

### What To Do If You Find A Fawn

Every year, wildlife biologists receive numerous phone calls from the public concerning abandoned newborn fawns. In almost every instance, the fawns have not been abandoned and are waiting for the doe to return to nurse. People who find newborn fawns should never approach or pick them up—doing so dramatically decreases the probability that fawns will survive. People may encounter a lone fawn exhibiting hiding behavior. Lone fawns are not abandoned and do not need help from humans. On the contrary, the doe is nearby and aware of your presence. If the fawn is still wet,

it means that it is less than a few hours old. In this case, it is likely that the fawn has not yet bonded with the doe. There is greater risk of abandonment if disturbed, so leave the area as quickly and quietly as possible. If the fawn is dry, it has likely bonded with the doe and the probability of abandonment is reduced. In this case, be quiet, keep your distance, enjoy the experience, take a picture, and quickly leave the animal undisturbed.

Shortly after birth, fawns exhibit hiding behavior to avoid detection and maximize survival. Newborn fawns spend more than 95 percent of their time hiding. Fawns are typically alone, or within a few meters of their twin, during most of the day for the first week of life. They only stand a few times each day when the doe comes to nurse them. Once nursed, the mother nudges the fawn back to the ground and leaves the immediate area— usually remaining just a few hundred meters away. During the first three to four days of life, fawns try to avoid being discovered. When approached during the hiding phase, fawns typically lay their head and ears flat on the ground and remain motionless even if touched or accidentally stepped on. Research has shown the average resting heart rate of a newborn

fawn averages 177 beats per minute. When approached by a human, the heart rate immediately drops to 60 beats per minute and breathing is temporarily suspended; the heart rate and breathing patterns of a newborn fawn return to normal shortly after being left alone. When fawns are four to six days old, they typically adopt a hiding/bolting strategy. During this phase, fawns remain hidden and motionless until the potential threat is very close, and then bolt from their hiding place and run to escape. By one week of age, fawns typically spend more time on their feet and attempt

to escape threats when they are at a greater distance. The likelihood of someone having a close encounter with a fawn is typically greatest during the first few days of life when fawns are only hiding.

Most wildlife agencies do not have the resources or facilities to raise newborn fawns, and these animals do not acclimate well after being released back into the wild. Some wildlife agencies also prohibit rehabilitation of deer fawns because of disease concerns. If you encounter a newborn fawn, view it briefly from a distance and never touch it or pick it up.



### Recipes of the Month



One-Pot Cajun Chicken Pasta 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt. Stir until the cream cheese is combined and melted. Don't worry if the sauce looks runny, it will thicken as it sits. Top with sliced scallions.

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 pound boneless, skinless chicken thighs (about 4), cut into 1nch pieces
- 2 1/2 teaspoons Cajun seasoning
- 2 medium green bell peppers, stemmed, seeded and cut into 1/4nch strips
- 1 small yellow onion, thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 12 ounces smooth penne (see Cook's Note)
- 4 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- One 14.5-ounce can diced tomatoes
- 6 ounces cream cheese, cubed, at room temperature
- Kosher salt
- 4 scallions, sliced, for serving

#### **Directions**

Heat the oil in large wide pot over medium-high heat. Add the chicken and Cajun seasoning and cook, stirring occasionally, until the chicken just starts to change color and the spices are toasted, about 2 minutes.

Add the peppers and onions and cook until they just begin to release some of their juices, 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in the garlic and cook until softened, 1 minute.

Add the pasta, chicken broth and tomatoes and bring to a boil over medium-high heat. When it boils, continue to cook, stirring occasionally, until the pasta is al dente and the sauce is thickened and reduced by about half, about 15 minutes.

Remove from the heat and add the cream cheese and 1



Fresh Dill Potato Salad

#### **Ingredients**

- 2½ pounds Red Bliss new potatoes
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon celery seed
- ¼ cup celery, chopped
- 3 hard-boiled eggs, coarsely chopped
- ½ whole green onions, sliced
- 1 tablespoon chives, chopped
- 2 tablespoons fresh dill, chopped
- 1 ¼ cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon prepared mustard
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon seasoned salt

#### **Directions**

Early in the day or the night before: Wash potatoes; do not peel. Cut into bite-size pieces. Place in saucepan; cover with water and add salt and celery seed. Bring to a boil and boil for about 3 minutes. Remove from heat and leave in pan for about 20 minutes. Drain and cool completely. In a large bowl, combine potatoes, celery, eggs, green onions, chives and dill; toss gently. Combine mayonnaise, mustard, garlic powder, seasoned salt and pepper, pour over potato mixture; stir to coat, cover, and chill.

### **HOA News**

Residents are reminded to review neighborhood documents to familiarize themselves with Deed Restrictions and Community Standards. For any change requiring ARC approval, the ARC meets every other week and attempts to give an immediate turnaround whenever possible. Please go through Greenacre for your document needs and communications at https://g360.greenacre.com/Webadmin/Login.aspx/. Please make sure to be specific on your ARC applications, be prepared to provide details of your property request and if you have any questions, please reach out to one of the ARC Members. They will be happy to help you!

With each new summer season, brings people to and from our community. All new homeowners are mailed a welcome package from our management company, Greenacre, but it helps to reinforce that information regarding individual properties should be referred to Greenacre rather than the Lodge. Problems with common and shared areas, amenities, and natural wetlands are under the control of our CDD and the Lodge should be contacted.

So what are the top deed restrictions? In June, the top items were lawn and flowerbed maintenance, driveway maintenance (both cleaning and weeds in seams), and

parking. Now that the afternoon rains are increasing, grass and weeds are growing at a rapid rate. Make sure that your grass mowing and edging schedule are keeping up with the growth. Inspect driveway seams for weed growth and take appropriate action. Trees need to be trimmed above roadways and sidewalks. Parking on the grass or your neighbor's property is not permitted. Keeping sidewalks clear of vehicles is critical for pedestrian safety and essential for those with mobility issues. In addition, it's the law in Pasco County.

Lastly, we would like to say our farewell to Fran Weissing, who served on the Board for over ten years holding multiple positions. We are sad for her to go as she was an amazing addition to the Board. Fran, we thank you so much for your dedication to our community and wish you all the best in the future. 



### Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously; they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact the District Office to discuss any questions you may have, 813-933-5571.

\*\*Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

### The Protected Areas Notification

#### AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property, AND resident property, are part of the

SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.

Cutting trails, clearing of the underbrush, constructing forts, and dumping are just a few examples of violations that have occurred in 2021. These violations are becoming far too common and will ultimately impact the protected areas and community adversely. Be responsible by enjoying the surrounding areas without disturbing them.

# Summer Landscaping Tips

Prepare your lawn and landscaping for the high heat and heavy rains by:

- Checking that your irrigation system is working properly, shutting off zones as necessary, and consider installing a detector to deactivate sprinklers when it rains;
- Planting coleus, ornamental peppers, lilies, gladiolus, and pumpkins in mid-summer;
- Avoiding planting tomatoes or herbs from seeds; they are intolerant of the blazing temperatures.
- Knowing that the summer months are a perfect time to plant palms; this will allow them time to establish themselves before cold snaps.
