

If you plan on using fireworks, please remember that not everyone enjoys them, to include our furry friends. Fireworks can be dangerous, so please take the time to clean up after using them. Use your judgment on how and when to use fireworks and stay safe.

Just a friendly reminder, please pick up after your pet. It doesn't take much to remember that we have pets in our community. In fact, if you don't watch your step, you're liable to step in one such reminder! Besides being unsightly and smelly, animal waste can be hazardous to the health of our children who play in the community and other pets. 



# Highlights of the CDD Meeting

The monthly CDD meeting was conducted on June 1, 2022 and was attended by Board of Supervisors Holly Ruhlig, Beth Edwards, Scott Diver and Heather Evereth. Also in attendance were the Rizzetta Team including Community Manager, Nick Shafferey, District Manager Matthew Huber and Jayna Cooper. District Counsel, the District Engineer and several audience members were also present.

The meeting was called to order promptly at 9:30 AM and opened for audience comments. Residents expressed concerns about various areas needing additional attention including pool cleanliness, residents walking in private yards through buffer areas, and a recommendation for a new tennis pro.

- Pool maintenance: Board voted unanimously to support a motion to open bidding for a new pool maintenance service and to immediately inspect pool chemical levels by a secondary vendor.
- Landscaping
  - Board discussed landscaping concerns with RedTree including cycles for bed maintenance and greenspace mowing frequency.
  - o Landscaping: Board discussed re-mulching project.
  - o Board voted unanimously to support multiple tree removal projects, palm cleaning in pool area and other miscellaneous landscaping improvements.
- District Engineers Report
  - o District Engineer (Greg W) submitted Stormwater Analysis Report
  - o District Engineer (Stephen B) informed board original proposal for Ranger Station withdrawn, actively soliciting bids.
- No report from District Counsel
- GHS Environmental
  - o Provided report
  - o Board requested GHS propose a dedicated wetlands assistant addition to scope of work
- Community Managers Report
  - o Nature Center Update Supervisor Evereth
  - o Playground Safety Reminder Supervisor Edwards
  - o Radar Speed Signs Data Request Supervisor Edwards
  - Nail Salon Agreement Clarification Supervisor Ruhlig

- Age Limit for Amenities Discussion Supervisor Ruhlig
- o TV Broadcast for Events Update Community Manager
- Community Manager Position: Board voted unanimously to confirm Nick Shafferey as Community Manager
- Tennis Court Lighting
  - o Photometrics review, fixture replacement discussion tabled until November 2022
  - o Board voted unanimously to replace 30 minute timer with a better mechanism and to test the use of LED retrofit bulbs on one court.
- Soccer Goals: discussion tabled until July Meeting
- Security Cameras: proposals to be provided in new format for July consideration
- Paver Repairs: Board voted unanimously to approve proposal to repair pavers.
- Board approved termination letter for Cardno Engineering and approved contract with JMT as replacement District Engineer.
- April 27, 2022 and May 4, 2022 meeting minutes unanimously approved.
- Operations & Maintenance expenditures approved unanimously.
- Reserve Study presented by Matthew Huber with no questions.
- Road Resurfacing project update given with no new pertinent details.
- Dog Waste Stations: Supervisor Evereth requested two new waste stations.

In closing, audience comments were reopened. A new audience member commented on excessive speed on Citrus Blossom Drive and requested the board's support in more extensive traffic monitoring and future consideration of speed radar signs in that area.

Meeting was adjourned at 2:06 PM. The next CDD meeting is scheduled for July 6, 2022 at 9:30AM. Official meeting minutes from the June meeting will be approved at this time and will then be posted on the Wilderness Lake CDD website.

one can only wonder, did that dragon also spend her days basking, eating worms and laying eggs? Probably, no. In fact, our Fiona over a period of just three days laid three clutches totaling 27 eggs. And, yes, if you drop by, we are still holding on to them for curious nature lovers. And you may think, 'Wow! That's incredibly strange." But really, it most certainly isn't. In fact, if you've ever sat down to a traditional American breakfast, you have most likely enjoyed some unfertilized eggs from someone our bearded dragon shares a common ancestor with, a chicken. Sure, that was some 250 million years ago according to various sources... but who is counting?

Fiona doesn't just share tendencies with the chicken, we also learned during critter camp that she also shares her eating preferences with a lot of the kids in our community. You'd be surprised to know that this girl is a bit of a picky eater and, likely just like your kiddos uses her hands as "sticks for pushing away salad." # Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

If you modify or use CDD owned property and/or Conservation/Natural Areas without permission, you will be legally required to pay for remediation. Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously; they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

\*\*Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.

# The Protected Areas Notification

#### AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior

to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.

Cutting trails, clearing of the underbrush, constructing forts, and dumping are just a few examples of violations that have occurred in prior years. These violations are becoming far too common and will ultimately impact the protected areas and community adversely. Be responsible by enjoying the surrounding areas without disturbing them.

# "There's Gold in Them Thar Hills!"

Except, we don't have any hills and it's not actual gold. In the month of July, we will be conducting an ongoing activity open to ages 12-17. Here's how it works, the general rules and guidelines and how you can participate.

#### The Basics:

Hidden somewhere on common property (parks, sidewalks, or Lodge area) will be a golden idol. The golden idol holds the power to unlock a safe which holds gift cards galore.

#### How to Play:

In order to play, you can follow our TikTok, Instagram or visit the lodge for clues. Treasure hunt days are marked on the calendar in our newsletter.
