Dear Friends and Families of the WLP,

The HOA and our Committees would like to thank everyone for all that you do to make our community beautiful. If you happen to receive a violation or have a question, please reach out to us by writing an email or attending our meetings, we always welcome your comments and suggestions.

The rainy season is upon us and we would like to remind you to take a look at your trees and your sod. Regarding sod, there are some specific guidelines we all need to follow. Specifically, sod shall be provided to the back of the edge of the pavement and shall be St. Augustine ("Floratam", "Palmetto" or "Bitter Blue"), or Zoysia. The sodded area shall be provided with an automatic underground irrigation system. As per our ARC Criteria, "any tree located on a homeowner's property or on the right-of-way which overhangs the street shall have a minimum clearance of 14-feet, or as directed by Florida Law. Trees overhanging sidewalks shall have a minimum sidewalk clearance of 8 feet." Please let us know if you have any questions and we would be glad to assist you.




# Recipe of the Month

### Blueberry Oatmeal Breakfast Cakes

### **Ingredients**

- 2 1/2 cup of old-fashioned rolled oats
- 1/2 cup of low-fat milk
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1/3 cup pure maple syrup
- 2 T canola oil
- 1 t vanilla extract
- 1 t ground cinnamon
- 1 t baking powder
- ¼ t salt
- ¾ cup blueberries, fresh or frozen



### **Directions**

- Combine oats and milk in a large bowl. Cover and let soak in the refrigerator until much of the liquid is absorbed—At least 8 hours, up to 12 hours.
- Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
- Coat a non-stick muffin tin with cooking spray.
- Stir egg, maple syrup, oil, vanilla, cinnamon, baking powder, and salt into the soaked oats until well combined.
- Divide the mixture among the muffin cups (about ¼ cup each).
- Top each with 1T of blueberries.
- Bake the oatmeal cakes until they spring back when touched, 25 to 30 minutes. Let cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Loosen and remove with a paring knife. Serve warm!





# Highlights of the CDD Meeting Minutes

Good afternoon Supervisors and Staff,

Below is a summary of the last CDD meeting (items listed with bold are the responsible person(s) for follow-up):

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM, with all Board members in attendance. Along with: RJ and John Moylan from RedTree, Matthew Huber, Jayna Cooper, Nick Shaffery, Deneen Kleenke, District Counsel, District Engineer (both via conf. call) as well as several audience members were also present
- 2. Under Audience comments, the Board heard about LED lights at the tennis courts, lack of new or updated events at the Lodge, the road conditions within the community, as well as the pavers at the main entrance
- Under Supervisors Requests and Walk on items: Supervisor Evereth had items pertaining to the health and care of the animals in the Nature Center. A motion was made to authorize the use of funds NTE \$2500.00 to pay for vet care and other essential expenses related to the animals (Heather/Bryan) 5-0 (Nick S.). Supervisor Evereth also mentioned concerns regarding the area near the maintenance shed being used as a "boxing ring" for kids to fight and loiter at. She suggested employing additional security cameras in this area and would discuss this further during the budget portion of the meeting. Supervisor Evereth recommended alerting the off-duty deputies of these issues Supervisor Norrie commented on the poor conditions of the roads. Supervisor Edwards commented on the Ranger Station repairs and asked who is managing this project (District Engineer) in addition she asked for an update on the discussion with Pasco Co. regarding the pavers at the front entrance. Supervisor Edwards commented on the lack of a weekly safety check of the playgrounds and their equipment, the scheduling of the off-duty deputies (Nick S. stated that he was working on this), the new TV's through out the amenities are not synched nor working as they should be (continuous info streaming) and this is due to a lack of connectivity of them all. Supervisor Diver stated he would work with Nick on the TVs (Scott D./Nick S.)
- 4. RJ & John from RedTree present their updates on landscape, the Board asked about: grass seed placed on hold until the rainy seasons, the status of the irrigation in the back of the community it is down and an electrician is needed (Nick S. to contact Himes), several outstanding warranty items are still needed: Firebush at the front of the Lodge needs replacing, Azaleas by the Japanese Blueberries need replacing, pine trees need to come down. Chair Ruhling mention the front entrance sightline areas need to be

constantly maintained. RedTree stated that annual rotation will occur on June 1st

(Supervisor Edwards and Nick S. will tour the community to review these items)

