Summary & Amenity Center

General Updates, Recent & Upcoming Maintenance Events

- ☐ Mowing every week services until October.
- ☐ Several dead palms need to be addressed. Count is now 11. Why are these failing
- ☐ New areas are now being inspected.

The following are action items for BrightView to complete. Please refer to the item # in your response listing action already taken or anticipated time of completion. Red text indicates deficient from previous report. Bold Red text indicates deficient for more than a month. Green text indicates a proposal has been requested. Blue indicates irrigation, Orange indicates FH Staff. Bold underlined is information or questions for the BOS.

- 1. Remove palm overgrowth on the trail behind the pool area.
- 2. Turf is thinning by the bike rack at the amenity center. Probable compaction from school but still Diagnose and treat. (Pic. 2)



- 3. Treat weeds in the shrubs that are growing up through in the parking lot of the amenity center.
- 4. Remove dead material in front of Silver Buttonwood that lines the fence of the splash pad area. No replacement needed.
- Diagnose and treat the Ornamental Grasses in front of the lift station for possible spider mites.

- 6. There are four dead Sables that need to be replaced at the playground area. Refer to the proposal page.
- 7. Treat the weeds in the playground area by the splashpad. Also, along the sidewalk.
- 8. Investigate the area between the splash pad and the playground. It seems very wet, even with the rains. What can be done here?
- 9. The turf is still less than desirable on the Westside of entrance into amenity center parking lot at the Daybreak intersection.

 This area has been unsightly for some time and needs to be corrected. It now appears it may have chinch bugs. (Pic. 9)





Amenity Center, Daybreak Glen

- 10. Pull off the Spanish Moss on the fence line for the dog parks.
- 11. Diagnose and treat the Awabuki at the pool equipment area East of the pool entrance.
- 12. Diagnose and treat the Crinum Lilies at the median on the Eastside of the gated section.
- 13. Need mulch on the middle island on Daybreak Glen on both sides of the guarded gate entrance to also include the newly installed Petit Ixora.
- 14. Remove dead Ornamental Grasses behind the mailbox kiosk on Daybreak Glen closest to the amenity center.

15. There is an area that seems to have had work recently on Firefly cul de sac that needs to have the turf repaired. Please refer to the proposal page. (Pic. 15)



- 16. Just noting construction is still being performed on Moccasin Wallow by the end roundabout on Daybreak Glen.
- 17. Remove fronds that line the front of the conservation area on Daybreak Glen by Starlight Loop. Only remove up to the conservation sign.
- 18. Treat broadleaf turf weeds at the mailbox kiosk behind the gated portion of Daybreak.

19. There is a dead Sable palm that needs to be replaced right before you enter the gated section of Daybreak Glen. This is on the South ROW. (Pic. 19)



- 20. There is a dead Sable Palm that needs to be remove on the Northside of Daybreak Glen right as you are exiting the gated section.
- 21. Prune back overhanging palm fronds on the sidewalk on Starlight Loop on the East end at the Daybreak Glen intersection.
- 22. Treat the broadleaf turf weeds at the end of Daybreak Glen cul de sac.
- 23. There is a dead Sable Palm that needs to be replaced on the median on Summerwoods Dr. just South of High Noon Trail. Was a proposal sent?
- 24. There is a dead Sable Palm on the East and West ROWs on Summerwoods Dr. I recommend they be flush cut and do not need a replacement. Was a proposal sent?
- 25. Treat the weeds in the medians on Summerwoods Dr.
- 26. Thinning turf on North and South ROW on Daybreak Glen between Rain Lily Crossing and Sunshower Dr. Diagnose and treat accordingly.



Western Wood Ave., Moccasin Wallow

- 27. Treat the broadleaf turf weeds on the North ROW of High Noon Trail between Rain Lily Crossing and Corkscrew Crossing. This area continues to not thrive. What can be done to improve the turf in this area?
- 28. Diagnose and treat the turf on High Noon Trail between the sidewalk and the road on the South ROW just West of Summerwoods Dr. It appears to have chinch bugs.
- 29. Construction is still ongoing on Moccasin Wallow on the East side of Summerwoods Dr. Once completed there is a dead Palm and Oak in need of replacement.
- 30. Raise the Oak Canopy just West of the Summerwoods Dr. entrance.
- 31. Prune up the dead in the Palms on Moccasin Wallow just West of the Summerwoods Dr. entrance. (Pic. 31)



- 32. Dead palm fronds need to be removed on Western Woods Ave. in the median and East and West ROWs.
- 33. Remove hanging frond on Western Woods Ave. in the palm right behind the monument at the gate. (Pic. 33>)
- 34. It appears the hardscape edging along the sidewalk on Snap Pop Ln. has been missed. Please ensure it is completed each mowing.





Proposals

1. Brightview to provide a proposal to remove and replace Sable Palms that have died or did not establish at the playground area.



2. Brightview to provide a proposal to replace sod between the sidewalk and the road at the end of Firefly where it appears there was work completed here recently. (Pic.. 2)



- Brightview to provide a proposal to replace a dead Sable Palm that did not establish on the median of Summerwoods Dr. just South of High Noon Trail.
- 4. Brightview to provide a proposal to remove 3 Sable palms on Summerwoods Dr. and I do not recommend replacement. One on the East ROW, one on the West ROW, and one just as you exit onto Moccasin Wallow on the East side of the intersection.

5. Brightview to provide a proposal to remove two dead Sable Palms, one on the North and one on the South ROW, of Daybreak Glen at the gated section of the community. Provide a replacement option for the one on the Southside.

RESOLUTION 2023-08

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE SUMMER WOODS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET(S) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2023, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2024; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has, prior to the fifteenth (15th) day in June, 2023, submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Summer Woods Community Development District ("District") proposed budget(s) ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024 ("Fiscal Year 2023/2024") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local governing authorities having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing thereon and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website at least two days before the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager has prepared a Proposed Budget, whereby the budget shall project the cash receipts and disbursements anticipated during a given time period, including reserves for contingencies for emergency or other unanticipated expenditures during the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SUMMER WOODS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

- a. The Board has reviewed the Proposed Budget, a copy of which is on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.
- b. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit "A,"** as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* (**"Adopted Budget"**), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.

- c. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Summer Woods Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2024."
- d. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website within thirty (30) days after adoption, and shall remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for Fiscal Year 2023/2024, the sums set forth in **Exhibit A** to be raised by the levy of assessments, a funding agreement and/or otherwise. Such sums are deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, and are to be divided and appropriated in the amounts set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within Fiscal Year 2023/2024 or within 60 days following the end of the Fiscal Year 2023/2024 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law.

The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under paragraph c. above are posted on the District's website within 5 days after adoption and remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

GENERAL FUND BUDGET ACCOUNT CATEGORY DESCRIPTION

The General Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are subject to change at any time depending on its application to the District. Please note, not all General Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are applicable to the District indicated above. Uses of the descriptions contained herein are intended for general reference.

REVENUES:

Interest Earnings: The District may earn interest on its monies in the various operating accounts.

Tax Roll: The District levies Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessments on all of the assessable property within the District to pay for operating expenditures incurred during the Fiscal Year. The assessments may be collected in two ways. The first is by placing them on the County's Tax Roll, to be collected with the County's Annual Property Tax Billing. This method is only available to land properly platted within the time limits prescribed by the County. The second way is by Off Roll collection.

Off Roll: For lands not on the tax roll and that is by way of a direct bill from the District to the appropriate property owner.

Developer Contributions: The District may enter into a funding agreement and receive certain prescribed dollars from the Developer to off-set expenditures of the District.

Event Rental: The District may receive monies for event rentals for such things as weddings, birthday parties, etc.

Miscellaneous Revenues: The District may receive monies for the sale or provision of electronic access cards, entry decals etc.

Facilities Rentals: The District may receive monies for the rental of certain facilities by outside sources, for such items as office space, snack bar/restaurants etc.

EXPENDITURES – ADMINISTRATIVE:

Supervisor Fees: The District may compensate its supervisors within the appropriate statutory limits of \$200.00 maximum per meeting within an annual cap of \$4,800.00 per supervisor.

Administrative Services: The District will incur expenditures for the day to today operation of District matters. These services include support for the District Management function, recording and preparation of meeting minutes, records retention and maintenance in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and the District's adopted Rules of Procedure, preparation and delivery of agenda, overnight deliveries, facsimiles and phone calls.

District Management: The District as required by statute, will contract with a firm to provide for management and administration of the District's day to day needs. These services include the conducting of board meetings, workshops, overall administration of District functions, all required state and local filings, preparation of annual budget, purchasing, risk management, preparing various resolutions and all other secretarial duties requested by the District throughout the year is also reflected in this amount.

District Engineer: The District's engineer provides general engineering services to the District. Among these services are attendance at and preparation for monthly board meetings, review of construction invoices and all other engineering services requested by the district throughout the year.

Disclosure Report: The District is required to file quarterly and annual disclosure reports, as required in the District's Master Trust Indenture, with the specified repositories. This is contracted out to a third party in compliance with the Trust Indenture.

Trustee's Fees: The District will incur annual trustee's fees upon the issuance of bonds for the oversight of the various accounts relating to the bond issues.

Assessment Roll: The District will contract with a firm to maintain the assessment roll and annually levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment for operating and debt service expenses.

Financial & Revenue Collections: Services include all functions necessary for the timely billing and collection and reporting of District assessments in order to ensure adequate funds to meet the District's debt service and operations and maintenance obligations. These services include, but are not limited to, assessment roll preparation and certification, direct billings and funding request processing as well as responding to property owner questions regarding District assessments. This line item also includes the fees incurred for a Collection Agent to collect the funds for the principal and interest payment for its short-term bond issues and any other bond related collection needs. These funds are collected as prescribed in the Trust Indenture. The Collection Agent also provides for the release of liens on property after the full collection of bond debt levied on particular properties.

Accounting Services: Services include the preparation and delivery of the District's financial statements in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards, accounts payable and accounts receivable functions, asset tracking, investment tracking, capital program administration and requisition processing, filing of annual reports required by the State of Florida and monitoring of trust account activity.

Auditing Services: The District is required annually to conduct an audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting firm, once it reaches certain revenue and expenditure levels, or has issued bonds and incurred debt.

Arbitrage Rebate Calculation: The District is required to calculate the interest earned from bond proceeds each year pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The Rebate Analyst is required to verify that the District has not received earnings higher than the yield of the bonds.

Travel: Each Board Supervisor and the District Staff are entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses per Florida Statutes 190.006(8).

Public Officials Liability Insurance: The District will incur expenditures for public officials' liability insurance for the Board and Staff.

Legal Advertising: The District will incur expenditures related to legal advertising. The items for which the District will advertise include, but are not limited to meeting schedules, special meeting notices, and public hearings, bidding etc. for the District based on statutory guidelines

Bank Fees: The District will incur bank service charges during the year.

Dues, Licenses & Fees: The District is required to pay an annual fee to the Department of Economic Opportunity, along with other items which may require licenses or permits, etc.

Miscellaneous Fees: The District could incur miscellaneous fees throughout the year, which may not fit into any standard categories.

Website Hosting, Maintenance and Email: The District may incur fees as they relate to the development and ongoing maintenance of its own website along with possible email services if requested.

District Counsel: The District's legal counsel provides general legal services to the District. Among these services are attendance at and preparation for monthly board meetings, review of operating and maintenance contracts and all other legal services requested by the district throughout the year.

EXPENDITURES - FIELD OPERATIONS:

Deputy Services: The District may wish to contract with the local police agency to provide security for the District.

Security Services and Patrols: The District may wish to contract with a private company to provide security for the District.

