

ALCOHOL & OTHER DRUG INTERVENTION PROCEDURE

The District encourages faculty members to be observant of student behavior and to participate in a program of intervention. Faculty members may use the record of observable behavior to determine whether behavior should be reported.

If the faculty member decides that the behavior indicates a possible prohibited activity, the student should be:

1. Referred to the school counselor and
2. Reported to the principal.

If the principal/superintendent has reasonable suspicion that the student is under the influence, the student's parents will be notified and asked to remove the student from school. If there appears to be imminent danger to other students, school personnel, and/or the student involved, the principal or superintendent may have the student removed from the school by school, medical, or law enforcement personnel.

If the counselor, principal, or superintendent believes that the student is indeed in need of intervention assistance, the counselor, principal, or superintendent may call the student in for a conference. If the counselor calls this meeting, s/he shall notify the building principal of this conference. The student's parents shall be notified of the conference. Parents shall be requested to attend the conference. The counselor and building principal, or designee, shall be required to attend and may receive assistance from a certified addiction counselor in how to confront students.
