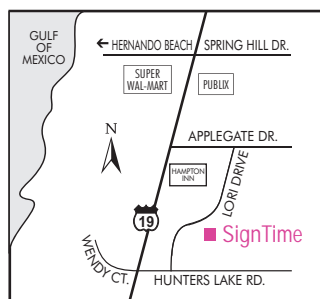

Dear Wilderness Residents:

Everyone plays a role in helping to protect and sustain Florida's wetlands and preserves; the government, developers, environmental groups, scientists, and YOU! Here at Wilderness Lake Preserve, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) vested the The Preserve at Wilderness Lake CDD (CDD) with the legal responsibility for protecting and maintaining all conservation land. This includes both CDD owned land and the numerous conservation buffer areas on residents' property. SWFWMD has mandated that the preserves remain untouched so that they will continue to serve their natural purpose except in special circumstances.

Sometimes there are instances when it makes sense to help the preserve maintain its natural balance. So the CDD, at the request of numerous concerned residents, developed a Conservation Maintenance Policy. To summarize the policy, if you have wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home which you feel would benefit from human attention, PLEASE DO NOT trim or disturb these areas yourself, regardless of whether they are on CDD owned land or YOUR OWN LOT. Instead, notify the Lodge or District Management, who will make an appointment with you. Prior to your meeting, please review our Conservation Maintenance Policy which is available on this website and at the Lodge.

When a District Representative comes to your home they may bring a representative from the contractor that is responsible for maintaining our preserve. Together, you and they will determine if our SWFWMD permit will allow pruning and cleanup in the preserve area around your home. Assuming the work is approved by SWFWMD, you may then either hire our district contractor to complete the work or another approved contractor. If there is only a small amount of work involved, it may be okay for you to do the job yourself. However, you would still need CDD and SWFWMD approval because you are working on designated preserve land. When the job is completed, there must be an inspection to make sure everything is still legal and approved per our SWFWMD permit ... and even more importantly, to make sure we have not damaged the habitat of all our animal friends here at Wilderness Lake.

Because our CDD Board takes our environmental responsibilities very seriously, they will be strictly enforcing the Conservation Maintenance Policy to insure we are in compliance with all SWFWMD regulations and are in no way damaging our environment. So if you feel that the wooded

and wetland areas surrounding your home need attention please first review our community's policy and contact the Lodge to arrange for your inspection.

If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact the District Office to discuss any questions you may have.

## Pool Season News



Pool season is here and the pools are a great place to unwind and enjoy a relaxing BBQ with your family and friends. Upon arriving at the Aquatics, you will notice a Pool Attendant stationed at the front gate. The pool attendant will ask to see your Lodge Access Card ID; you will sign-in yourself, family, and guests. After signing in, the pool attendant will issue you a wrist band. The wrist band **must be worn** at all times while using the Aquatics. This process ensures compliance with the Board mandated Aquatics rules.



**Non-compliance with the rules will result in a suspension from the recreational facilities.**

### Aquatics Rules

- \***Pools & Jacuzzi close at dusk each night.** The closure time will be posted for your convenience.
- \***No food or beverages within 10 feet of pools (FL. Statute).**
- \***Shower before entering the Pools and/or Jacuzzi (FL. Statute).**
- \*Smoking is prohibited.
- \*Glass containers are prohibited.
- \*Anyone under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- \*Flotation devices are not permitted.
- \*Residents ages 12 - 17 are allowed one guest with parental permission. (Guests must be at least 12 years of age.)
- \*Residents ages 12 - 17 must check in with the Lodge Staff and obtain a wristband upon arrival at the Lodge.
- \*Safety equipment is in place to meet **FL. Code** and should not be used for recreational purposes.
- \*Each WLP family is allowed to bring up to 5 non-resident guests.
- \*Swimming from the community owned docks is prohibited.



# Ancient Babies



Ancient babies... sounds counter-intuitive, right? After all, how can a baby be ancient? Well, the folks who drive in and out of WLP often see baby sandhill cranes whose origin can be traced to prehistoric times! According to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, the earliest Sandhill Crane fossil, estimated to be 2.5 million years old, was unearthed in the Macasphalt Shell Pit in Florida. So, the next time you pass those darling, spindly, feathery baby sandhill cranes walking with their parents across the road, please slow down and let them cross safely. Don't forget to chuckle at their long lanky strides as you recall that our Florida sandhill cranes have been on this Earth for a long time. With tongue in cheek, we must show respect to our elder cohabitant species – even when they are newly born babies!

Those newly hatched sandhill cranes are called Colts. They are not so-named because they are particularly fast runners, but rather due to their love of running and their long, strong legs. While it may seem like they run out in front of cars just to aggravate us, they are not crossing the road just to get to the other side. They are scurrying to search for earthworms, mole crickets, acorns, turf grubs, seeds, berries, mice, snakes, frogs, and crayfish. In addition, baby cranes (colts) need to walk about two miles worth of steps each day as their rapid growth demands the exercise to keep their muscles well-toned. So, with mama and papa in tow,

the precious baby cranes venture out to learn how to navigate their environment to survive.

These beautiful birds are a species of special concern. Habitat loss and degradation, along with pollution, threaten their existence. Protected under the U.S. Bird Migratory Treaty Act, it is illegal to feed, touch, or disturb these animals. With less than 5000 non-migratory breeding sandhill cranes in the state, they need our help to continue to flourish. Let's work together to keep them safe and healthy in WLP. Our sandhill cranes, and their beautiful ancient babies, provide us with the wonderful opportunity to live closely with them and enjoy the splendid Florida wildlife.