Electric Utility Services: The District will incur electric utility expenditures for general purposes such as irrigation timers, lift station pumps, fountains, etc.

Streetlights: The District may have expenditures relating to streetlights throughout the community. These may be restricted to main arterial roads or in some cases to all streetlights within the District's boundaries.

Utility - Recreation Facility: The District may budget separately for its recreation and or amenity electric separately.

Gas Utility Services: The District may incur gas utility expenditures related to district operations at its facilities such as pool heat etc.

Garbage - Recreation Facility: The District will incur expenditures related to the removal of garbage and solid waste.

Solid Waste Assessment Fee: The District may have an assessment levied by another local government for solid waste, etc.

Water-Sewer Utility Services: The District will incur water/sewer utility expenditures related to district operations.

Utility - Reclaimed: The District may incur expenses related to the use of reclaimed water for irrigation.

Aquatic Maintenance: Expenses related to the care and maintenance of the lakes and ponds for the control of nuisance plant and algae species.

Fountain Service Repairs & Maintenance: The District may incur expenses related to maintaining the fountains within throughout the Parks & Recreational areas

Lake/Pond Bank Maintenance: The District may incur expenditures to maintain lake banks, etc. for the ponds and lakes within the District's boundaries, along with planting of beneficial aquatic plants, stocking of fish, mowing and landscaping of the banks as the District determines necessary.

Wetland Monitoring & Maintenance: The District may be required to provide for certain types of monitoring and maintenance activities for various wetlands and waterways by other governmental entities.

Mitigation Area Monitoring & Maintenance: The District may be required to provide for certain types of monitoring and maintenance activities for various mitigation areas by other governmental entities.

Aquatic Plant Replacement: The expenses related to replacing beneficial aquatic plants, which may or may not have been required by other governmental entities.

General Liability Insurance: The District will incur fees to insure items owned by the District for its general liability needs

Property Insurance: The District will incur fees to insure items owned by the District for its property needs

Entry and Walls Maintenance: The District will incur expenditures to maintain the entry monuments and the fencing.

Landscape Maintenance: The District will incur expenditures to maintain the rights-of-way, median strips, recreational facilities including pond banks, entryways, and similar planting areas within the District. These services include but are not limited to monthly landscape maintenance, fertilizer, pesticides, annuals, mulch, and irrigation repairs.

Irrigation Maintenance: The District will incur expenditures related to the maintenance of the irrigation systems.

Irrigation Repairs: The District will incur expenditures related to repairs of the irrigation systems.

Landscape Replacement: Expenditures related to replacement of turf, trees, shrubs etc.

Field Services: The District may contract for field management services to provide landscape maintenance oversight.

Miscellaneous Fees: The District may incur miscellaneous expenses that do not readily fit into defined categories in field operations.

Gate Phone: The District will incur telephone expenses if the District has gates that are to be opened and closed.

Street/Parking Lot Sweeping: The District may incur expenses related to street sweeping for roadways it owns or are owned by another governmental entity, for which it elects to maintain.

Gate Facility Maintenance: Expenses related to the ongoing repairs and maintenance of gates owned by the District if any.

Sidewalk Repair & Maintenance: Expenses related to sidewalks located in the right of way of streets the District may own if any.

Roadway Repair & Maintenance: Expenses related to the repair and maintenance of roadways owned by the District if any.

Employees - Salaries: The District may incur expenses for employees/staff members needed for the recreational facilities such as Clubhouse Staff.

Employees - P/R Taxes: This is the employer's portion of employment taxes such as FICA etc.

Employee - Workers' Comp: Fees related to obtaining workers compensation insurance.

Management Contract: The District may contract with a firm to provide for the oversight of its recreation facilities.

Maintenance & Repair: The District may incur expenses to maintain its recreation facilities.

Facility Supplies: The District may have facilities that required various supplies to operate.

Gate Maintenance & Repairs: Any ongoing gate repairs and maintenance would be included in this line item.

Telephone, Fax, Internet: The District may incur telephone, fax and internet expenses related to the recreational facilities.

Office Supplies: The District may have an office in its facilities which require various office related supplies.

Clubhouse - Facility Janitorial Service: Expenses related to the cleaning of the facility and related supplies.

Pool Service Contract: Expenses related to the maintenance of swimming pools and other water features.

Pool Repairs: Expenses related to the repair of swimming pools and other water features.

Security System Monitoring & Maintenance: The District may wish to install a security system for the clubhouse

Clubhouse Miscellaneous Expense: Expenses which may not fit into a defined category in this section of the budget

Athletic/Park Court/Field Repairs: Expense related to any facilities such as tennis, basketball etc.

Trail/Bike Path Maintenance: Expenses related to various types of trail or pathway systems the District may own, from hard surface to natural surfaces.

Special Events: Expenses related to functions such as holiday events for the public enjoyment

Miscellaneous Fees: Monies collected and allocated for fees that the District could incur throughout the year, which may not fit into any standard categories.

Miscellaneous Contingency: Monies collected and allocated for expenses that the District could incur throughout the year, which may not fit into any standard categories.

Capital Outlay: Monies collected and allocated for various projects as they relate to public improvements.

RESERVE FUND BUDGET ACCOUNT CATEGORY DESCRIPTION

The Reserve Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are subject to change at any time depending on its application to the District. Please note, not all Reserve Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are applicable to the District indicated above. Uses of the descriptions contained herein are intended for general reference.

REVENUES:

Tax Roll: The District levies Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessments on all of the assessable property within the District to pay for operating expenditures incurred during the Fiscal Year. The assessments may be collected in two ways. The first is by placing them on the County's Tax Roll, to be collected with the County's Annual Property Tax Billing. This method is only available to land properly platted within the time limits prescribed by the County. The second way is by Off Roll collection.

Off Roll: For lands not on the tax roll and that is by way of a direct bill from the District to the appropriate property owner.

Developer Contributions: The District may enter into a funding agreement and receive certain prescribed dollars from the Developer to off-set expenditures of the District.

Miscellaneous Revenues: The District may receive monies for the sale or provision of electronic access cards, entry decals etc.

EXPENDITURES:

Capital Reserve: Monies collected and allocated for the future repair and replacement of various capital improvements such as club facilities, swimming pools, athletic courts, roads, etc.

Capital Outlay: Monies collected and allocated for various projects as they relate to public improvements.

<u>DEBT SERVICE FUND BUDGET</u> ACCOUNT CATEGORY DESCRIPTION

The Debt Service Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are subject to change at any time depending on its application to the District. Please note, not all Debt Service Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are applicable to the District indicated above. Uses of the descriptions contained herein are intended for general reference.

REVENUES:

Special Assessments: The District may levy special assessments to repay the debt incurred by the sale of bonds to raise working capital for certain public improvements. The assessments may be collected in the same fashion as described in the Operations and Maintenance Assessments.

EXPENDITURES – ADMINISTRATIVE:

Bank Fees: The District may incur bank service charges during the year.

Debt Service Obligation: This would be a combination of the principal and interest payment to satisfy the annual repayment of the bond issue debt.

RESOLUTION 2023-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SUMMER WOODS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT MAKING A DETERMINATION OF BENEFIT AND IMPOSING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024; PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PENALTIES AND INTEREST THEREON; CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Summer Woods Community Development District ("**District**") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted capital improvement plan and Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District has determined to undertake various operations and maintenance and other activities described in the District's budget ("Adopted Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024 ("Fiscal Year 2023/2024"), attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, authorizes the District to fund the Adopted Budget through a funding agreement and/or through the imposition of special assessments on benefitted lands within the District, which special assessments may be collected by direct bill or on the tax roll pursuant to Chapter 197, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, in order to fund the District's Adopted Budget, the District's Board now desires to adopt this Resolution setting forth the means by which the District intends to fund its Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SUMMER WOODS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

1. OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS.

- **a. Benefit Findings.** The provision of the services, facilities, and operations as described in **Exhibit A** confers a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefit exceeds or equals the cost of the assessments. The allocation of the assessments to the specially benefitted lands is shown in **Exhibits A and B,** and is hereby found to be fair and reasonable.
- b. Assessment Imposition. Pursuant to Chapters 190, 197 and/or 170, Florida Statutes, and using the procedures authorized by Florida law for the levy and collection of special assessments, a special assessment for operation and maintenance is hereby imposed and levied on benefitted lands within the District and in accordance with Exhibits A and B. The lien of the special assessments for

operations and maintenance imposed and levied by this Resolution shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution.

The Board finds and determines that operations and maintenance assessments shall immediately attach only to sold lots (as set forth in **Exhibits "A" and "B"**), and further that operations and maintenance assessments shall also attach on a pro-rated basis to any lots sold during Fiscal Year 2023/2024 at the time of sale, and as evidenced by an estoppel letter prepared by the District's Manager. All unsold lots owned by the developer do not receive the same level of benefit as sold lots and, accordingly, such lots shall not receive an operations and maintenance assessment for Fiscal Year 2023/2024. Instead, any additional costs of the District's Adopted Budget (above and beyond the operations and maintenance assessment that attaches to sold lots) shall be funded pursuant to a deficit funding agreement to be entered into between the District and the project developer.

c. Maximum Rate. Pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), *Florida Statutes*, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for operation and maintenance assessments.

2. COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES; INTEREST.

- a. Tax Roll Assessments. If and to the extent indicated in Exhibits A and B, certain of the operations and maintenance special assessments (if any) and/or previously levied debt service special assessments (if any) imposed on the "Tax Roll Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes in accordance with Chapter 197 of the Florida Statutes. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Tax Roll Property.
- b. Direct Bill Assessments. If and to the extent indicated in Exhibits A and B, certain operations and maintenance special assessments (if any) and/or previously levied debt service special assessments (if any) imposed on "Direct Collect Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected directly by the District in accordance with Florida law, as set forth in Exhibits A and B. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Direct Collect Property.
 - i. Operations and maintenance assessments directly collected by the District shall be due and payable on the dates set forth in the invoices prepared by the District Manager, but no earlier than October 1st and no later than September 30th of Fiscal Year 2023/2024.

As noted above, operations and maintenance assessments shall attach to any lots sold during Fiscal Year 2023/2024 at the time of sale, and as evidenced by an estoppel letter prepared by the District's Manager. Any such assessments shall be collected directly by the District in accordance with Florida law, and at the time of sale.

- ii. Debt service assessments directly collected by the District are due in full on December 1, 2023; provided, however, that, to the extent permitted by law, the assessments due may be paid in two partial, deferred payments and on dates that are 30 days prior to the District's corresponding debt service payment dates all as set forth in the invoice(s) prepared by the District Manager.
- iii. In the event that an assessment payment is not made in accordance with the schedule(s) stated above, the whole assessment - including any remaining partial, deferred payments for the Fiscal Year, shall immediately become due and payable; shall accrue interest, penalties in the amount of one percent (1%) per month, and all costs of collection and enforcement; and shall either be enforced pursuant to a foreclosure action, or, at the District's sole discretion, collected pursuant to the Uniform Method on a future tax bill, which amount may include penalties, interest, and costs of collection and enforcement. Any prejudgment interest on delinquent assessments shall accrue at the rate of any bonds secured by the assessments, or at the statutory prejudgment interest rate, as applicable. In the event an assessment subject to direct collection by the District shall be delinquent, the District Manager and District Counsel, without further authorization by the Board, may initiate foreclosure proceedings pursuant to Chapter 170, Florida Statutes, or other applicable law to collect and enforce the whole assessment, as set forth herein.
- c. **Future Collection Methods.** The decision to collect special assessments by any particular method e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill does not mean that such method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to select collection methods in any given year, regardless of past practices.
- 3. **ASSESSMENT ROLL; AMENDMENTS.** The Assessment Roll, attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit "B,"** is hereby certified for collection. That portion of the Assessment Roll which includes the Tax Roll Property is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County taxes. The proceeds therefrom shall be paid to the District. The District Manager shall keep apprised of all updates made to the County property roll by the Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution, and shall amend the Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll.
- 4. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.
- 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Supervisors
Summer Woods Community Development District

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements Opinions

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, and each major fund of the *Summer Woods Community Development District* (the "District"), as of and for the year ended September 30, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the District's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, and each major fund of the District as of September 30, 2022, and the respective changes in financial position thereof and the respective budgetary comparison for the General Fund for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinions

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS) and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the District and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements related to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

The District's management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the District's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgement made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates
 made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgement, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the District's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis starting on page 3, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued a report dated June 20, 2023, on our consideration of the District's internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the District's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

Orlando, Florida June 20, 2023 Our discussion and analysis of *Summer Woods Community Development District* (the "District") financial accomplishments provide an overview of the District's financial activities for the year ended September 30, 2022. Please read it in conjunction with the District's Independent Auditor's Report, financial statements and accompanying notes.

