General Updates, Recent & Upcoming Maintenance Events

- □ Nitrogen ban is lifted October 1st. What is the fertilizer schedule for the rest of 2025?
- ☐ Dry areas starting to show now the rainy season has ended.

The following are action items for Red Tree to complete. Please refer to the item # in your response listing action already taken or anticipated time of completion. Red text indicates deficient from previous report. Bold Red text indicates deficient for more than a month. Green text indicates a proposal has been requested. Blue indicates irrigation. Bold & Underlined question or info for BOS. Orange is for Staff.

- Noting many Blue Daze have been failing for months now and may want to enhance with a different species moving forward.
- There is a downed Pine Tree that needs to be removed on the East ROW of Mosaic just South of Fishhawk Blvd. (Pic. 2)



- Treat crack weeds in the pavers in front of the annuals on Mosaic at the Fishhawk Blvd. intersection.
- Noting Red Tree lifting tree canopies during this inspection. Ensure Oaks along the sidewalk on Circa Crossing heading to Sagewood are completed.
- 5. Treat joint crack weeds in the sidewalk on Circa Crossing heading into Sagewood.
- 6. Treat weeds in the Jasmine on the exit of Sagewood at the guard gate.,

- 7. Prune dead hanging fronds in the Ribbon Palms in the divider median on Circa Crossing before entering Sagewood.
- Noting weeds and detail work look much better throughout the CDD. Do need to treat the weeds on the North ROW of Circa Crossing between Sagewood entrance and Mosaic. (Pic. 8)



- There are a couple dead Indian Hawthorn, Juniper, and Loropetalum that should be removed in the medians of Mosaic between Circa Crossing and Boyette Rd.
- 10. Remove any dead shrubs that did not establish in the roundabout median of Mosaic and Barrington Stowers.
- 11. Diagnose and treat declining Viburnum along the aluminum fence on Boyette Rd. ROW.

- 12. Continue to mow and weedeat closer to Lake Hutto now that the rainy season has ended.
- 13. Check retention pond in Encore to mow the bottom now the rainy season has ended.
- 14. Red Tree did a great job treating and cleaning up the trees across the street from Sparrowhead Way. Need to try and remove dead vines, if possible, in the Magnolia. (Pic. 14)



- 15. There are a couple areas of turf that appear to be dry on Watercolor Dr. ROW between Boyette Rd. and Village Center Dr. Ensure irrigation has proper coverage.
- 16. Treat broadleaf turf weeds in the Zoysia on Sparrowhead Way median and ROWs.
- 17. Remove dead fronds in the Pygmy Date Palms in the median island at guard gate of Sparrowhead Way.
- 18. Check irrigation is working properly for Zoysia on Sparrowhead Way medians and ROWs. (Pic. 18>)
- 19. Diagnose and possible treat declining Zoysia where fungus may be present on Sparrowhead East ROW.
- 20. Treat weeds entrance side of Sparrowhead Way in the Liriope near the guard gate.

- 21. Check irrigation is working properly including coverage and time for dry area on the corner of Watercolor Dr. and village Center Dr.
- 22. There is a leaning Oak on the Southeast corner of Village Center Dr. and Watercolor Dr. that needs straightened or removed. Asking Red Tree arborist to investigate and provide a proposal for action plan.

23. Diagnose and treat turf on Natures Reserve Dr. ROW at Encore entrance. (Pic. 23)



- 24. Red Tree to have arborist investigate two Red Maples that appear to be in decline on the East ROW of VCD. One just North and one just South of Natures Reserve Dr. intersection.
- 25. Diagnose and treat declining turf on VCD just North of Boyette Rd. by speed limit sign.





Village Center Dr. and Parks off Watercolor Dr.