- 5. Mr. Huber directed the Board to the RedTree proposals included in the agenda, the Board reviewed the Natural Buffer proposal for \$1,380.00 and with discussion the Board authorized Supervisor Edwards to work with Nick and RedTree on a revised proposal with a NTE of \$3,000. (Heather/Holly) 5-0 (Nick S./RedTree/Beth E.) The Board reviewed the mulch proposal for \$40,000 and requested that RJ bring back a proposal for \$35,000 (RJ RedTree). The Board reviewed the tree trimming proposal and the Board requested RedTree to revisit and revise this proposal after the test area is cutback by GHS (Nick S. RJ RedTree)
- 6. During the District Engineer's report a discussion ensued regarding the repairs to the Ranger Station, the following was the outcome of this discussion: Greg Woodcock would get the scope of the MOT required by Pasco Co. and give these to Yeti construction to prepare their plan, Yeti would then submit their construction & MOT plans to Pasco Co. for permits with estimate of 30-90 days to get permits from the County. Discussion ensued regarding the pavers and the repaving of Wilderness Blvd. The outcome of this discussion: DM will contact Ainsley at Pasco Co. to continue discussions started by Tish D. as well ask for updated info on the assessment process for the residents and request that Ainsley present at a future Town Hall meeting for the residents (Matt H.)
- 7. District Counsel had no official report and will address the Board on the addendum to the Rizzetta contract later in the agenda
- 8. Mr. Huber presented the GHS report and proposal, the Board tabled the proposal until the test site was completed. Mr. Huber mentioned that Chuck from GHS should meet the new Wetlands maintenance staff member and begin training them. (Nick S. & Chuck B.)
- 9. District Counsel presented the addendum for the Rizzetta contract with Supervisor Diver adding an additional line. Discussion ensued with Mr. Huber informing the Board that that Rizzetta & Co. would prepare two (2) new contracts utilizing the same verbiage from the most recent contact. (Matt H./Beth E./John V.)
- 10. Recess at 8:35 PM and back at 8:43 PM
- 11. Mr. Huber explained to the Board that a request was made to move up the discussion on the Tennis Court lighting to allow residents to give further input. The Board heard from Sam Watson on the negative impact of LED lights on the courts. A Board discussion ensued with Supervisor Evereth

giving an update to the Board on the status of the proposals that had been received. Supervisor Evereth indicate that she needed to meet with Nick S. to go over further details in order to get revisions from the vendors on their proposals. (Heather E./Nick S.)

- 12. Mr. Huber presented the Wildlife Trapper proposal and the Board approved the increase in their fees (Beth E. /Bryan N.) 5-0
- 13. Mr. Huber presented the Proposed Budget for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023, indicating one change for the now approved increase in the Wildlife Trappers fees. The Board approved increasing the line item for the Nature Center/animal care to \$6,000.00. The Board approved resolution 22-04 Approving the Proposed Budget and setting the Final Budget meeting on August 3, 2022 at 6:30 PM. (Scott D./Holly R.) 5-0
- 14. During the discussion of the Lodge Manager position and Management Plan Deneen Klenke informed the Board that Nick S. has been hired as the interim manager until the Board approves per their request. A discussion ensued regarding the timing of Nick's formal approval by the Board, with the decision being made that 30 days or at the next meeting would be sufficient. A lengthy discussion regarding the two forthcoming contracts for District Management Services and Amenity Management Services with all of the past agreed upon language and scope being included (Matt H./Lucianno M. Beth E.) A Board request was made for Nick's contact info be updated on the CDD's website. (Matt H.)
- 15. The Board discussed the request for Tree Beautification and stated that these types of requests should be answered by Staff going forward.
- 16. Mr. Huber presented the meeting minutes from the April 6th regular meeting. The Board approved the minutes as presented (Holly R./Heather E.) 5-0
- 17. Mr. Huber presented the Operation and Maintenance expenditures for March 2022 the Board approved the O&Ms (Beth E./Holly R.) 5-0
- 18. Mr. Huber presented the Financial Statements for March 2022, and the Board had no comments or questions

- 19. Mr. Huber presented the Reserve Study report and the Board no comments or questions
- 20. Under District Manager's report Mr. Huber reminded the Board their next meeting is on June 1, 2022 at 9:30 AM. Mr. Huber announced that there were 1998 Registered Voters within WLP CDD.
- 21. Audience Comments: a comment was made regarding the amount of events held at the amenities
- 22. Supervisor Requests: Chair Ruhling mentioned the Board's dissatisfaction with Cardno as the District Engineer. Board discussion ensued with a motion being made to send Cardno its 30 day termination notice and to have District Counsel work with JMT on the contract for District Engineer services following the expiration of the 30 days. (Beth E. Bryan N.) 5-0. A comment was made regarding future "beautification requests", Supervisor Evereth requested that one year's worth of minutes be kept on the CDD's website going forward, along with a request to keep all items on the CDD website and not to remove any going forward. (Matt H./Campus Suite) Supervisor Evereth had items pertaining to the health and care of the animals in the Nature Center. A motion was made to authorize the use of funds NTE \$2500.00 to pay for vet care and other essential expenses related to the animals and to appoint Supervisor Evereth as the liaison for the board to oversee and direct animal care and make independent decisions related to care. (Heather/Bryan) 5-0
- 23. The Board adjourned the meeting at 10:08 PM (Holly R. Heather E.) 5-0