This information is being presented to provide additional information regarding the activities of the District and to meet the disclosure requirements of Government Accounting Standards Board Statement (GASB) No. 34, Basic Financial Statements - and Management's Discussion and Analysis - for State and Local Governments issued June 1999.

Financial Highlights

- The assets of the District exceeded its liabilities at September 30, 2022 by \$2,077,526, a decrease in net position of \$10.617.
- At September 30, 2022, the District's governmental funds reported fund balances of \$1,973,334, an increase of \$1,353,729.

Overview of the Financial Statements

This discussion and analysis are intended to serve as an introduction to *Summer Woods Community Development District's* financial statements. The District's financial statements are comprised of three components: 1) government-wide financial statements, 2) fund financial statements and 3) notes to financial statements.

Government-Wide Financial Statements

The government-wide financial statements are designed to provide readers with a broad overview of the District's finances, in a manner similar to a private-sector business.

The statement of net position presents information on all of the District's assets and liabilities, with the difference between the two reported as net position. Over time, increases or decreases in net position may serve as a useful indicator of whether the financial position of the District is improving or deteriorating.

The statement of activities presents information showing how the government's net position changed during the most recent fiscal year. All changes in net position are reported as soon as the underlying event giving rise to the change occurs, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Thus, revenues and expenses are reported in this statement for some items that will result in cash flows in future fiscal periods.

The government-wide financial statements include all governmental activities that are principally supported by special assessment revenues. The District does not have any business-type activities. The governmental activities of the District include general government, maintenance and operations, public safety, and parks and recreation related functions.

Fund Financial Statements

A fund is a grouping of related accounts that is used to maintain control over resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. The District, like other state and local governments, uses fund accounting to ensure and demonstrate compliance with finance-related legal requirements. The District has one fund category: Governmental Funds.

Governmental funds are used to account for essentially the same functions reported as governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. However, unlike the government-wide financial statements, governmental fund financial statements focus on near-term inflows and outflows of spendable resources, as well as on balances of spendable resources available at the end of the fiscal year. Such information may be useful in evaluating a District's near-term financing requirements.

Governmental Funds

Because the focus of governmental funds is narrower than that of the government-wide financial statements, it is useful to compare the information presented for governmental funds with similar information presented for governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. By doing so, readers may better understand the long-term impact of the government's near-term financing decisions. Both the governmental fund balance sheet and the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances provide a reconciliation to facilitate this comparison between governmental funds and governmental activities.

The District maintains three individual governmental funds. Information is presented separately in the governmental fund balance sheet and the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances for the general fund, debt service fund and capital projects fund, all of which are considered to be major funds.

The District adopts an annual appropriated budget for its general fund. A budgetary comparison schedule has been provided for the general fund to demonstrate compliance with the budget.

Notes to Financial Statements

The notes provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the government-wide and fund financial statements.

Government-Wide Financial Analysis

Statement of Net Position

The District's net position was \$2,077,526 at September 30, 2022. The analysis that follows focuses on the net position of the District's governmental activities.

As noted above and in the statement of activities, the cost of all governmental activities during the year ended September 30, 2022 was \$4,202,826. The majority of these costs are maintenance and operations and interest on long-term debt.

Financial Analysis of the Government's Funds

The District uses fund accounting to ensure and demonstrate compliance with finance related legal requirements. The focus of the District's governmental funds is to provide information on near-term inflows, outflows and balances of spendable resources. Such information is useful in assessing the District's financing requirements. In particular, unassigned fund balance may serve as a useful measure of a government's net resources available for spending at the end of the fiscal year. At September 30, 2022, the District's governmental funds reported combined ending fund balances of \$1,973,334. Of this total, \$22,794 is non-spendable, \$1,874,128 is restricted, and the remainder of \$76,412 is unassigned.

The fund balance of the general fund increased \$99,206 due to increased assessment revenue. The debt service fund balance increased by \$448,473 due to bonds issued. The capital projects fund balance increased \$806,050 due to bonds issued.

General Fund Budgetary Highlights

An operating budget was adopted and maintained by the governing board for the District pursuant to the requirements of Florida Statutes. The budget to actual comparison for the general fund, including the original budget and final adopted budget, is shown on page 12. The budget is adopted using the same basis of accounting that is used in preparation of the fund financial statements. There were no budget amendments during the year. The legal level of budgetary control is at the fund level.

Capital Asset and Debt Administration

Capital Assets

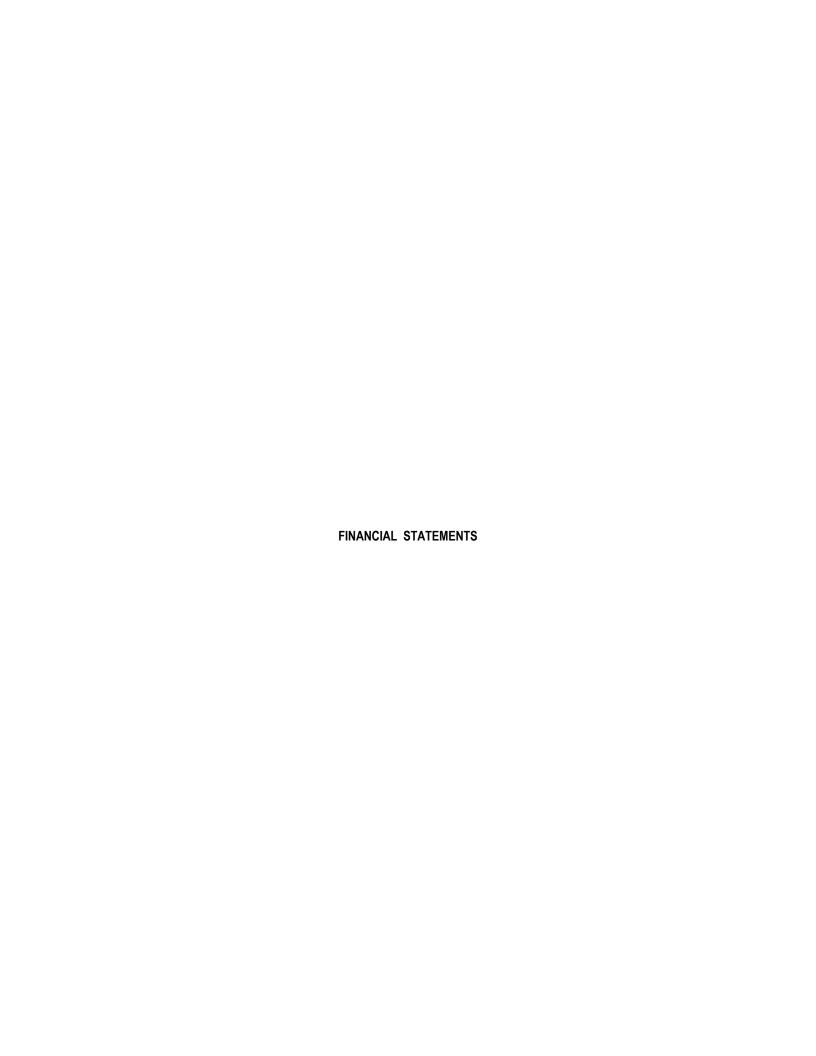
At September 30, 2022, the District had \$20,409,474 invested in capital assets. More detailed information about the District's capital assets is presented in the notes to financial statements.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reporting Entity

Summer Woods Community Development District, (the "District") was established on September 1, 2011 by the Manatee County, Florida Ordinance No. 11-13 pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, otherwise known as Chapter 190, Florida Statutes. The Act provides, among other things, the power to manage basic services for community development, the power to borrow money and issue bonds, and the power to levy and assess non-ad valorem assessments for the financing and delivery of capital infrastructure. The District was established for the purpose of financing and managing the acquisition, construction, maintenance and operation of a portion of the infrastructure necessary for community development within the District.

The District is governed by the Board of Supervisors (the "Board"), which is composed of five members. The Board of Supervisors of the District exercises all powers granted to the District pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes. At September 30, 2022, all the Board of Supervisors are affiliated with the Developer, VK Summerwoods Investors, LLC. The District is economically dependent on the Developer.

The Board has final responsibility for:

- 1. Allocating and levying assessments.
- 2. Approving budgets.
- 3. Exercising control over facilities and properties.
- 4. Controlling the use of funds generated by the District.
- 5. Approving the hiring and firing of key personnel.
- 6. Financing improvements.

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board ("GASB") Statements 14, 39, and 61. Under the provisions of those standards, the financial reporting entity consists of the primary government, organizations for which the District Board of Supervisors is considered to be financially accountable, and other organizations for which the nature and significance of their relationship with the District are such that, if excluded, the financial statements of the District would be considered incomplete or misleading. There are no entities considered to be component units of the District; therefore, the financial statements include only the operations of the District.

Government-Wide and Fund Financial Statements

The financial statements include both government-wide and fund financial statements.

The government-wide financial statements (i.e., the statement of net position and the statement of activities) report information on all of the non-fiduciary activities of the primary government. For the most part, the effect of interfund activity has been removed from these statements.

The statement of activities demonstrates the degree to which the direct expenses of a given function or segment is offset by program revenues. *Direct expenses* are those that are clearly identifiable with a specific function or segment. *Program revenues* include 1) charges to customers who purchase, use, or directly benefit from goods, services, or privileges provided by a given function or segment, 2) grants, contributions and investment earnings that are restricted to meeting the operational or capital requirements of a particular function or segment and 3) operating-type special assessments that are treated as charges for services (including assessments for maintenance and debt service). Other items not included among program revenues are reported instead as *general revenues*.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting and Financial Statement Presentation

The government-wide financial statements are reported using the *economic resources measurement* focus and the *accrual basis of accounting*. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Assessments are recognized as revenues in the year for which they are levied. Grants and similar items are recognized as revenues as soon as all eligibility requirements imposed by the provider have been met.

Governmental fund financial statements are reported using the *current financial resources measurement focus* and the modified *accrual basis of accounting*. Revenues are recognized as soon as they are both measurable and available. Revenues are considered to be *available* when they are collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to pay liabilities of the current period. For this purpose, the District considers revenues to be available if they are collected within 60 days of the end of the current fiscal period, except for Developer receivables for retainage, which are collected from the Developer when the amount is due to the contractor. Expenditures are recorded when a liability is incurred, as under accrual accounting. However, debt service expenditures are recorded only when payment is due.