- 26. Schedule pruning event for the Ribbon Palms in the median island of Natures Reserve Dr. on Eastside of VCD intersection.
- 27. There are 2 snapped Pine Trees on CDD property next to 14215 Natures Reserve Dr. I believe this was approved. When will it be scheduled?
- 28. Diagnose and treat declining turf on Iron Horse Dr. across the street from Quintessa Ln. (Pic. 28)



- 29. Diagnose and treat declining turf on the exit corner of Natures Reserve Dr. and VCD.
- 30. Remove Spanish Moss and Ball Moss in the Bald Cypress on Natures Reserve Dr. and Village Center Dr. intersection. (Pic. 30)



31. Remove some vines growing up the trunk of tree on S.E. corner of Watercolor and VCD.

- 32. Diagnose and treat declining turf in medians on VCD between Querry Lake Dr. and Barrington Stowers Dr. Is irrigation working properly here as well?
- 33. Remove palm volunteers under the Crepe Myrtle in the bed on the corner intersection of Village Center Dr. and Quarry Lake Rd. (Pic. 33)



34. Diagnose and treat declining Plumbago on VCD between Slate Rock Way and Barrington Stowers. (Pic. 34)



- 35. Diagnose and treat declining turf on VCD East ROW from Slate Rock Way to Circa Fishhawk Blvd. Is irrigation working properly here as well?
- 36. Treat broadleaf turf weeds in medians on Village Center Dr. between Barrington Stowers and Circa Fishhawk Blvd.



Parks off Watercolor Dr. and Shell Ridge

- 37. Check irrigation is working properly at the park on Chert Hill Dr.
- 38. When will the trees be removed at the parks of Chert Hill Dr. and Parkside Ridge that have been approved?
- 39. Remove Jasmine growing up in Crepe Myrtle on Jasper Glen at Parkside Ridge Park.
- 40. Treat broadleaf turf weeds on Jasper Glen at Parkside Ridge Park. (Pic. 40)



- 41. Need to improve turf on Barrington Stowers between Caldera Ridge and VCD where there has been irrigation issues in the past.
- 42. Remove a few dead Indian Hawthorn in the median bed of Barrington Stowers just East of Mosaic. (Pic. 42)



43. Diagnose and treat declining turf on Barrington Stowers median just West of Village Center Dr. This is relatively new sod. Not sure if it is an inspect issue or irrigation issue. (Pic. 43)



- 44. Need to remove a leaning Red Maple at the park on Azalea Pond Ct. and Great Lawn Pl. Was a proposal provided for consideration?
- 45. In the off season, need to schedule Oak canopy lifting and moss removal to contract specs in Central Park.
- 46. Check the irrigation is working properly in the CDD portion of the Zoysia field on Shell Ridge behind the amenity area.
- 47. Diagnose and treat area of declining turf on Shell Ridge ROW between Quartz Lake and Caldera Ridge Dr.
- 48. Trim the dead fronds in the palm trees at the basketball court park off Esker Falls.
- 50. Noting a dead Red Maple that was installed by Brightview on Esker Falls that was never replaced under warranty. This is across the street from the basketball court. This tree has fallen and needs to be removed.
- 51. Treat broadleaf turf weeds on Circa Fishhawk Blvd. between Esker Falls Dr. and Village Center Dr.

- 52. Check the irrigation is working properly on Circa Fishhawk Blvd. between Esker Falls and Village Center Dr. where there appears to be a few localized dry spots.
- 53. Remove dead Indian Hawthorn on Circa Fishhawk ROW between Esker Falls and Village Center Dr. (Pic. 53)



54. Ensure no vegetation is overhanging the sidewalk that cuts through this park. (Pic. 54)



55. Did notice a few ant mounds starting to pop up throughout the district. Scout and treat each mowing service.

Fishhawk West CDD October Irrigation Maintenance

Sprinkler Solutions of Florida was on site throughout the month of October conducting routine maintenance, monitoring site conditions and inspecting the pumps for proper operation. Controllers A, G, H, I and L are all on the Hunter Centralus system and the communication systems are working as expected. Irrigation schedules on all controllers are being adjusted to ensure there are no overlapping programs and that operating times are adequate. In addition, many zones are being programmed for cycle/soak operations to see if we can increase efficiency and reduce operating times. The goal being to keep the site aesthetically pleasing while saving as much water as possible.

In addition to routine maintenance, the following issues were addressed:

- Replaced four leaking valves in cul-d-sac on Quintessa.
- Replaced four leaking valves in cul-d-sac on Lambright Bridge.
- Completed troubleshooting on E-Controller and verified that zone E19 does not exist and that E32 is a tree bubbler zone that is no longer is use.
- The 1-1/2" lateral repair on Spector will be completed the first week of November.
- Will send estimate to replace pressure transducer on pump at C-Controller as soon as the owner has been identified.

