- 7. Describe Glycolysis, aerobic respiration, and fermentation and understand how they produce energy in cells.
- 8. Describe the structure of DNA, genes, DNA expression and understand how mutations affect DNA expression.
- 9. Differentiate between prokaryotic and eukaryotic DNA replication and cell division.
- 10. Understand sexual reproduction and meiosis.
- 11. Understand genetics and inheritance.
- 12. Understand evolution, how it occurs, and the evidence that supports it.

- 14. Describe speciation and extinction and their influences.
- 15. Describe evolution and diversity of microorganisms and plants.
