#### **Safety Measures**

#### Lockers:

- Limited Access During the Day
  - Arrival, Class Changes, Lunch,Dismissal
  - No Lockers During Class (Emergencies Only)
  - Lockers are Property of NEHS/NESD
  - ■No Expectation of Privacy ∘Keep them locked! Issues? Let someone know!

#### **Search and Seizure:**

• Reasonable Suspicion

#### Contraband

- Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco, Vapes/Dab Pens, Etc.
- Confiscation, Parent Pick-Up, Law
   Enforcement

#### If Contraband is Found:

• Suspension, Alternative Education, Expulsion, COURT

#### **Medications**

Secure them with the nurse!

#### Weapons

Expulsion and Legal Action



#### **Safety Continued**

#### Terroristic Threats/Threats/Bomb Threats

• Suspension, Expulsion, Legal Action (Felony Charges Possible)

#### Fighting/Altercations

Suspension, Legal Action, Referral to AEDY

#### Harassment/Bullying

- •Disrupts the Learning Environment and Emotional Well-Being of our Peers
- Restorative Justice is Priority #1
- Detentions, Suspensions, AEDY, Expulsion are ONLY As-Needed
- •Cyberbullying and Technology-Based Harassment WILL BE Treated the Same as In-Person

#### Consequences

**Subsequent Offenses:** Considered defiance/insubordination, ISS, device permitted on student's person during school.



#### **Violations and Consequences**

You cannot leave school property without permission (even if you are 18). Automatic ISS.

You cannot be tardy to or Skip your classes. Class Skip Consequences

First Offense: ASD

Second Offense: 1-Day ISS

**Subsequent Offenses:** Continued Progression of ISS (2 Days, 3 Days,

etc.)

## Academic Expectations

## Disciplinary Consequences

Mess around and find out.



#### Low Level Consequences

#### **WARNINGS**

Lowest level consequence; reserved for simple infractions/first time offenses

#### **AFTER-SCHOOL DETENTION**

Monday-Thursday 2:45-4:00 PM

Required to do school work; no personal devices

Transportation is your responsibility

#### **Serious Consequences**

ISS

1-10 Days (Depends on Severity of Situation)

No extracurricular activities during the duration of the suspension

OSS

1-10 Days (Depends on Severity of Situation)

No extracurricular activities

Not allowed on campus at all!

# **Major Infractions (Getting Removed)**

#### **ALTERNATIVE ED**

Minimum 45 Day Placement at Bethesda Lutheran Services: AEDY Program

Must meet program goals and EARN promotion back to NEHS.

Not allowed on school district property whatsoever.

#### **EXPULSION**

Removed from NESD for AT LEAST one calendar year.

Not allowed on school district property whatsoever.

SAP is an intervention program not treatment.

#### The SAP Process

#### Referral and who can make a referral?

#### **Core Team Review**

Formal Information gathered
What data is collected:

\*student records

\*Teacher checklist

\*Academics/Grades

\*School Nurse info

#### **Core Team Recommendations**

Develop and intervention plan which can include any of all of the following

\* case manager monitors student with check ins \*Referral to Mental Health Liaison \*Referral to Drug and Alcohol SAP Counselor

#### **Action Plan**

The core team and or liaisons assist the student and parent/family in developing an action plan that could include the following:

\* In School Support

\* Further screening and evaluation by mental health or drug and alcohol counselor to determine care needed

\* Recommend other professional services outside of the school setting

### **Monitor**

The coreteam monitors the students progress and determine if changes are needed in the action plan

Mental Health Liaison (Mrs. Martin)

\*short term intervention and support

\*facilitates support groups grief/loss, anxiety, anger, stress, relationships

\*Organizes Children's Grief Awareness Day in November

\*Connects students to the Food Market here at North East High School in times of need.

# **Services and Expectations**

#### Referrals

- ·Who can make them?
  - Administrators
  - Teachers
  - The student
  - Other students
  - Parents/ guardians
  - •Outside entities (probation, OC)

#### What is Needed

- Once a referral is made the information we need as follows:
- Signed parent permission
- Parent contact information
- Name, Address, Phone Number
- Students SSN (Needed to begin services)
- Insurance information if available
- Student DOB

# What services can we provide?



- •Select schools are licensed for OP services others will need to occur at our Erie OP office, SAP team can process any referrals then complete a warm hand
- Weekly education (via email or flyer)
- Classroom Education
- •Parent nights, open houses, anything open to students and their families
- •Red Ribbon week
- Other prevention activities
- Staff/faculty education




#### **SAP Referral Process**

- 1. Receive referral and obtain all needed info
- 2. Reach out to parent and confirm services as well discuss concerns
- 3.Initial Screening
  - 1.If substance use (other than nicotine) is indicated, assessment will be recommended
  - 2.If no substance use indicated will likely meet with student for weekly individual sessions (typically 4-10 weeks)
- 4.Level of Care Assessment
  - 1.Call parents to inform them of assessment recommendation
  - 2. Conduct assessment and make appropriate recommendation for level of care

## What Makes A Good Referral?

01

- Parent simply requesting education due to identified risk factor
- •Ex. Found a vape, concerned about peer group, siblings use

02

- •Known or suspected substance use
- ·Vape, Marijuana, Alcohol, etc.
- Possession at school
- Positive drug screen

03

- •Students with a loved one that struggles with addiction (child of alcoholic/addicts COA)
- 1 in 4 children live in a family where a parent abuses drugs or alcohol
- Distorted thinking patterns
- Dysfunctional family patterns
- Conflicted Emotions
- •Guilt, anxiety, embarrassment, inability to have close relationships, confusion, anger, depression, poor self-esteem, isolation
