Parents Influence Character As They Make Daily Choices

It's a beautiful fall afternoon. You'd love to enjoy the day. But you've made a promise to visit Aunt Jen in the nursing home.

You may not know it, but you're a teacher at this moment. The choice you make will teach your child more about what it means to be kind to others than 100 lectures.

Each day, your children watch as you make choices. If your words match your actions, you have taught a powerful lesson. Think about the other times during a day when you are teaching moral values. You spy a parking place, but can see that another car has waited for it. Still, you could probably get there first. What do you do? You hear about a family who has lost everything in a fire.

What do you do? What do you ask your family to do?
You promise your children you will come to their football game. When the time comes, you have some extra work to do at the office. What choice do you make?
Each of these everyday

Each of these everyday choices teaches your child something about values. You can't always control what your children see and do outside your home. But you can control what goes on inside.

When you must make a choice, ask yourself, "How would I like my child to behave in this case?" Then act in the way you hope your child would behave.

Core Good Habits for Academic Success

- 1. Establish a dedicated study zone
 - A quiet, well-lit area reserved for schoolwork boosts focus and helps your brain associate that pace with learning
 - Keep supplies organized and minimize distractions: phones, games, etc.
- 2. Set a consistent study schedule
 - Pick specific daily time blocks-even short ones like 25-30 minutes
 - a. Stick to routines-before school, after school, in the evening, and weekends-with room for flexibility
- 3. Break tasks into smaller goals
 - Divide large projects or chapters into manageable chunks and reward progress to stay motivated
- 4. Use active learning and retrieval practices
 - Engage by summarizing lessons, teaching someone else, using flashcards or quizzestechniques proven to enhance retention via the testing effect
 - Mix it up: visually annotate, record yourself, apply theory with practice

Five things families can do to help students thrive in school

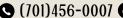
Every family-and every child- is different, but there are ways all families can set children up for success. Studies show that students are more likely to achieve in elementary school and beyond when their families provide a supportive environment.

To set your child up for a great school year:

- 1. **Set the bar high.** Insist on your child's personal best. Praise effort and progress.
- 2. **Assign chores.** Children with household responsibilities learn how to be responsible.
- 3. **Teach social skills.** Promote cooperation and courtesy.
- 4. Nurture your relationship. Make time to have fun together. Express your love by being attentive and supportive.
- 5. Take care of yourself. Carve out time to relax, exercise or curl up with a good book. A calm peaceful home starts with you.