Assessments, including debt service assessments and operation and maintenance assessments, are non-ad valorem assessments imposed on all lands located within the District and benefited by the District's activities. Operation and maintenance special assessments are levied by the District prior to the start of the fiscal year which begins October 1st and ends on September 30th. These assessments are imposed upon all benefited lands located in the District. Debt service special assessments are imposed upon certain lots and lands as described in each resolution imposing the special assessment for each series of bonds issued by the District. Certain debt service assessments are collected upon the closing of those lots subject to short term debt and are used to prepay a portion of the bonds outstanding.

Assessments and interest associated with the current fiscal period are all considered to be susceptible to accrual and so have been recognized as revenues of the current fiscal period. Only the portion of assessments receivable due within the current fiscal period is considered to be susceptible to accrual as revenue of the current period. All other revenue items are considered to be measurable and available only when cash is received by the District.

The District reports the following major governmental funds:

General Fund - Is the District's primary operating fund. It is used to account for and report all financial resources not accounted for and reported in another fund.

Debt Service Fund - Accounts for the accumulation of resources for the annual payment of principal and interest on long-term debt.

Capital Project Fund - Accounts for the financial resources to be used for the acquisition or construction of major infrastructure within the District.

As a general rule, the effect of interfund activity has been eliminated from the government-wide financial statements. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the District's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as they are needed.

Assets, Liabilities, Deferred Outflows/Inflows of Resources and Net Position/Fund Balance

Restricted Assets

These assets represent cash and investments set aside pursuant to bond covenants.

Deposits and Investments

The District's cash and cash equivalents are considered to be cash on hand and demand deposits.

Investments of the District are reported at fair value and are categorized within the fair value hierarchy established in accordance with GASB Statement No. 72, Fair Value Measurement and Application. The District's investments consist of investments authorized in accordance with Section 218.415, Florida Statutes.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Prepaid Items

Inventory and prepaid items are recorded as expenditures when consumed rather than when purchased in both government-wide and fund financial statements

Assessments Receivable

Assessments receivable are reported net of an allowance for uncollectibles.

Capital Assets

Capital assets, which include property, plant, equipment and infrastructure assets (e.g., roads, sidewalks and similar items), are reported in the applicable governmental activities column in the government-wide financial statements. Capital assets are defined by the District as assets with an initial, individual cost of more than \$5,000 and an estimated useful life in excess of two years. Such assets are recorded at historical cost or estimated historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated capital assets are recorded at acquisition value at the date of donation.

The costs of normal maintenance and repairs that do not add to the value of the asset or materially extend assets lives are not capitalized. Major outlays for capital assets and improvements are capitalized as projects are constructed.

Property, plant and equipment of the District are depreciated using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

Long Term Obligations

In the government-wide financial statements, long-term debt and other long-term obligations are reported as liabilities in the statement of net position. Bond premiums and discounts are deferred and amortized over the life of the bonds using the straight-line method. Bond issuance costs are reported as expenses. Bonds payable are reported net of premiums or discounts.

In the fund financial statements, governmental fund types recognize bond premiums and discounts, as well as bond issuance costs, during the current period. The face amount of debt issuand is reported as other financing sources. Premiums received on debt issuances are reported as other financing sources while discounts on debt issuances are reported as other financing uses. Issuance costs, whether or not withheld from the actual debt proceeds received, are reported as expenditures.

Deferred Outflows/Inflows of Resources

In addition to assets, the statement of financial position will sometimes report a separate section for deferred outflows of resources. This separate financial statement element, deferred outflows of resources, represents a consumption of net position that applies to a future period(s) and so will not be recognized as an outflow of resources (expense/expenditure) until then. The District does not have any item that qualifies for reporting in this category for the year ended September 30, 2022.

In addition to liabilities, the statement of financial position will sometimes report a separate section for deferred inflows of resources. This separate financial statement element, deferred inflows of resources, represents an acquisition of net position that applies to a future period(s) and so will not be recognized as an inflow of resources (revenue) until that time. The District does not have any item that qualifies for reporting in this category for the year ended September 30, 2022.

Net Position Flow Assumption

Sometimes the District will fund outlays for a particular purpose from both restricted and unrestricted resources. In order to calculate the amounts to report as restricted net position and unrestricted net position in the government-wide financial statements, a flow assumption must be made about the order in which the resources are considered to be applied. It is the District's policy to consider restricted net position to have been depleted before unrestricted net position is applied.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Fund Balance Flow Assumptions

Sometimes the District will fund outlays for a particular purpose from both restricted and unrestricted resources (total of committed, assigned, and unassigned fund balance). In order to calculate the amounts to report as restricted, committed, assigned, and unassigned fund balance in the governmental fund financial statements a flow assumption must be made about the order in which the resources are considered to be applied. It is the District's policy to consider restricted fund balance to have been depleted before using any of the components of unrestricted fund balance. Further, when the components of unrestricted fund balance can be used for the same purpose, committed fund balance is depleted first, followed by assigned fund balance. Unassigned fund balance is applied last.

Fund Balance Policies

Fund balance of governmental funds is reported in various categories based on the nature of any limitations requiring the use of resources for specific purposes. The District itself can establish limitations on the use of resources through either commitment (committed fund balance) or an assignment (assigned fund balance).

The committed fund balance classification includes fund balance amounts that can be used only for the specific purposes determined by a formal action of the government's highest level of decision-making authority. The Board of Supervisors is the highest level of decision-making authority for the government that can, by adoption of an ordinance or resolution prior to the end of the fiscal year, commit fund balance. Once adopted, the limitation imposed by the ordinance or resolution remains in place until a similar action is taken to remove or revise the limitation.

Amounts in the assigned fund balance classification are intended to be used by the government for specific purposes but do not meet the criteria to be classified as committed. The Board of Supervisors has authorized the District Manager to assign amounts for specific purposes. The Board of Supervisors may also assign fund balance as it does when appropriating fund balance to cover a gap between estimated revenue and appropriations in the subsequent year's appropriated budget. Unlike commitments, assignments generally only exist temporarily. In other words, an additional action does not normally have to be taken for the removal of an assignment. Conversely, as discussed above an additional action is essential to either remove or revise a commitment.

Other Disclosures

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenditures during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

New Accounting Standards

In fiscal year 2022, the District has not implemented any new accounting standards with a material effect on the District's financial statements.

NOTE 2 STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Budgetary Information

The District is required to establish a budgetary system and an approved annual budget for the General Fund. Annual budgets are adopted on a basis consistent with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. All annual appropriations lapse at the fiscal year end. The legal level of budgetary control is at the fund level. Any budget amendments that increase the aggregate budgeted appropriations, at the fund level, must be approved by the Board of Supervisors.

The District follows these procedures in establishing the budgetary data reflected in the financial statements.

- 1. Each year the District Manager submits to the District Board a proposed operating budget for the fiscal year commencing the following October 1.
- 2. A public hearing is conducted to obtain comments.
- 3. Prior to October 1, the budget is legally adopted by the District Board.
- 4. All budget changes must be approved by the District Board.
- The budgets are adopted on a basis consistent with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 3 DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Deposits

The District's cash balances were entirely covered by federal depository insurance or by a collateral pool pledged to the State Treasurer. Florida Statutes Chapter 280, "Florida Security for Public Deposits Act", requires all qualified depositories to deposit with the Treasurer or another banking institution eligible collateral equal to various percentages of the average daily balance for each month of all public deposits in excess of any applicable deposit insurance held. The percentage of eligible collateral (generally, U.S. Governmental and agency securities, state or local government debt, or corporate bonds) to public deposits is dependent upon the depository's financial history and its compliance with Chapter 280. In the event of a failure of a qualified public depository, the remaining public depositories would be responsible for covering any resulting losses.

Investments

The District categorizes its fair value measurements within the fair value hierarchy established by generally accepted accounting principles. The fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset, or paid to transfer a liability, in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The hierarchy is based on the valuation inputs used to measure the fair value of the asset

Under GASB 72, assets or liabilities are classified into one of three levels. Level 1 is the most reliable and is based on quoted prices for identical assets, or liabilities, in an active market. Level 2 uses significant other observable inputs when obtaining quoted prices for identical or similar assets, or liabilities, in markets that are not active. Level 3 is the least reliable, and uses significant unobservable inputs that uses the best information available under the circumstances, which includes the District's own data in measuring unobservable inputs.

Instead of establishing a written investment policy, the District elected to limit investments to those approved by Florida Statutes and the District Trust Indenture. Authorized District investments include, but are not limited to:

- 1. The Local Government Surplus Funds Trust Fund (SBA);
- 2. Securities and Exchange Commission registered money market funds with the highest credit quality rating from a nationally recognized rating agency;
- 3. Interest-bearing time deposits or savings accounts in qualified public depositories;
- 4. Direct obligations of the U.S. Treasury.

Investments made by the District at September 30, 2022 are summarized below.

Credit Risk:

For investments, credit risk is generally the risk that an issuer of an investment will not fulfill its obligation to the holder of the investment. Investments in U.S. Government securities and agencies must be backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government. Short term bond funds shall be rated by a nationally recognized ratings agency and shall maintain the highest credit quality rating. Investment ratings by investment type are included in the preceding summary of investments.

Custodial Credit Risk:

In the case of deposits, this is the risk that, in the event of a bank failure, the District's deposits may not be returned to it. The District's investment policy requires that bank deposits be secured as provided by Chapter 280, Florida Statutes. This law requires local governments to deposit funds only in financial institutions designated as qualified public depositories by the Chief Financial Officer of the State of Florida, and creates the Public Deposits Trust Fund, a multiple financial institution pool with the ability to assess its member financial institutions for collateral shortfalls if a default or insolvency has occurred. At September 30, 2022, all of the District's bank deposits were in qualified public depositories.

NOTE 3 DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

For an investment, this is the risk that, in the event of the failure of the counterparty, the government will not be able to recover the value of its investments or collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. At September 30, 2022, none of the investments listed are exposed to custodial credit risk because their existence is not evidenced by securities that exist in physical or book entry form.

Concentration of Credit Risk:

The District places no limit on the amount the District may invest in any one issuer.

Interest Rate Risk:

The District does not have a formal policy that limits investment maturities as a means of managing exposure to fair value losses arising from increasing interest rates. The District manages its exposure to declines in fair values by investing primarily in pooled investments that have a weighted average maturity of less than three months.

The total construction project was expected to cost approximately \$16.72 million, with \$6.512 million allocated to the Assessment Area One Project and \$10.208 million allocated to the remainder of the district lands outside of the Assessment Area One. The infrastructure will include roadways, stormwater management systems, water distribution, sanitary sewer, landscaping, irrigation and recreational facilities. The net proceeds from the Series 2018A Bonds are approximately \$5.2 million and will be used by the District to provide funds for the construction of a portion of the Assessment Area One Project. The District entered into an acquisition agreement with the Developer, whereby the Developer has agreed to advance, fund, commence and/or complete certain infrastructure improvements. In connection with the agreement, the District paid the Developer \$1,839,636 as payment for acquired infrastructure improvements in a prior fiscal year. The Developer entered into a completion agreement to fund or cause to be funded the completion of the Assessment Area One Project to the extent that the 2018A Bonds are not sufficient to pay for the entire Assessment Area One Project. Upon completion, certain improvements are expected to be conveyed to other governments.

NOTE 4 CAPITAL ASSETS (CONTINUED)

The District has entered into a construction contract in connection with the construction of various infrastructure improvements. The construction contract covers both private development being conducted for the benefit of the Developer as well as public infrastructure improvements within the scope of the District's capital improvement plan. The District entered into a cost share agreement with the Developer whereby the Developer has agreed to pay for the cost of the work in addition to that work which is identified as being the District's responsibility, for such items of work that are not included in the District's capital improvement plan.