According to the National Weather Service, the Tampa Bay area received 0.39" of rain in the month of October. This is well below the monthly average of 2.34 inches. After last year's record rainfall, the Tampa Bay area is up to 10" below historical rainfall totals for the first 10 months of the year. The US Seasonal Drought Outlook for the west coast of Florida is predicting that drought development is likely through the end of January. In addition, temperatures continue to be above normal, with the average temperature in October registering 0.9 -degrees above the historical average. These conditions will make it difficult to conserve water, but the systems will be shut down anytime there is significant rainfall in the area. It may be necessary to stop watering Bahia turf areas to focus more water on the heavily used St. Augustine and Bermuda areas. This is a decision that will be discussed with the Board.

SUMMARY:

Water temps are slowly starting to cool down from the air temperatures lowering. Reoccurring algae blooms will start slowing down and prevent maintenance will be doing its job. Things to remember is that algae blooms can still pop up during cooler months with nutrient introductions such as yard clippings, fertilizers, etc. The ability to aggressively combat and prevent them is much greater as dissolved oxygen levels are much higher and water temps much cooler. Hope everyone has a Happy Thanksgiving.



ACCESS AUTHORIZATION AGREEMENT

THIS ACCESS AUTHORIZATION AGREEMENT ("Authorization") is made between Tampa Bay Water, A Regional Water Supply Authority ("Tampa Bay Water") whose address is 2575 Enterprise Road, Clearwater, FL 33763, and Fishhawk CDD IV (the "Owner") whose address is C/O Rizzetta & Company 3434 Colwell Avenue, Suite 200, Tampa, FL 33614

RECITALS:

- **A.** Owner owns certain real property located at 5718 Watercolor Dr., Lithia, FL 33547 (the "Property") and depicted on the attached sketches, Exhibit A. Folio numbers: 076800-1002, 076800-1004, 077192-5226, 088366-1335, 077192-5232, 088366-1334, 076828-0127 (between Stations 10+00 +/- to 104+25)
- **B.** Tampa Bay Water is constructing the South Hillsborough Pipeline and requests authorization from Owner to access the Property to conduct civil surveys, geotechnical borings, environmental surveys, cultural resources surveys and all other surveys and tests necessary for design and construction of the pipeline.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Authorization, Owner grants permission to Tampa Bay Water, its employees, agents, representatives, and contractors, along with Federal and State biologists, archeologists, and other environmental scientists as necessary (collectively referred to in this agreement as "Tampa Bay Water") to enter the Property to conduct civil surveys, geotechnical borings, environmental surveys, cultural resource surveys and all other surveys, assessments, and tests necessary for design and construction of the pipeline. The approximate locations and nature of the desired access is shown in the attached Exhibit B.
- 2. **Owner's** Authorization includes permission to enter upon the Property under the supervision of the Owner, with personnel, vehicles, and equipment to perform surveys, assessments, and test necessary including, but not limited to geotechnical borings for soil testing and subsurface utility engineering.
- 3. Subject to the terms of this Authorization, Owner hereby authorizes Tampa Bay Water to conduct inspection and testing activities including the following impacts to the land: Seventeen (17) temporary soil geotechnical borings to be conducted along the easterly perimeter of the cleared/developed area of the CDD, with majority of the borings adjacent to the pedestrian path. Eight (8) temporary soil geotechnical borings to be conducted through the heavier vegetated area and Gopher Tortoise Conservation Easement area, clearing of brush, trees, and stumps along the alignment. The soil geotechnical borings will be no deeper than forty (40) feet.
- This Authorization shall terminate upon notice by either party or if Tampa Bay Water's actions exceed the scope of this Authorization.
- All activity by Tampa Bay Water shall be completed at its sole risk, cost, and expense. Tampa Bay Water shall be solely responsible for costs and expenses associated with this Authorization and its activities on the Property.

Areas disturbed will be returned to natural grade where topographical features allow. Owner may supervise access upon reasonable notice and mutual agreement as to the timing and duration of access.

