

Dear Friends and Families of Wilderness Lake Preserve,

We hope that like us, you are all enjoying the warm summer weather, relaxing with family and friends, and taking advantage of all the natural beauty that surrounds us. We thought it would be helpful to share again the various entities of the HOA, how to work with them and why they exist. Remember, next year we will have seats available on our board so if you have an interest in serving your community, this is a great way to do it.

### **HOA Board of Directors**

The main HOA Board is comprised of residents who work to ensure that the HOA budget is used appropriately. The HOA Board of Directors hires and manages interactions with Greenacre, approves or dismisses fines requested by the fining committee and makes decisions regarding their interpretation of existing deed restrictions (DCCRs).

Limits of HOA Board of Directors power: The HOA Board of Directors can recommend and bring to a community vote changes to restrictions, only as part of a quorum (a majority of homes represented) and cannot modify the DCCRs without strong homeowner desire and subsequent participation.

Members of the HOA work to ensure the fair treatment of homeowners, while preserving property values and enjoyment of our community through strategic enforcement of policies in the DCCRs.

### **HOA Architectural Review Committee**

The HOA Board of Directors committed the Architectural Review Committee as an arm of the board. This committee receives requests to modify the exterior of properties, reads and interprets the DCCRs and approves, or recommends changes to these modifications to ensure the continued quality and appearance of the community. All modifications to the exterior of your home including paint, driveway paving projects, landscaping changes or any other change visible from the outside are required to be submitted for approval to this committee, as determined by the DCCRs.

### **HOA Fining Committee**

Well doesn't this sound like a popular and fun job? Contrary to how it sounds, the job of the fining committee is not to go around levying fines on everyone for having a trash can by the road. The job of the fining committee is to review repeated violations submitted from our third party HOA management company (Greenacre), visit the site and determine whether a fine should be levied. Because the goal of the HOA is compliance with DCCRs and not fining,

this is a last resort, and is performed by neighbors who hope to see that the issue is resolved to prevent fining from taking place.

### Greenacre

Greenacre is hired by the HOA Board of Directors to enforce the DCCRs. This company performs the neighborhood "patrols," sends the violations, and tracks the violation responses for compliance.

### Is a Violation like a "Ticket"?

It's important that you look at a violation less like a citation or a traffic "ticket" and more like the beginning of a process to resolve the matter. Once you receive a notice of violation, simply respond to the notice, or communicate with your HOA board with questions. This will avoid fines and is as simple as responding and saying, "trash can brought inside", "garage door closed", "weeds removed", "hedges trimmed" etc. As small as these things may seem, it is the simple things that keep our community looking great and our property values high.

As a friendly reminder, for the safety of our vendors please never approach individuals who conduct these inspections and simply contact our management company in writing at melindas@greenacre.com if you have any questions or concerns about the process. Greenacre is prohibited by law from discussing violations which can only be addressed in writing.

We welcome homeowner participation and look forward to continuing to serve our great community. Please remember all of these positions are volunteer driven and open to participation. If you want to impact changes in any of these areas the best way to do this is to become involved, attend meetings and join a committee or board.







# Highlights of the CDD Meeting

plan to Pasco County if not provided by sele

The monthly CDD meeting was conducted on July 6, 2022 and was attended by Board of Supervisors Brian Norrie, Beth Edwards, Scott Diver and Heather Evereth. Also in attendance were the Rizzetta Team including Community Manager, Nick Shaffery, District Manager Matthew Huber and Jayna Cooper. District Counsel, the District Engineer, RedTree Landscaping and several audience members were also present. Supervisor Holly Ruhlig joined the meeting while in progress.

The meeting was called to order promptly at 9:30am and opened for audience comments.

During Supervisor requests and walk-on items, Supervisor Edwards requested minor changes to the agenda order. Supervisor Diver requested board visibility and notification of new hires and inquired about grill use. Food preparation as a service for residents is paused, pending new facility licensing and certification of staff.

- Landscaping
  - o Board discussed at length pruning schedule, hedge health
  - o Supervisor Edwards suggested the revision of language within the contract to read as "discretionary" for some services and well as to clarify the 5 maintenance zones and frequency of pruning.
  - o Caliente Blvd. irrigation project is completed.
  - o Mulching and tree removal projects are in progress.
  - o Lightning Damage report for irrigation system and zones impacted by lodge strike.
  - o Storm damage downed tree reported
  - o Revised proposal received and considered from RedTree regarding selective large tree removal as part of the woodline maintenance project.
- District Engineers Report
  - o District Engineer (Stephen B) splash pad update
  - o Met with Pool Works and Florida Play Structures
  - o Recommended Surfaces are Sundeck (hard) and Raindeck (soft) both vendors to provide proposals.

  - o Ranger Station update. Pending 7 proposals from contractors. JMT to provide management of traffic

# WLP's Critter Corner Living with Alligators

It was during the July "Critter Camp" that our team, and 30 or so of our resident friends who attended the camp walked out on the dock to entertain ourselves that sunny afternoon by feeding the fish who reside in our neighborhood lake. If you didn't already know, you can pick up a bag of fish food any time by helping yourself to the basket of rolled up and taped closed paper lunch sacks located behind the reception desk. These bags are prepared by our staff, and intended for children (and children at heart) who visit the lodge to use for this very purpose.

