5. Girls Soccer Academic Award:

The Girls Soccer Team was awarded a United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for the 2017-18 academic year. A total of 311 teams (106 boys, 205 girls) from throughout the U.S. have earned this honor. Our girls earned a combined team GPA of 3.86.

The Team Academic Award was created to recognize student athletes' commitment to excellence in the classroom. This annual award is based on a team's academic performance for the entire academic year. For a team to be considered, it must have a composite team grade point average of at least 3.25 (on a 4.0 scale) for all team members who appear on the official eligibility roster for the season, and the coach must be a current United Soccer Coaches member. All players on the roster must be included in the calculation of the team GPA.

This achievement sets our team apart from other teams, demonstrating our program's commitment to achievement on the field and in the classroom.