There were no receipts from the Developer during the fiscal year in connection with the cost share agreement.

The District issued Series 2020 Bonds in a prior year to finance the Area Two Project. Area Two Project was revised and will be constructed in two sub-parts, the 2020 Project for the next 338 residential units outside the Area One project, and an additional 123 units to be part of a future project. The total cost of the revised Area Two Project is estimated at \$18.003 million, of which \$13.79 million is estimated for the 2020 Project. The net construction proceeds from the Series 2020 Bonds are approximately \$6.2 million and are used by the District to provide funds for the construction of a portion of the Assessment Area Two- 2020 Project. The Developer entered into a completion agreement to fund or cause to be funded the completion of the 2020 Project.

The District issued Series 2021 Bonds to finance the Area Two 2021 project. The Area Two - 2021 Project consists of infrastructure, including the recreational amenity, and parcel infrastructure associated with either Phase 4A or Phase 3B. The net construction proceeds from the Series 2021 Bonds are approximately \$2.8 million and are used by the District to provide funds for the construction of a portion of the Assessment Area Two- 2021 Project. The Developer entered into a completion agreement to fund or cause to be funded the completion of the 2021 Project.

In the current year, the District issued Series 2021 A3 Bonds to finance the Area Three 2021 project. The Area Three - 2021 Project consists of infrastructure, associated with Phases 3B, 4B and 4C, as well as 11 lots within Phase 3A. The net construction proceeds from the Series 2021 Bonds are approximately \$6.5 million and are used by the District to provide funds for the construction of a portion of the Assessment Area Three- 2021 Project. The Developer entered into a completion agreement to fund or cause to be funded the completion of the 2021 Project.

Depreciation expense for 2022 was \$181,175 charged to physical environment and \$98,252 charged to recreation.

NOTE 5 LONG-TERM LIABILITIES

Series 2018 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds - Public Offering

In May 2018, the District issued \$6,065,000 of Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Series 2018, consisting of \$3,565,000 Series 2018A-1 multi-term bonds due November 1, 2023 to November 1, 2048 with interest rates of 4% - 5.375%, and \$2,500,000 Series 2018A-2 Term Bonds due November 1, 2029 with an interest rate of 5.375%. The Bonds were issued to finance the acquisition and construction of certain improvements for the benefit of the property within the District. Interest is paid semiannually on each May 1 and November 1, Principal on the Series 2018 Bonds is due serially commencing on November 1, 2019 through November 1, 2048.

The Series 2018 Bonds are subject to redemption at the option of the District prior to maturity at a redemption price as set forth in the Bond Indenture. The Bonds are subject to extraordinary mandatory redemption prior to maturity in the manner determined by the Bond Indenture.

The Bond Indenture requires that the District maintain adequate funds in a reserve account to meet the debt service reserve requirements as defined in the Indenture. At September 30, 2022 the reserve requirement was met.

The Bond Indenture has certain restrictions and requirements relating principally to the use of proceeds to pay for the infrastructure improvements and the procedures to be followed by the District on assessments to property owners. The District agreed to levy special assessments in annual amounts adequate to provide payment of debt service. Payment of principal and interest on the 2018 Bonds is secured by a pledge of and a first lien upon the pledged special assessment revenue.

As of September 30, 2022, total principal and interest remaining on the Series 2018 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds was \$6,384,570. Principal and interest of \$564,506 was paid for the year ended September 30, 2022. Total special assessment revenue pledged was \$337,476.

NOTE 5 LONG-TERM LIABILITIES (CONTINUED)

Series 2020 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds - Public Offering

In March 2020, the District issued \$6,875,000 of Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Series 2020, consisting of \$700,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2025 with an interest rate of 3.0%, \$1,005,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2031 with an interest rate of 3.3%, \$1,980,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2040 with an interest rate of 3.75% and \$3,190,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2050 with an interest rate of 4%. The Bonds were issued to finance the acquisition and construction of certain improvements for the benefit of the property within the District. Interest is paid semiannually on each May 1 and November 1. Principal on the Series 2020 Bonds is due serially commencing on May 1, 2021 through May 1, 2050.

The Series 2020 Bonds are subject to redemption at the option of the District prior to maturity at a redemption price as set forth in the Bond Indenture. The Bonds are subject to extraordinary mandatory redemption prior to maturity in the manner determined by the Bond Indenture.

The Bond Indenture requires that the District maintain adequate funds in a reserve account to meet the debt service reserve requirements as defined in the Indenture. At September 30, 2022 the reserve requirement was met.

The Bond Indenture has certain restrictions and requirements relating principally to the use of proceeds to pay for the infrastructure improvements and the procedures to be followed by the District on assessments to property owners. The District agreed to levy special assessments in annual amounts adequate to provide payment of debt service. Payment of principal and interest on the 2021 Bonds is secured by a pledge of and a first lien upon the pledged special assessment revenue.

As of September 30, 2022, total principal and interest remaining on the Series 2020 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds was \$10,253,118. Principal and interest paid was \$584,137 for the year ended September 30, 2022. Total special assessment revenue pledged was \$622,750.

Series 2021 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds - Public Offering

In May 2021, the District issued \$3,290,000 of Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Series 2021, consisting of \$350,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2026 with an interest rate of 2.4%, \$405,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2031 with an interest rate of 3.0%, \$1,035,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2041 with an interest rate of 3.4% and \$1,500,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2051 with an interest rate of 4%. The Bonds were issued to finance the acquisition and construction of certain improvements for the benefit of the property within the District. Interest is paid semiannually on each May 1 and November 1. Principal on the Series 2021 Bonds is due serially commencing on November 1, 2021 through May 1, 2051.

The Series 2021 Bonds are subject to redemption at the option of the District prior to maturity at a redemption price as set forth in the Bond Indenture. The Bonds are subject to extraordinary mandatory redemption prior to maturity in the manner determined by the Bond Indenture.

The Bond Indenture requires that the District maintain adequate funds in a reserve account to meet the debt service reserve requirements as defined in the Indenture. At September 30, 2022 the reserve requirement was met.

The Bond Indenture has certain restrictions and requirements relating principally to the use of proceeds to pay for the infrastructure improvements and the procedures to be followed by the District on assessments to property owners. The District agreed to levy special assessments in annual amounts adequate to provide payment of debt service. Payment of principal and interest on the 2021 Bonds is secured by a pledge of and a first lien upon the pledged special assessment revenue.

As of September 30, 2022, total principal and interest remaining on the Series 2021 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds was \$5,105,770. Principal and interest paid was \$303,209 and special assessment revenue pledged was \$546,840.

NOTE 5 LONG-TERM LIABILITIES (CONTINUED)

Series 2021 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds Area 3 - Public Offering

In October 2021, the District issued \$7,150,000 of Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Series 2021, consisting of \$590,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2026 with an interest rate of 2.5%, \$850,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2031 with an interest rate of 3.15%, \$2,170,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2041 with an interest rate of 3.45% and \$3,540,000 Term Bonds due May 1, 2052 with an interest rate of 4%. The Bonds were issued to finance the acquisition and construction of certain improvements for the benefit of the property within the District. Interest is paid semiannually on each May 1 and November 1. Principal on the Series 2021 Bonds is due serially commencing on May 1, 2023 through May 1, 2052.

The Series 2021 Bonds are subject to redemption at the option of the District prior to maturity at a redemption price as set forth in the Bond Indenture. The Bonds are subject to extraordinary mandatory redemption prior to maturity in the manner determined by the Bond Indenture.

The Bond Indenture requires that the District maintain adequate funds in a reserve account to meet the debt service reserve requirements as defined in the Indenture. At September 30, 2022 the reserve requirement was met.

The Bond Indenture has certain restrictions and requirements relating principally to the use of proceeds to pay for the infrastructure improvements and the procedures to be followed by the District on assessments to property owners. The District agreed to levy special assessments in annual amounts adequate to provide payment of debt service. Payment of principal and interest on the 2021 Bonds is secured by a pledge of and a first lien upon the pledged special assessment revenue.

As of September 30, 2022, total principal and interest remaining on the Series 2021 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds was \$12,064,961. Principal and interest paid was \$136,161 and there was no special assessment revenue pledged.

NOTE 6 DEVELOPER TRANSACTIONS

The Developer owns a portion of land within the District; therefore assessment revenue in the general and debt service funds include assessments levied on those lots owned by the Developer. The Developer paid \$2,089,838 for the year ended September 30, 2022 which is 80% of the assessment revenue. Additionally, the Developer contributed \$79,922 for general operations, and \$1,751,624 for capital projects.

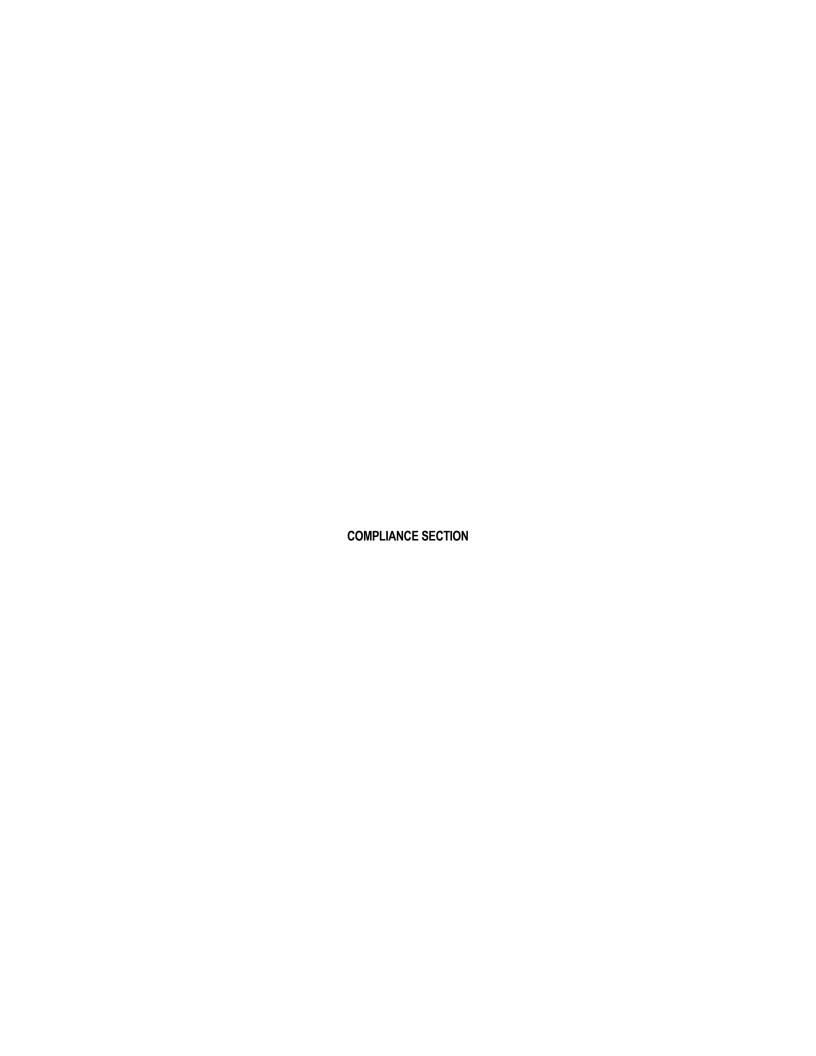
The District's activity is dependent upon the continued involvement of the Developer, the loss of which could have a material adverse effect on the District's operations.

NOTE 7 MANAGEMENT COMPANY

The District has contracted with a management company to perform management services, which include financial and accounting services. Certain employees of the management company also serve as officers (Board appointed non-voting positions) of the District. Under the agreements, the District compensates the management company for management, accounting, financial reporting and other administrative costs.