Since it was the heat of the day, some of the bigger fish were likely taking refuge under lily pads, and under the dock away from the 60 pitter pattering children's feet who were bursting with excitement to see fish, turtles and just maybe one of the many alligators who also enjoy calling Wilderness Lake home. Normally, our fish friends enjoy eating from a very specific spot just inside the right side of the "t" that divides the dock and heads off toward the boats which, for the sake of conversation and information you may not be aware are available for resident use if you bring your own life vest. As we tried to stir up our finned-friends in this area, we realized only the smaller fish seemed interested.

Slowly, the group began spreading out trying other areas of the dock and before long, discovered that near the lily pads, larger fish were emerging to take part in the buffet of compressed fish food nuggets being tossed into the lake by excited, and sticky little hands. Just then, who also emerged hoping for a tasty morsel? An alligator. Slowly skimming across the water checking out the scenery, the alligator made his presence known, and the children (and not to worry, the adult hands they were all holding) enjoyed this glimpse of the nature that surrounds us daily.

For many of us (including the writer of this story, who grew up in Florida) the sight of an alligator seems menacing and dangerous, but when we care for the nature around us, it is possible to live harmoniously. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission has a few recommendations that we can all follow to avoid an unwanted negative encounter.

- Never feed an alligator or fish with meats like chicken, hot dogs and other strong-smelling bait that attracts alligators. Feeding alligators is illegal in Florida. When fed, alligators overcome their natural fear of humans and when this happens an alligator trapper removes and kills the animal.
- Remember that alligators are a natural part of Florida's ecosystem.
- Dispose of fish scraps and never throw dead fish or fish pieces back into the water, inadvertently feeding alligators.
- Leave alligators alone. State law prohibits harassing, feeding or touching even baby alligators.

- Keep pets 10 feet away from water's edge.
- Lakes and ponds in Florida (and of course, Wilderness Lake Preserve) can be inhabited by very large and potentially dangerous alligators.
- Never swim in undesignated areas including neighborhood docks where alligators shelter during the day.
- Never swim in any freshwater between dusk and dawn, when alligators are most active.
- If you see an alligator, keep your distance.
- If you suspect a nuisance or injured alligator, contact the lodge or call 866-FWC-GATOR

- Landowner letter discussed, revised and approved by board for mailing.


In closing, audience comments were reopened. There were no additional requests from audience or the Board of Supervisors.

# Ka-Boom! Lightning Strikes Twice

The old adage "lightning never strikes twice" is often used, in many contexts to describe the perceived rarity any event, based upon the unlikeliness of a lightning hit in the same place twice. Unfortunately for our Lodge, not only is this a false tale, lightning can and often does strike the same place twice. In fact, lightning strikes happen so frequently in the Tampa Bay area



A few days later, as Assistant Manager Terri was finishing up her day, and her daughter waited outside to drive her home she (her daughter) became witness to a thunderous boom that lit up the metal gutters around the lodge which continued to glow for a few moments that felt like an eternity. It was in that exact moment that 300 million volts (not quite 1.21 gigawatts for those of you who are Back to the Future fans) of electricity attached themselves to everything metal on the lodge buildings, pool area and nearby landscaping low-voltage lines and wreaked havoc.

It wasn't the first time and lightning did in fact, strike twice. Several years ago, this same scenario occurred right here in Wilderness Lake Preserve. Since then, multiple high-end lightning awareness procedures (including those that emptied the pool area that day) and technology-protecting hardware were swiftly put into place. Unfortunately, even the high-end commercial lightning protection our facilities use are not enough for a direct hit, which our tall lodge building seems to attract. Over the coming days, lodge staff worked tirelessly to repair and assess damages and at the time of this article, there are still a few things being worked out (like our Theater projector, for example.. sorry kids movies are now in the Activity Center.) In



addition, lodge staff has started research into alternative methods of strike damage prevention.

The University of Florida IFAS has the following recommendations to protect human life. Florida is our nation's lightning capital, and the I4 corridor is currently the center of that concentration of electrical activity.

### **HOW TO STAY SAFE**

# Avoid being struck by lightning:

- Watch for developing thunderstorms which can appear as tall, tower-like white fluffy clouds from a distance.
- If you can hear thunder, you are within 10 miles of a storm, and can be struck even if the sky is blue.
- Seek shelter in a building with walls or a fully enclosed vehicles, not under pavilions, in open carports, garages, golf carts or building overhangs where you are still vulnerable.
- When inside, unplug electronics and do not handle devices that are plugged in including corded telephones or computers and charging cell phones or laptops.
- Avoid doing laundry (no problem for this lady!), showering or washing dishes until the storm has passed.

### If you are stuck outside and cannot take shelter

- Squat low to the ground by kneeling our crouching. Never lie on the ground during an electrical storm.
- Avoid very tall structures like towers, fences, poles or open areas (where you are the tallest thing)
- Get away from water, including pools, rivers, lakes and beaches if possible.
- If you are on the water, come ashore. If on a boat in open water, enter the boats cabin. If no cabin exists, drop anchor, avoid electronics and get as low as possible.
- Move into low-lying areas.
- Find a clump of multiple threes rather than one isolated tall tree if you are in the woods.
- If you feel your hair stand on end, drop to your knees bend forward and place hands on knees.
