HISTORY OF PIRATES IN TAMPA

Close Encounters

You're shuffling out your cans on the eve before garbage day, and see a cat-sized, rat-like creature shuffle across your driveway. You're either struck with complete disgust, fear or overwhelmed with desires to grab and pet it. In any of those groups, I assure you, you are not alone. The feelings and opinions about opossums vary wildly.

Playing Possum

When confronted with a predator, many have heard the term "playing possum" to refer to the act of playing dead, or trying to fool an opponent. What you may not know is that this is an involuntary reaction and that the possum is indeed unconscious and defenseless during this time. It also is interesting to know that they emit a foul smell that mimics that of a dead animal.

Walking Embros

Possoms give "birth" to their young and they are just about the size of a bumblebee. They then use their strong legs to climb into the mothers pouch which looks more like a belly button than a kangaroo's pouch you may be picturing. Inside the pouch, there are 13 nipples to attach to. A possum gives birth to as many as 25 baby opossums. In order to survive, they must be among the fastest and most efficient. The lucky survivors will stay attached for 50-70 days. After this, they continue to live at home with mom until they are 120 days old. At which time, they leave and seek out a new life as a solitary opossum. Only 60% survive this stage and go on to reproduce.



One-Pot Garlicky Shrimp & Broccoli

Ingredients:

3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, divided

6 medium cloves garlic, sliced, divided

4 cups small broccoli florets

½ cup diced red bell pepper

½ teaspoon salt, divided

½ teaspoon ground pepper, divided

1 pound peeled and deveined raw shrimp (21-30 count)

2 teaspoons lemon juice, plus more to taste



Directions:

- 1. Heat 2 tablespoons oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add half the garlic and cook until beginning to brown, about 1 minute. Add broccoli, bell pepper and 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper. Cover and cook, stirring once or twice and adding 1 tablespoon water if the pot is too dry, until the vegetables are tender, 3 to 5 minutes. Transfer to a bowl and keep warm.
- 2. Increase heat to medium-high and add the remaining 1 tablespoon oil to the pot. Add the remaining garlic and cook until beginning to brown, about 1 minute. Add shrimp and the remaining 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper; cook, stirring, until the shrimp are just cooked through, 3 to 5 minutes. Return the broccoli mixture to the pot along with lemon juice and stir to combine.