- 9. Access and activities of Tampa Bay Water shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Tampa Bay Water must provide to Owner written notice of its intention to enter upon the Property at least two business days prior to (and as a condition to) such intended entry, which notice must specify in reasonable detail the intended purpose of such entry, the inspections and activities contemplated to be made, and the names of all individuals and entities who will enter onto the Property.
 - **(b)** At Owner's option, one or more representatives of Owner may be present for any entry onto the Property or inspection or other activities at the Property by Tampa Bay Water.
 - (c) If Tampa Bay Water undertakes any borings or other disturbances of the Property, or otherwise damages or disturbs the Property during any its activities, Tampa Bay Water shall, at its sole cost and expense, promptly repair and restore the Property to its condition as it existed immediately prior to any such borings, disturbance, or damage, but in no event later than twenty days after the boring, disturbance, or damage occurs. Such repair and restoration shall be completed in a good and workmanlike manner, and free from defects and liens. Tampa Bay Water's obligations under this Section shall survive any expiration or termination of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Tampa Bay Water is not obligated to restore areas of the Property that it cleared of small brush, tree branches, and stumps.

- (d) In entering upon or inspecting the Property, Tampa Bay Water shall not: (i) disturb Owner's employees or interfere with Owner's use of the Property; (ii) interfere with the operation and maintenance of the Property; (iii) damage any part of the Property or any personal property owned or held by Owner or any other person or entity except as otherwise described in this Authorization (iv) injure or otherwise cause bodily harm to any person; or (v) cause or permit any liens, judgments, or other encumbrances to attach to the Property by reason of the exercise of Tampa Bay Water's authorization or activities under this Agreement (and Tampa Bay Water shall, at its sole cost and expense, immediately discharge of record any such liens, judgments, or other encumbrances that are so filed or recorded, which obligation shall survive any expiration or termination of this Agreement).
- 10. Subject to the scope and limits of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, Tampa Bay Water agrees to indemnify and save Owner harmless from and against any and all liability, damage, expense, claims, liens, or judgments resulting from injury to person or damage to property resulting from or arising out of the activities of Tampa Bay Water, its agents, employees, contractors, or invitees, upon the Property.
- 11. This Authorization shall terminate upon notice from either party, or one year six months from the date of Owner's signature hereto, or upon the execution of a written Easement Agreement between the parties, whichever occurs first.
- 12. This Authorization constitutes the entire understanding between the parties with respect to the activities contemplated by this Authorization. All prior agreements or understandings, whether oral or written, are superseded. PDF or other signatures conveyed electronically shall be acceptable to bind the parties to this Authorization. However, this Authorization may be replaced by a witnessed document executed by the parties if the parties request such a document, but it is not necessary for the enforcement of this Authorization. In addition, this Authorization shall not constitute or be construed to convey any rights to Tampa Bay Water except the access and authorization expressly provided herein.
- Stantec and their Geotech, Arehna Engineering, Inc. shall make available upon completion of the soil borings any reports, findings and samples, (if available).

Compliance Audit Overview

The Community Website Compliance Audit (CWCA) consists of a thorough assessment of Florida Community Development District (CDD) websites to assure that specified district information is available and fully accessible. Florida Statute Chapter 189.069 states that effective October, 2015, every CDD in the state is required to maintain a fully compliant website for reporting certain information and documents for public access.

The CWCA is a reporting system comprised of quarterly audits and an annual summary audit to meet full disclosure as required by Florida law. These audits are designed to assure that CDDs satisfy all compliance requirements stipulated in Chapter 189.069.

Compliance Criteria

The CWCA focuses on the two primary areas – website accessibility as defined by U.S. federal laws, and the 16-point criteria enumerated in <u>Florida Statute Chapter</u> 189.069.



ADA Website Accessibility

Several federal statutes (American Disabilities Act, Sec. 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973) require public institutions to ensure they are not discriminating against individuals on the basis of a person's disability. Community websites are required to conform to web content accessibility guidelines – WCAG 2.1, which is the international standard established to keep websites barrier-free and the recognized standard for ADA-compliance.



Florida Statute Compliance

Pursuant to F.S. <u>189.069</u>, every CDD is required to maintain a dedicated website to serve as an official reporting mechanism covering, at minimum, 16 criteria. The information required to report and have fully accessible spans: establishment charter or ordinance, fiscal year audit, budget, meeting agendas and minutes and more. For a complete list of statute requirements, see page 3.