NOTE 8 RISK MANAGEMENT

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; and natural disasters. These risks are covered by commercial insurance from independent third parties. The District has not filed any claims under this commercial coverage during the last three years.

Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the District's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit, we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Report on Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the District's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the District's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of the *Summer Woods Community Development District*, (the "District") as of and for the fiscal year September 30, 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated June 20, 2023.

Auditor's Responsibility

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States and Chapter 10.550, Rules of the Auditor General.

Other Reporting Requirements

We have issued our Independent Auditor's Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* and Independent Auditor's Report on an examination conducted in accordance with *AICPA Professional Standards*, AT-C Section 315, regarding compliance requirements in accordance with Chapter 10.550, Rules of the Auditor General. Disclosures in those reports, which are dated June 20, 2023, should be considered in conjunction with this management letter.

Prior Audit Findings

Section 10.554(1)(i.)1., Rules of the Auditor General, requires that we determine whether or not corrective actions have been taken to address findings and recommendations made in the preceding annual financial audit report. There were no findings or recommendations made in the preceding annual financial audit report.

Official Title and Legal Authority

Section 10.554(1)(i)4., Rules of the Auditor General, requires that the name or official title and legal authority for the primary government and each component unit of the reporting entity be disclosed in this management letter, unless disclosed in the notes to the financial statements. This information has been disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

Financial Condition and Management

Section 10.554(1)(i)5.a. and 10.556(7), Rules of the Auditor General, require us to apply appropriate procedures and communicate the results of our determination as to whether or not the District has met one or more of the conditions described in Section 218.503(1), Florida Statutes, and to identify the specific condition(s) met. In connection with our audit, we determined that the District did not meet any of the conditions described in Section 218.503(1), Florida Statutes.

Pursuant to Sections 10.554(1)(i)5.b. and 10.556(8), Rules of the Auditor General, we applied financial condition assessment procedures for the District. It is management's responsibility to monitor the District's financial condition, and our financial condition assessment was based in part on representations made by management and the review of financial information provided by same.

Section 10.554(1)(i)2., Rules of the Auditor General, requires that we communicate any recommendations to improve financial management. In connection with our audit, we did not have any such recommendations.

Specific Information (Unaudited)

As required by Section 218.39(3)(c), Florida Statutes, and Section 10.554(1)(i)6, Rules of the Auditor General, the District reported:

- a. The total number of District employees compensated in the last pay period of the District's fiscal year as zero.
- b. The total number of independent contractors to whom nonemployee compensation was paid in the last month of the District's fiscal year as 1.
- c. All compensation earned by or awarded to employees, whether paid or accrued, regardless of contingency as zero.
- d. All compensation earned by or awarded to nonemployee independent contractors, whether paid or accrued, regardless of contingency as \$21,613.

- e. Each construction project with a total cost of at least \$65,000 approved by the District that is scheduled to begin on or after October 1 of the fiscal year being reported, together with the total expenditures for such project as none.
- f. A budget variance based on the budget adopted under Section 189.016(4), Florida Statutes, before the beginning of the fiscal year being reported if the District amends a final budget under Section 189.016(6), Florida Statutes, as disclosed in the financial statements.

As required by Section 218.39(3)(c), Florida Statutes, and Section 10.554(1)(i)7, Rules of the Auditor General, the district reported:

- a. The rate or rates of non-ad valorem special assessments imposed by the district as O&M- \$1,207; \$1,508.75; Debt Service- \$1,181; \$1,073.38; \$1,289.
- b. The total amount of special assessments collected by or on behalf of the District as \$2,360,246.
- c. The total amount of outstanding bonds issued by the District and the terms of such bonds as disclosed in the notes.

Additional Matters

Section 10.554(1)(i)3., Rules of the Auditor General, requires us to communicate noncompliance with provisions of contracts or grant agreements, or abuse, that have occurred, or are likely to have occurred, that have an effect on the financial statements that is less than material but which warrants the attention of those charged with governance. In connection with our audit, we did not note any such findings.

Purpose of this Letter

Our management letter is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Auditing Committee, members of the Florida Senate and the Florida House of Representatives, the Florida Auditor General, Federal and other granting agencies, the Board of Supervisors, and applicable management, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

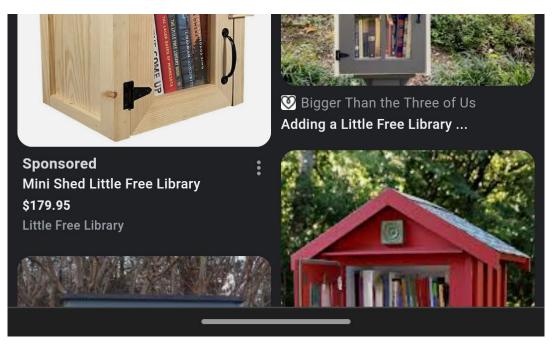

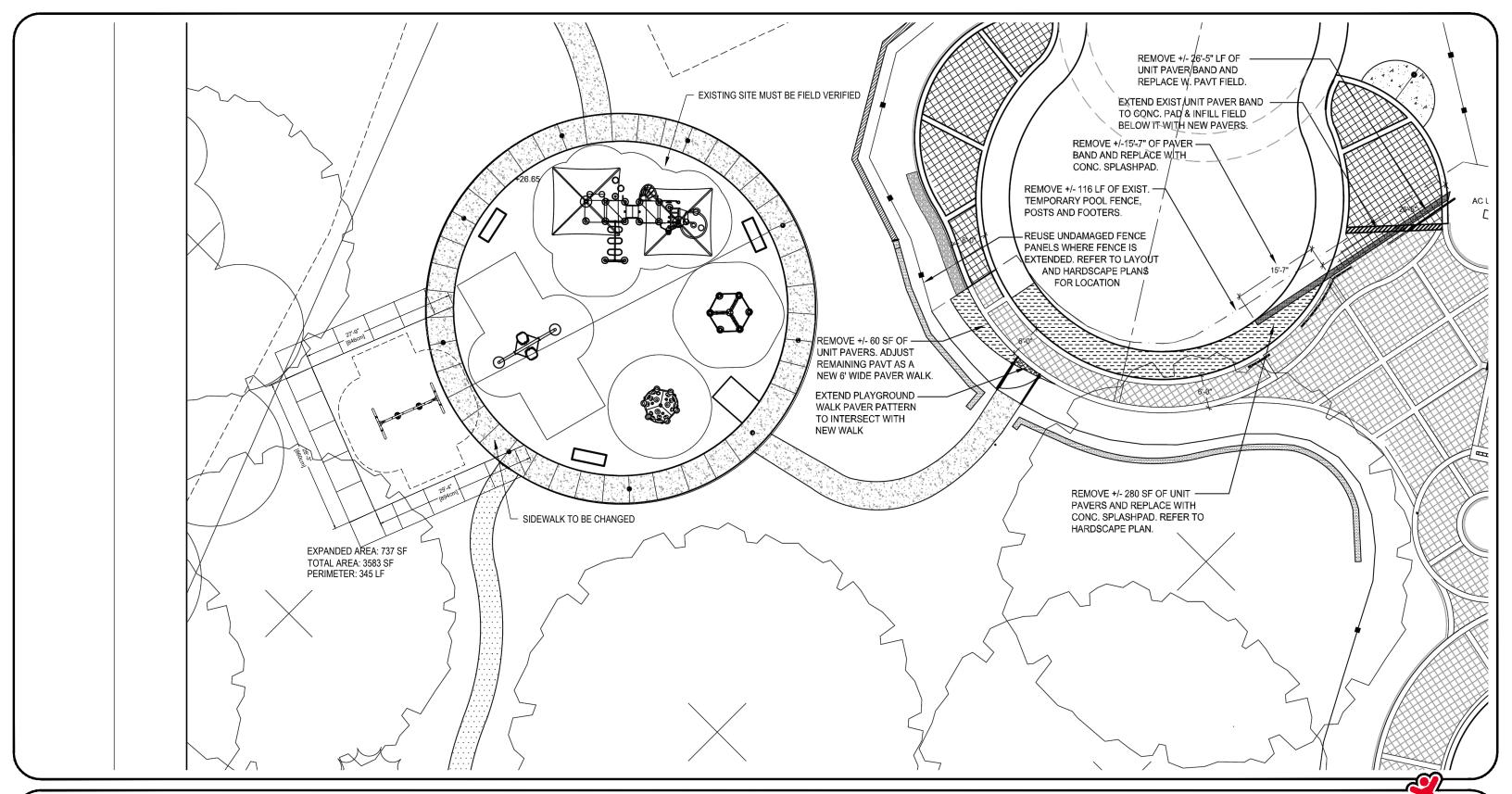

WHEREAS, the Summer Woods Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes for the purposes of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

PART 1: Summer Woods Community Development District Amenity Operating Rules

Law Implemented: ss. 190.011	., 190.035, Fla. Stat. (2020)
Effective Date:	, 2021

In accordance with Chapters 190 and 120, Florida Statutes, and at a duly noticed public meeting and after a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the Summer Woods Community Development District adopted the following rules to govern the operation of the District's Amenities. All prior rules of the District governing this subject matter are hereby superseded on a going forward basis.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply to these rules in their entirety:

"Amenities" – shall mean the properties and areas owned by the District and intended for recreational use and shall include, but not specifically be limited to, the District's and swimming pool, together with their appurtenant areas, facilities, equipment, and any other appurtenances.

"Amenities Rules" or "Rules" – shall mean all rules of the District, as amended from time to time, governing the use of the amenities, including but not limited to these "Amenity Operating Rules," the "Rule for Amenities Rates," and the "Disciplinary and Enforcement Rule."

"Annual User Fee" – shall mean the base fee established by the District for the non-exclusive right to use the Amenities. The amount of the Annual User Fee is set forth in the District's Rule for Amenities Rates.

"Board of Supervisors" or "Board" – shall mean the Board of Supervisors of the District.

"District" – shall mean the Summer Woods Community Development District.

"District Manager" – shall mean the professional management company with which the District has contracted to provide management services to the District (i.e., Rizzetta & Company).

"Family" – shall mean a group of individuals living under one roof or head of household. This can consist of individuals who have not yet attained the legal age of

majority (i.e., 18 or as otherwise provided by law), together with their parents or legal guardians. This does not include visiting relatives, or extended family not residing in the home.

"Guest" – shall mean any person, other than a Patron, who is expressly authorized by the District to use the Amenities, or invited and accompanied for the day by a Patron to use the Amenities.

"Non-Resident" – shall mean any person that does not own property within the District.

"Non-Resident Patron" – shall mean any person or Family not owning property in the District who is paying the Annual User Fee to the District, and who is therefore a Patron for purposes of these Rules.

"Patron" or "Patrons" – shall mean Residents, Non-Resident Patrons, and Renters.

"Renter" – shall mean any tenant residing in a Resident's home pursuant to a valid rental or lease agreement.

"Resident" – shall mean any person or Family owning property within the District.

AUTHORIZED USERS

Generally. Only Patrons and Guests, as set forth herein, have the right to use the Amenities.

Residents. A Resident must pay the Annual User Fee applicable to Residents in order to have the right to use the Amenities. Such payment must be made in accordance with the District's annual assessment collection resolution and typically will be included on the Resident's property tax bill. Payment of the Annual User Fee entitles the Resident to use the Amenities for one full fiscal year of the District, which year begins October 1 and ends September 30.

Non-Residents. A Non-Resident Patron must pay the Annual User Fee applicable to Non-Residents in order to have the right to use the Amenities for one full year, which year begins from the date of receipt of payment by the District. This fee must be paid in full before the Non-Resident may use the Amenities. Each subsequent Annual User Fee shall be paid in full on the anniversary date of application.

