

Mr. Lucadano updated the Board on the Landscaping throughout the community. A discussion was held regarding the proper way to trim the Palm trees.

Mr. Lucadano verified that RedTree Landscape was E-Verify compliant.

The Board complimented RedTree on the newly installed annuals.

District Counsel's Report:

Mr. Vericker presented the E-Verify Legislative Memo and reviewed it with the Board.

The Board of Supervisors approved the E-Verify Legislative Memo.

GHS Environmental Report:

Mr. Huber presented the GHS report for the Board's review.

District Engineer's Report:

A discussion was held regarding the Tierra Report and the Caliente berm discovery. The Board of Supervisors approved moving ahead after 30 days of monitoring.

Mr. Woodcock presented an update on the Deer Path erosion. Cardno moved away from Advance Hydro, and

they will not be paid the \$2,750.00 for work done, as it is unsatisfactory. Site Masters will be brought in to remediate the pond bank and surrounding area.

The Board of Supervisors approved Site Masters completing the work for the Deer Path erosion (\$4,200.00).

Mr. Woodcock updated the Board on the drainage erosion and control structure at Whispering Wind Drive and Wilderness Lake Blvd. A full report will be submitted for the next meeting.

Mr. Woodcock is working with Ms. Dobson on securing proposals for the Amenity Center Paver Repair Project.

Lodge Manager's Report:

Ms. Dobson presented an update on the Polycom Conferencing System, recent Lodge incidents, and revised roadway asphalting proposals.

On March 11th and 12th, ACPLM will be completing the repairs to the front roadway paver sections.

Ms. Dobson reviewed the County Roadway Management process on resurfacing the roadways throughout The Preserve at Wilderness Lake. Pasco County recommended that the ten sections of roadway pavers, located at the front entrance, be turned over to them for resurfacing and management.

The Board of Supervisors approved having Pasco County asphalt the ten sections of pavers at the front entrance for the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District.

A discussion was held regarding the following items:

- Changing out the sprinklers in the sod at Caliente Blvd. & Night Heron Drive
- Wetland Violations
- Pool Season
- Swing Sets

The Board of Supervisors approved reinstalling all of the swings at each playground.

Stephen Brletic provided a presentation regarding a new asphalt process used by Sterling Hill CDD.

Recipe of the Month

Cheese Manicotti



Ingredients

- 1 carton (15 ounces) reduced-fat ricotta cheese
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese,
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided
- 4 cups marinara sauce
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 package (8 ounces) manicotti shells
- Additional parsley, optional

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a small bowl, mix the first 6 ingredients; stir in 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese and 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese. In another bowl, mix marinara sauce and water; spread 3/4 cup sauce onto bottom of a 13x9-in. baking dish coated with cooking spray. Fill uncooked manicotti shells with ricotta mixture; arrange over sauce. Top with remaining sauce.
- 2. Bake, covered, 50 minutes or until pasta is tender. Sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese and 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese. Bake, uncovered, 10-15 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. If desired, top with additional parsley.

Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously, they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

**Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD

property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.
