Never Feed Alligators

Feeding alligators, whether intentionally or unintentionally is not only <u>illegal and potentially a felony</u>, it's dangerous to the animal itself. Most alligators that are under 4' in length pose no risk to humans or pets, unless handled. When fed, alligators can overcome their natural wariness and learn to associate people with food. When this happens, some of these alligators have to be removed and killed. Dispose of fish bait in garbage cans at the dock or inside your home. Do not ever throw them, or any meat into the water. Although you are not intentionally feeding alligators when you do this, the result can be the same.

Never Feed Sandhill Cranes

People may inadvertently put sandhill cranes at risk when they attract them with feed. This includes "accidental feeding," such as when bird seed is spilled from bird feeders onto the ground below. In 2002, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission made it illegal to intentionally feed sandhill cranes. When cranes are fed and learn to associate people with food, they can lose their fear of humans. These "habituated" cranes may approach people closely and even grab food out of a person's hand. In rare instances, cranes have been reported pecking people.

In Florida, any feeding, intentional or otherwise, of bears, coyotes, foxes, raccoons, pelicans, **alligators**, crocodiles, **sandhill cranes**, and wild monkeys is illegal and subject to civil penalties.

Gingerbread Pancakes



- * 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- * 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon baking soda
- * 1/4 teaspoon salt
- * ½ teaspoon ground dried ginger
- * 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ♠ 1 egg
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- [★] ¼ cup molasses
- 拳 1½ cups water

Method:

- 1 Whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, ginger, and cinnamon in a bowl. Beat the egg in a separate mixing bowl with the vanilla and molasses until smooth. Whisk in the water until completely incorporated. Stir the flour mixture into the molasses mixture until just combined a few lumps are okay.
- 2 Heat a lightly oiled griddle over medium-high heat. Drop batter by large spoonfuls onto the griddle, and cook until bubbles form and the edges are dry. Flip, and cook until browned on the other side. Repeat with remaining batter.