Renter's Privileges. Residents who rent or lease residential unit(s) in the District shall have the right to designate the Renter of the residential unit(s) as the beneficial users of the Resident's privileges to use the Amenities.

- 1. A Renter who is designated as the beneficial user of the Resident's rights to use the Amenities shall be entitled to the same rights and privileges to use the Amenities as the Resident.
- 2. During the period when a Renter is designated as the beneficial user, the Resident shall not be entitled to use the Amenities.
- 3. Residents shall be responsible for all charges incurred by their Renters which remain unpaid after the customary billing and collection procedure established by the District. Resident owners are responsible for the deportment of their respective Renter.
- 4. Renters shall be subject to all rules, including but not limited to the Rules, as the Board may adopt from time to time.

Guests. Except as otherwise provided for herein, each Patron may bring a maximum of four Guests to the Amenities, provided however that Guests must be accompanied by the Patron when using the Amenities and provided however that the Patron will be responsible for any harm caused by the Patron's Guests while using the Amenities. For clarification purposes, the preceding sentence shall be construed to place a four Guest limitation on the total number of Guests that a Patron may bring on behalf of that Patron's particular residence or household – e.g., a Patron Family consisting of four people cannot bring up to four Guests each for a total of sixteen Guests, but instead can only bring a total of four Guests on behalf of the entire household. The District may also in its discretion invite Guests as part of any community programming activities. Applicable fees may apply. Guests shall be subject to all rules, including but not limited to the Rules, as the Board may adopt from time to time.

Registration / Disclaimer. In order to use the Amenities, each Patron, all members of a Patron's Family, and all Guests shall register with the District by executing a Consent and Waiver Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, along with any other paperwork that may be required by the District Manager.

ACCESS KEY FOBS

Every home is entitled to two Access Fobs, free of charge following closing of a new construction home. If a Resident leases a home, only the lessee shall be entitled to exercise the privileges of a Resident. Additional Fobs are \$50 each. The maximum number of Access Key Fobs per household is limited to four (4). Resale buyers are required to purchase new Access Key Fobs if not passed on from seller. All resale buyers must reregister the old Access Key Fobs. Buyer is required to register with the District Manager to ensure fobs are transferred to new owners.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

All Patrons and Guests using the Amenities are expected to conduct themselves in a responsible, courteous and safe manner, in compliance with all Rules of the District.

ALL PERSONS USING THE AMENITIES DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK AND AGREE TO ABIDE BY THE DISTRICT'S RULES AND POLICIES AS MAY BE ADOPTED AND/OR AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME. AS SET FORTH MORE FULLY LATER HEREIN, THE DISTRICT SHALL ASSUME NO RESPONSIBILITY AND SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY ACCIDENTS, PERSONAL INJURY, OR DAMAGE TO, OR LOSS OF PROPERTY ARISING FROM, THE USE OF THE AMENITIES OR FROM THE ACTS, OMISSIONS OR NEGLIGENCE OF OTHER PERSONS USING THE AMENITIES.

THE DISTRICT DOES NOT PROVIDE ANY SUPERVISION WITH RESPECT TO THE USE OF THE AMENITIES, AND THERE ARE INHERENT RISKS IN THE USE OF THE AMENITIES – E.G., THE USE OF THE POOL, ETC. CAN RESULT IN SERIOUS BODILY INJURY OR EVEN DEATH. PATRONS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR ACTIONS AND THOSE OF THEIR GUESTS. PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR MINOR CHILDREN WHO USE THE AMENITIES. THE DISTRICT STRONGLY ENCOURAGES PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS TO ACCOMPANY AND SUPERVISE THEIR MINOR CHILDREN WHILE AT THE AMENITIES.

Emergencies: After contacting 911 if required, all emergencies and injuries must be reported to the office of the District Manager at 813-533-2950.

Hours of Operation. All hours of operation of the Amenities will be established and published by the District. The Amenities will be closed on the following holidays: Easter, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. The District may restrict access or close some or all of the Amenities for purposes of providing a community activity, for making improvements, for conducting maintenance, or other purposes. Any programs or activities of the District may have priority over other users of the Amenities.

Except as otherwise expressly stated herein, the following additional guidelines govern the use of all of the Amenities:

- 1. *Guests.* Guests must be accompanied by a Patron while using the Amenities.
- 2. Minors. Because the Amenities are not supervised, and for safety reasons, minors age 10 or younger must be accompanied by a responsible adult when using the Amenities. As noted above, parents and legal guardians are responsible for their minor children who use the Amenities, and the District strongly encourages parents and legal guardians to accompany and supervise their minor children while at the Amenities.

- 3. **Attire.** With the exception of the pool and wet areas where bathing suits are permitted, Patrons and Guests must be properly attired with shirts and shoes to use the Amenities. Bathing suits and wet feet are not allowed indoors with the exception of the locker room areas.
- 4. Food and Drink. Food and drink will be limited to designated areas only.
- 5. **Alcohol.** Alcoholic beverages shall not be served or sold, nor permitted to be consumed on the premises of the Amenities.
- 6. No Smoking. Except in designated areas, smoking (including e-cigarettes) is not permitted in any building, or enclosed or fenced area to the maximum extent of the prohibitions set forth in the Florida Clean Indoor Air Act or other subsequent legislation. All waste must be disposed of in the appropriate receptacles. No employee or contractor of the District shall smoke in any building, or enclosed or fenced area of the Amenities. Any violation of this policy shall be reported to the District Manager.
- 7. **Pets.** With the exception of service animals, pets are only permitted in designated areas, and they are not permitted indoors. Where service animals are permitted on the grounds, they must be leashed. Patrons are responsible for picking up after all pets as a courtesy to others and in accordance with the law.
- 8. **Vehicles.** Vehicles must be parked in designated areas. Vehicles should not be parked on grass lawns, or in any way which blocks the normal flow of traffic. Golf carts, off-road bikes/vehicles (including ATV's), and motorized scooters are prohibited on all property owned, maintained, and operated by the District or at any of the Amenities within District unless they are owned by the District.
- 9. **Skateboards, Etc.** Bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, hover boards and other similar uses are limited to designated outdoor areas only.
- 10. *Fireworks.* Fireworks of any kind are not permitted anywhere on the Amenities or adjacent areas.
- 11. **Service Areas.** Only District employees and staff are allowed in the service areas of the Amenities.
- 12. *Courtesy.* Patrons and their Guests shall treat all staff members and other Patrons and Guests with courtesy and respect.
- 13. *Profanity.* Loud, profane or abusive language is prohibited.
- 14. Horseplay. Disorderly conduct and horseplay are prohibited.
- 15. **Equipment.** All equipment and supplies provided for use of the Amenities must be returned in good condition after use. Patrons are encouraged to let the staff know if an area of the Amenities or a piece of equipment is in need of cleaning or maintenance.
- 16. *Littering.* Patrons are responsible for cleaning up after themselves and helping to keep the Amenities clean at all times.
- 17. **Solicitation and Advertising.** Commercial advertisements shall not be posted or circulated in the Amenities. Petitions, posters or promotional material shall not be originated, solicited, circulated or posted on Amenities property unless approved in writing by the District.

- 18. *Firearms*. Firearms are not permitted in any of the Amenities or on any District property in each case to the extent such prohibitions are permitted under Florida law. Among other prohibitions, no firearms may be carried to any meeting of the District's Board of Supervisors.
- 19. *Trespassing / Loitering.* There is no trespassing or loitering allowed at the Amenities. Any individual violating this policy may be reported to the local authorities.
- 20. **Compliance with Laws.** All Patrons and Guests shall abide by and comply with any and all federal, state and local laws and ordinances, as well as any District rules and Rules, while present at or utilizing the Amenities, and shall ensure that any minor for whom they are responsible also complies with the same.
- 21. **Surveillance.** Various areas of all Amenities are under twenty-four (24) hour video surveillance.
- 22. *Lost Property.* The District is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Staff members are not permitted to hold valuables or bags for Patrons or Guests. All found items should be turned in to the District Manager for storage in the lost and found. Items will be stored in the lost and found for up to one month.

SWIMMING POOL

The following Rules apply to the District's pool:

- 1. **Swim at Your Own Risk.** The pool areas are not supervised, and so all Patrons use the pool at their own risk.
- 2. *Operating Hours.* The pool areas are open from dawn to dusk only. No one is permitted in the pool at any other time unless a specific event is scheduled.
- 3. **Skateboards, Etc.** No bicycles, scooters, roller skates, roller blades, hover boards, skate boards or other similar items are permitted on the pool deck.
- 4. **Food and Drink.** Patrons are permitted to bring their own snacks and water to the pool; however, no food or beverages are permitted in the pool or the pool wet deck area, as defined by Florida law. Glass containers or breakable objects of any kind are not permitted.
- 5. *Unsafe Behavior.* No pushing, running, horseplay or other similarly unsafe behavior is allowed in the pool or on the pool deck area.
- 6. **Diving.** Diving is strictly prohibited at the pool.
- 7. **Noise.** Radios, tape players, CD players, MP3 players and televisions, and the like are not permitted unless they are personal units equipped with headphones.
- 8. **Aquatic Toys and Recreational Equipment.** Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, rafts, inner tubes, scuba gear, squirt guns, swim fins, balls, frisbees, inflatable objects, or other similar water play items. Exceptions are small personal floatation devices for swimming assistance, kickboards, masks, goggles, pool noodles, dive sticks, snorkels and water wings.
- 9. *Entrances.* Pool entrances, including stairs and ladders, must be kept clear at all times.

- 10. Railings. No swinging on ladders, fences, or railings is allowed.
- 11. **Pool Furniture.** Pool furniture is not to be removed from the pool area or placed in the pool.
- 12. *Chemicals.* Chemicals used in the pool may affect certain hair or fabric colors. The District is not responsible for these effects.
- 13. **Pets.** Pets, (with the exception of service animals), are not permitted on the pool deck area inside the pool gates at any time.
- 14. Attire. Appropriate swimming attire (swimsuits) must be worn at all times.
- 15. *Parties.* Parties at the pool are prohibited, and participants may be asked to leave by the District Manager.
- 16. **Prevention of Disease.** All swimmers must shower before initially entering the pool. Persons with open cuts, wounds, sores or blisters may not use the pool. No person should use the pool with or suspected of having a communicable disease which could be transmitted through the use of the pool.
- 17. **Swim Diapers.** All persons who are not reliably toilet trained must wear swim diapers and a swimsuit over the swim diaper. If contamination occurs, the pool will be closed for twenty four (24) hours and the water will be shocked with chlorine to kill the bacteria. Any individual responsible for contamination of the pool may be held responsible for any clean-up or decontamination expenses incurred by the District.
- 18. **Pollution.** No one shall pollute the pool. Anyone who does pollute the pool is liable for any costs incurred in treating and reopening the pool.
- 19. *Lap Lanes.* Lap lanes are to be used only by persons swimming laps or water walking or jogging.
- 20. Reservation of Tables or Chairs. Tables or chairs on the deck area may not be reserved by placing towels or personal belongings on them, except for up to thirty minutes.
- 21. **Pool Closure.** The pool may close due to weather warnings, fecal accidents, chemical balancing, or general maintenance and repairs.
- 22. **Weather.** The pool and pool area will be closed during electrical storms or when rain makes it difficult to see any part of the pool or pool bottom clearly. The pool will be closed at the first sound of thunder or sighting of lightning and will remain closed for thirty 30 minutes after the last sighting. Everyone must leave the pool deck immediately upon hearing thunder or sighting lightning.
- 23. **Swim Instruction.** Except as expressly authorized by the District, swim instruction for fees, or solicitation of swim instruction for fees, is prohibited.
- 24. **ADA Compliant Chair Lift.** The chair lift(s) in the pool area are provided pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act. They are to be used only to facilitate usage of the pool by disabled individuals. Any use of the chair lift for other than its intended purpose is strictly prohibited.