# April 6, 2022 CDD Meeting Highlights



The official minutes will be posted on our website after they have been voted on and approved by the CDD Board.

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Preserve at Wilderness Lake Community Development District was held at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, April 6, 2022.

## **Audience Comments:**

James McClean asked the Board to consider adding a fence between the existing hedge and pond at Stoneleigh Park. Discussion ensued. RedTree will submit proposal to install a 2nd natural barrier between the playground and pond. As a 2nd option, Ms. Dobson will submit a proposal to install a section of fence line.

## **Supervisor Requests and Walk-on Items:**

Mr. Norrie asked if the Board would consider moving the Budget Workshop to a later date in April. A discussion ensued. The Board of Supervisors approved moving the Budget Workshop from April 12th to Wednesday, April 27th at 9:30 a.m. in the Activities Center.

Mr. Norrie asked the Board to consider adding lighting to the pool deck for extended hours of operation. A discussion ensued. Mr. Dobson will draft expenditures to include:

- Cost of lighting
- Staffing associated with monitoring the extended hours
- County requirements for lighting the pool deck to allow swimming after sunset
- Ms. Dobson will research previous lighting plans for the pool deck.

## **Landscape Report:**

Ms. Dobson presented the PSA Field Service Report. A discussion ensued regarding the woodline trimming test site.

Ms. Dobson presented the proposal for mulch in the amount of \$40,000.00.

Ms. Dobson and RedTree to drive the community, assess the landscape beds, and create a mulch map with a revised proposal.

Ms. Dobson to work with RedTree on the desired woodline trimming throughout the community. The trimming of the first was to aggressive.

John Moylan informed the Board that the new pump and well should be completed by May 1st. RedTree will assess the rain sensors as the irrigation was running during the recent storms. They will also check the irrigation schedule.

## **District Engineer's Report:**

Mr. Woodcock presented his report and

updates.

Mr. Woodcock presented and reviewed the proposal for the Ranger Station structural repairs from Yeti Construction at a cost of \$18,500.00. A discussion ensued. The Board of Supervisors approved Yeti Construction's proposal for the Ranger Station Structural Repairs at a not to exceed cost of \$20,000 with details on M.O.T., safety, traffic plan, and staging area.

The pool drainage project was completed. Drains were located during deconstruction. Additional spillways were created to direct the runoff into the drains. Screening may be necessary to prevent storm debris from pooling on the surface of the drain gate.

## **District Counsel's Report:**

Mr. Vericker was not present and did not have a report.

## **GHS Environmental Report:**

Ms. Dobson presented the GHS report for the Board's review. A discussion ensued regarding the assessment of the woodline trimming test site completed by RedTree. The Board requested that GHS Environmental trim a test site to be used as an example for future trimmings.

## **Lodge Manager's Report:**

Ms. Dobson presented the Lodge Manager's Report. She stated that a resident has requested the addition of soccer goals at Stoneleigh Park. Ms. Dobson to present proposals for this work.

A discussion ensued on the pool hours and what is in compliance with the pool signage. Ms. Dobson stated that Romaner Graphics is creating a waterproof sign and clock for the pool attendants' table.

## **Reserve 101 Presentation by Florida Reserve Study and Appraisal, Inc.:**

Ms. Dobson presented the revised Reserve Study to the Board. The District is funded at 70%.

## **Consideration of Addendum to Rizzetta & Company's Contract for Staff Reviews:**

Ms. Dobson presented and reviewed Rizzetta & Company's timeline for staff reviews. A formal addendum is to be drafted with a mechanism for the Board to participate in the reviews and performance pay.

## **Consideration of Audit Engagement Letter:**

Ms. Dobson presented The Audit Engagement Letter from Berger, Toombs, Elam, Gaines & Frank for the years 2022-2026. The Board of Supervisors approved Berger, Toombs, Elam, Gaines & Frank's Audit Engagement Letter for Years 2022-2026.

**\*\*Please do not dump yard clippings or trimmings in the wooded and/or wetland areas adjacent to your home.**

## The Protected Areas Notification

### AS A REMINDER...

The wetlands and wetland setback areas, on both CDD property AND resident property, are part of the SWFWMD CDD wetlands permit. This means that residents may only remove invasive species AND must have CDD permission / supervision to do so. Residents must contact the Lodge prior

to the removal of any plant material. The CDD wetlands vendor will review the area and provide guidance as to what may and may not be removed or cut back. Residents must receive written permission from the CDD prior to removal / cutback of any plant material on CDD property. The Lodge Manager will provide residents with the proper forms that must be completed prior to any work being done. **Any non-authorized removal of plant material in areas falling under the SWFWMD CDD permit will be replanted at the offending resident's expense. All legal costs associated with the violation will also be charged to the offending resident.**

**Cutting trails, clearing of the underbrush, constructing forts, and dumping are just a few examples of violations that have occurred in 2021. These violations are becoming far too common and will ultimately impact the protected areas and community adversely. Be responsible by enjoying the surrounding areas without disturbing them.**

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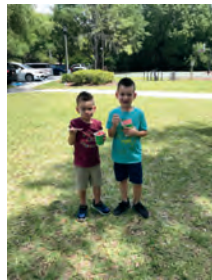
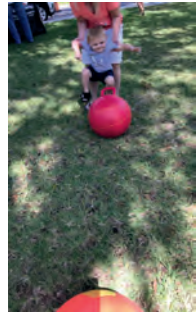


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