# Natural Areas and Environmentally Sensitive Areas

If you modify or use CDD owned property and/or Conservation/Natural Areas without permission, you will be legally required to pay for remediation. Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves: the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD with the legal responsibility of protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose, except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy, which is available on the community website, www.wildernesslakecdd.org.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously; they will strictly enforce the Conservation Maintenance Policy to ensure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. If you feel the wooded and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention, please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

\*\*Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.


### The Protected Areas Notification

### AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior to the removal of any plant material. The CDD

wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.

Cutting trails, clearing of the underbrush, constructing forts, and dumping are just a few examples of violations that have occurred in 2021. These violations are becoming far too common and will ultimately impact the protected areas and community adversely. Be responsible by enjoying the surrounding areas without disturbing them.



# Introducing WLP's "Critter Corner" Showcasing: "Bandit" Our Sweet Resident Ferret!

Many of WLP's long-time residents are familiar with Indy the Cockatiel, Pipers the Lovebird, and Tweeters the Parakeet. If you haven't visited the Nature Center over the past year, you might not have met Fiona the Bearded Dragon, Athena the Guinea Pig, or Bandit the Ferret. These adorable critters have been donated to the Lodge. Tish Dobson spear-headed our animal program and was always happy to provide a home for the animals that were brought to her. At WLP, we continue to care for the animals.

Through the years, volunteers have assisted the staff with the cleaning and feeding of the animals. Anyone, who has taken care of a pet, knows that animals require a great deal of care and our WLP resident critters also need plenty of love and attention. While the staff cares for them each day, the birds will begin to sing, Athena will fweep, and Fiona will turn her head to look up when she hears a new voice. Bandit loves to come out of her house and run to the sofa to lay upside down to have her tummy tickled!

Each month over the summer, one of our darling critters will be featured in the WLP newsletter so our community members may learn more about each one of them. My hope is that residents will come up to the nature center and read a book or do a little computer work here to keep our critter family some company. By the way, to let you know, should you come up for a visit, the fish will be watching you!

Our sweet little "Bandit" girl is more than happy to spend her time checking out new visitors. Ferrets are naturally mischievous, playful, and love plenty of attention. The best time to visit her is in the morning and in the evening when ferrets are most active. When awake, they are very active and curious. However, ferrets regularly sleep from eighteen to twenty hours a day. Bandit likes to curl up in her bed but

will use her hammock and her mounds of shredded paper to burrow. Ferrets are intelligent enough to be trained to use a litter box, do simple tricks, and come when called and Bandit loves to follow the staff around during her exercise time. As a natural carnivore, Ferrets require a high protein, low carb diet. They enjoy eating small meals throughout the day which is why, when they awaken, they will first eat before going back to sleep. Bandit needs her nails clipped regularly and her fur coat needs brushing. Her habitat is cleaned twice a day and we are working on keeping her bedding fresh with a weekly laundering.


Sure, Bandit needs care, but Bandit is part of our Lodge family. Please come up and volunteer to help

us care for her-we know that you will love her like we do!

So... let's talk Ferrets! As a schooled veterinary technician/nurse, I would be remiss to not share with you a couple of important facts that I know about ferrets. To keep a ferret healthy, they must be vaccinated against canine distemper virus and rabies. The 2021 Florida Statutes state that ferrets four months of age of older must be vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian with a vaccine that is licensed by the USDA. While Ferrets can be susceptible to gastrointestinal parasitism, it is most common in young or recently purchased pet ferrets and is relatively uncommon in mature ferrets in the United States. Ferrets (like dogs and cats) can become intermediate hosts from other natural hosts: they can get Hookworms, Coccidia, Giardiasis, Cryptosporidiosis, and Dirofilaria Immitis (heartworms). If you have a ferret in a household with other pets, all pets should be checked. Routine fecal flotations, direct fecal smears, and blood sampling are performed for young or recently acquired ferrets. In case you are wondering, Bandit is healthy and safe for us to handle. Yep, no worries about our little Bandit, she has her own personal veterinarian!

Most Importantly.... Aside from their physical health, "Socialization" is a key contributor to the quality of life for our critters. Please consider coming to the Lodge to learn how to care for the animals. Training will be offered and, for students, community volunteer service hours may be earned! Look below at the conversation between Pipers our Lovebird and Indy our Cockatiel for a little "Critter Corner" humor and how to get involved.