LAKE OR POND AREAS

The lakes and ponds throughout the community are not designed for swimming or boating. However, Patrons and their Guests may use the ponds for fishing as set forth herein. (NOTE: Only Patrons and their Guests are authorized to use the ponds for fishing, and any access by non-Patrons is prohibited.) We ask that you respect your fellow landowners and access the ponds through the proper access points. The District has a catch and release policy for all fish caught in the ponds. The ponds are not intended for anything but catch and release, as they are mostly retention ponds and man-made lakes. The purpose of the ponds is to help facilitate the District's natural water system for run off and overflow. The ponds are not to State code for keeping your catch so please protect yourself and the fish population and return them to the water.

The following additional guidelines apply:

- 1. Please be respectful of the privacy of the residents living near the ponds.
- 2. Pets must be accompanied and in their owners control at all times around ponds.
- 3. Parking along the county right of way or on any grassed area near the ponds is prohibited. It is recommended that Patrons wishing to fish walk or ride bicycles to the ponds.
- 4. Do not leave fishing poles, lines, equipment or bait unattended.
- 5. Do not leave any litter. Fishing line is hazardous to wildlife.
- 6. Do not feed the wildlife anything, ever.
- 7. Fish caught from the lakes may not be edible since the lakes are designed to detain pollutants. Catch and release is required.
- 8. Swimming is prohibited in all ponds on District property.
- 9. No watercrafts of any kind are allowed in any of the ponds on District property.
- 10. Licensing requirements from other governmental agencies may apply. Check the regulations.
- 11. Fishing is permitted by poles only. No cast nets are permitted.

PLAYGROUND AND TOT LOTS

The community provides several tot lots and playground areas for Patrons and Guests to enjoy with their children. The following guidelines apply:

- 1. **Footwear.** Proper footwear is required and no loose clothing especially with strings should be worn.
- 2. **Mulch.** The mulch material is necessary for reducing fall impact and for good drainage. It is not to be picked up, thrown, or kicked for any reason.
- 3. **Food & Drinks.** No food, drinks or gum are permitted at the playground.
- 4. **Animals.** No pets of any kind are permitted at the playground, with the exception of service animals.
- 5. **Glass Containers.** No glass containers are permitted at the playground.
- 6. **No Jumping.** No jumping off from any climbing bar or platform.

- 7. *Disruptive Behavior.* Profanity, rough-housing, and disruptive behavior are prohibited.
- 8. **Equipment.** If anything is wrong with the equipment or someone gets hurt, notify the District immediately.

PROPERTY DAMAGE

Each Patron shall be liable for any property damage at the Amenities caused by him or her, his or her Guests, or members of his or her Family. The District reserves the right to pursue any and all legal and equitable measures necessary to remedy any losses due to property damage.

Each Patron and Guest, as a condition of invitation to the premises of the Amenities, assumes sole responsibility for his or her property. The District shall not be responsible for the loss or damage to any private property used or stored on the premises of the Amenities, whether in lockers or elsewhere.

USE AT OWN RISK; INDEMNIFICATION

ANY PATRON, GUEST, OR OTHER PERSON WHO PARTICIPATES IN THE ACTIVITIES (AS DEFINED BELOW), SHALL DO SO AT HIS OR HER OWN RISK, AND SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, RELEASE, HOLD HARMLESS, AND FOREVER DISCHARGE THE DISTRICT AND ITS CONTRACTORS, AND THE PRESENT, FORMER, AND FUTURE SUPERVISORS, STAFF, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, AGENTS, AND CONTRACTORS OF EACH (TOGETHER, "INDEMNITEES"), FOR ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, CLAIMS, LAWSUITS, ACTIONS, SUITS OR DEMANDS, WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, IN LAW OR EQUITY, BY ANY INDIVIDUAL OF ANY AGE, OR ANY CORPORATION OR OTHER ENTITY, FOR ANY AND ALL LOSS, INJURY, DAMAGE, THEFT, REAL OR PERSONAL PROPERTY DAMAGE, EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY'S FEES, COSTS AND OTHER EXPENSES FOR INVESTIGATION AND DEFENSE AND IN CONNECTION WITH, AMONG OTHER PROCEEDINGS, ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION, TRIAL COURT, AND APPELLATE PROCEEDINGS), AND HARM OF ANY KIND OR NATURE ARISING OUT OF, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, THE PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES, BY SAID PATRON, GUEST, OR OTHER PERSON, AND ANY OF HIS OR HER GUESTS AND ANY MEMBERS OF HIS OR HER FAMILY.

SHOULD ANY PATRON, GUEST, OR OTHER PERSON, BRING SUIT AGAINST THE INDEMNITEES IN CONNECTION WITH THE ACTIVITIES OR RELATING IN ANY WAY TO THE AMENITIES, AND FAIL TO OBTAIN JUDGMENT THEREIN AGAINST THE INDEMNITEES, SAID PATRON, GUEST, OR OTHER PERSON SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE DISTRICT FOR ALL ATTORNEY'S FEES, COSTS, AND OTHER EXPENSES FOR INVESTIGATION AND DEFENSE AND IN CONNECTION WITH, AMONG OTHER PROCEEDINGS, ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION, TRIAL COURT, AND APPELLATE PROCEEDINGS. THE WAIVER OF LIABILITY

CONTAINED HEREIN DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY ACT OF INTENTIONAL, WILLFUL OR WANTON MISCONDUCT BY THE INDEMNITEES.

FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, THE TERM "ACTIVITIES," SHALL MEAN THE USE OF OR ACCEPTANCE OF THE USE OF THE AMENITIES, OR ENGAGEMENT IN ANY CONTEST, GAME, FUNCTION, EXERCISE, COMPETITION, SPORT, EVENT, OR OTHER ACTIVITY OPERATED, ORGANIZED, ARRANGED OR SPONSORED BY THE DISTRICT, ITS CONTRACTORS OR THIRD PARTIES AUTHORIZED BY THE DISTRICT.

SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

Nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the Districts' limitations on liability contained in Section 768.28, F.S., or other statutes or law.

SEVERABILITY

The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of these Rules shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions, or any part of the Rules not held to be invalid or unenforceable.

AMENDMENTS / WAIVERS

The Board in its sole discretion may amend these Rules from time to time. The Board may also elect in its sole discretion at any time to grant waivers to any of the provisions of these Rules.

SUMMER WOODS CDD - CONSENT AND WAIVER AGREEMENT

The Summer Woods Community Development District ("District") owns and operates certain amenities, including a pool, and other facilities, and may from time to time offer certain amenity programs, to the District's patrons. I further acknowledge and agree that I shall be bound at all times by the terms and conditions of the policies, rules and regulations of the District, as currently in effect and as may be amended from time to time. I have read and understand the terms of this Consent and Waiver Agreement and have willingly signed below as my own free act, being both of lawful age and legally competent to do so. Nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, Florida Statutes or other statute or law. If any part of this waiver is determined to be invalid by law, all other parts of this waiver shall remain valid and enforceable.

All prior rules of the District governing this subject matter are hereby superseded on a going forward basis.

- 1. **Introduction.** This rule addresses various rates, fees and charges associated with the Amenities.
- 2. **Definitions.** All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Amenity Operating Rules of Summer Woods Community Development District, as amended from time to time.
- 3. **Annual User Fee.** For Non-Resident Patrons, the Annual User Fee is equal to the average annual operation and maintenance assessment and debt assessment as established by the District in connection with the adoption of the District's annual fiscal year budgets. For Residents, the Annual User Fee is paid when the Resident makes payment for the Resident's annual operation and maintenance assessment, and debt service assessment, for the property owned by the Resident.
- 4. **Prior Rules:** The District's prior rules setting amenities rates are hereby rescinded. The District's Amenities Rules, as may be amended from time to time, govern all use of the Amenities.
- 5. **Severability**. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this rule shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this rule, or any part of this rule not held to be invalid or unenforceable.

PART 3: Summer Woods Community Development District Disciplinary and Enforcement Rule

In accordance with Chapters 190 and 120, Florida Statutes, and at a duly noticed public meeting and after a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the Summer Woods Community Development District adopted the following rules to govern disciplinary and enforcement matters. All prior rules of the District governing this subject matter are hereby superseded on a going forward basis.

- 1. **Introduction.** This rule addresses disciplinary and enforcement matters relating to the use of the amenities and other properties owned and managed by the District. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein have the definitions ascribed to them in the District's Amenity Operating Rules.
- 2. **General Rule.** All persons using the Amenities and entering District properties are responsible for compliance with, and shall comply with, the Amenities Rules established for the safe operations of the District's Amenities.
- 3. **Suspension of Rights.** The District, through its Board, and District Manager, shall have the right to restrict, suspend, or terminate the Amenities privileges of any person to use the Amenities for any of the following behavior:
 - a. Submits false information on any application for use of the Amenities;
 - b. Exhibits unsatisfactory behavior, deportment or appearance;
 - c. Fails to pay amounts owed to the District in a proper and timely manner;
 - d. Fails to abide by any District rules and policies;
 - e. Treats the District's supervisors, staff, amenities management, contractors, or other representatives, or other residents or guests, in an unreasonable or abusive manner;
 - f. Damages or destroys District property; or
 - g. Engages in conduct that is improper or likely to endanger the health, safety, or welfare of the District, or its supervisors, staff, amenities management, contractors, or other representatives, or other residents or Guests.
- 4. **Authority of District Manager.** The District Manager may at any time restrict, suspend or terminate for cause or causes, including but not limited to those

described above, any person's (and his/her family's) privileges to use any or all of the District Amenities for a period to be established by the District Manager. Any such person will have the right to appeal the imposition of the restriction, suspension or termination before the Board of Supervisors.

- 5. **Enforcement of Penalties/Fines.** For any of the reasons set forth in Section 3 above, the District shall additionally have the right to impose a fine of up to the amount of \$1,000 in addition to any amounts for damages and collect such fine, damages and attorney's fees as a contractual lien or as otherwise provided pursuant to Florida law.
- 6. **Legal Action; Criminal Prosecution.** If any person is found to have committed any of the infractions noted in Section 3 above, such person may additionally be subject to arrest for trespassing or other applicable legal action, civil or criminal in nature.
- 7. **Severability.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this rule shall be held to be invalid or ineffective for any reason, the remainder of this rule shall continue in full force and effect, it being expressly hereby found and declared that the remainder of this rule would have been adopted despite the invalidity or ineffectiveness of such section, paragraph, clause or provision.

I understand that the District is not responsible for personal property lost or stolen while participating in these activities.
- Insurance: Further I understand that District does not assume any responsibility for
 or obligation to provide me with financial or other assistance, including but not

- 3. **Medical Treatment:** I hereby release and forever discharge the District from any claim whatsoever which arises or may hereafter arise on account of any first-aid treatment or other medical services rendered in connection with an emergency during my tenure as a volunteer with District.

- 4. **Rules:** I further acknowledge and agree that I shall be bound at all times by the terms and conditions of the policies, rules and regulations of the District, as currently in effect and as may be amended from time to time.
- 5. Other. This Release shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida, and is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of Florida. I agree that if any portion of this Release is deemed invalid, that the remainder will remain in full force and effect. Nothing in this Release shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, Florida Statutes or other statute or law.