Audit Process

The Community Website Compliance Audit covers all CDD web pages and linked PDFs.* Following the <u>WCAG 2.1</u> levels A, AA, and AAA for web content accessibility, a comprehensive scan encompassing 312 tests is conducted for every page. In addition, a human inspection is conducted to assure factors such as navigation and color contrasts meet web accessibility standards. See page 4 for complete accessibility grading criteria.

In addition to full ADA-compliance, the audit includes a 16-point checklist directly corresponding with the criteria set forth in Florida Statute Chapter 189.069. See page 5 for the complete compliance criteria checklist.

* NOTE: Because many CDD websites have links to PDFs that contain information required by law (meeting agendas, minutes, budgets, miscellaneous and ad hoc documents, etc.), audits include an examination of all associated PDFs. PDF remediation and ongoing auditing is critical to maintaining compliance.

Accessibility overview

Everyone deserves equal access.

With nearly 1-in-5 Americans having some sort of disability – visual, hearing, motor, cognitive – there are literally millions of reasons why websites should be fully accessible and compliant with all state and federal laws. Web accessibility not only keeps board members on the right side of the law, but enables the entire community to access all your web content. The very principles that drive accessible website design are also good for those without disabilities.

The legal and right thing to do

Several federal statutes (American Disabilities Act, Sec. 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973) require public institutions to ensure they are not discriminating against individuals on the basis of a person's disability. Plain and simple, any content on your website must be accessible to everyone.



ADA Compliance Categories

Most of the problems that occur on a website fall in one or several of the following categories.



Contrast and colors

Some people have vision disabilities that hinder picking up contrasts, and some are color blind, so there needs to be a distinguishable contrast between text and background colors. This goes for buttons, links, text on images – everything. Consideration to contrast and color choice is also important for extreme lighting conditions.

Using semantics to format your HTML pages

When web page codes are clearly described in easy-to-understand terms, it enables broader sharing across all browsers and apps. This 'friendlier' language not only helps all the users, but developers who are striving to make content more universal on more devices.



Text alternatives for non-text content

Written replacements for images, audio and video should provide all the same descriptors that the non-text content conveys. Besides helping with searching, clear, concise word choice can make vivid non-text content for the disabled.

Ability to navigate with the keyboard

Not everyone can use a mouse. Blind people with many with motor disabilities have to use a keyboard to make their way around a website. Users need to be able to interact fully with your website by navigating using the tab, arrows and return keys only. A "skip navigation" option is also required. Consider using WAI-ARIA for improved accessibility, and properly highlight the links as you use the tab key to make sections.

Easy to navigate and find information

Finding relevant content via search and easy navigation is a universal need. Alt text, heading structure, page titles, descriptive link text (no 'click here' please) are just some ways to help everyone find what they're searching for. You must also provide multiple ways to navigate such as a search and a site map.

Tables are hard for screen readers to decipher. Users need to be able to navigate through a table one cell at a time. In addition to the table itself needing a caption, row and column headers need to be labeled and data correctly associated with the right header.

Alternate versions

Attempts to be fully accessible sometimes fall short, and in those cases, alternate versions of key pages must be created. That is, it is sometimes not feasible (legally, technically) to modify some content. These are the 'exceptions', but still must be accommodated.



Feedback for users

To be fully interactive, your site needs to be able to provide an easy way for users to submit feedback on any website issues. Clarity is key for both any confirmation or error feedback that occurs while engaging the page.



Other related requirements

No flashing

Blinking and flashing are not only bothersome, but can be disorienting and even dangerous for many users. Seizures can even be triggered by flashing, so avoid using any flashing or flickering content.

Timers

Timed connections can create difficulties for the disabled. They may not even know a timer is in effect, it may create stress. In some cases (e.g., purchasing items), a timer is required, but for most school content, avoid using them.

Fly-out menus

Menus that fly out or down when an item is clicked are helpful to dig deeper into the site's content, but they need to be available via keyboard navigation, and not immediately snap back when those using a mouse move from the clickable area.

No pop-ups

Pop-up windows present a range of obstacles for many disabled users, so it's best to avoid using them altogether. If you must, be sure to alert the user that a pop-up is about to be launched.
