From the Pastor's Desk

As daylight dwindles, approaching the winter solstice, we notice more darkness in our days. Many of us are likely waking up before the sun rises and by the time we return home from work it's already dark. We might be missing even more than usual the summer sunshine or the lingering light of autumn casting long shadows. It is amidst this encroaching darkness that we enter the Advent season, the beginning of the Catholic liturgical year.

This natural season of growing darkness seems an odd occasion to being the liturgical year whose center is Jesus Christ, the light of the world. And yet, this is precisely the perfect time. Through the liturgy the Catholic year follows the unfolding of salvation history, in which God's chosen people did not begin with the full light of truth but lived in hopeful anticipation of its coming. Advent is the season of awaiting the dawn!

Awaiting the dawn is also a fitting frame for facing this fallow season in the life of our local church, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Things might look rather dark at times, given the pandemic, the disconnectedness we feel in not being able to gather everyone together, the financial impact of the response to the spread of this virus, and a host of other issues. In the midst of this encroaching darkness, we as disciples of Jesus are to remember the light we bear within us. Through our baptism we have already received the light of Christ. The Son of God is risen in our hearts. The gospel for the first Sunday of Advent calls us to stay awake, to attend to the light we've received, to be watchful, eagerly anticipating the full light of Christ's glory. Indeed, we are called to be beacons of light!

Beacons of Light, in fact, is the name for the five-year process of strategic and pastoral planning upon which all parishes in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati are now embarking. As this process unfolds more information will be made available. At the moment, here is a brief outline of what to anticipate in the near future:

At the outset, Beacons of Light has two phases taking place simultaneously: Strategic Planning and Pastoral Planning. Strategic planning involves data gathering, analysis, and the identification of the best possible parish groupings throughout the Archdiocese. This is being done at the central offices downtown with a consulting group. Input is being collected from pastors through the deans of each deanery. Each pastor is to gather input from the Pastoral Council and the Finance Council at each of his parishes. In the first six months of the new year, the data and input from all the parishes will be utilized to form new groupings of parishes throughout the entire Archdiocese.

In the Summer of 2021, these new parish groupings will be announced. This could mean additional parishes becoming part of the Holy Trinity/Nativity Pastoral Region. Once the new groupings are enacted, then begins the Pastoral Planning phase. Pastoral Planning includes meetings through which parish leaders will discern the shape of parish life for their grouping and create a pastoral plan for the future. The Archdiocese intends to provide trained facilitators to accompany each pastor and his working group, comprised of parishioners from each parish in the new grouping, as they develop a plan together. This process is to align all resources on the parish grouping to the mission of the Church: to offer everyone a life -changing encounter with Jesus Christ so they might know, love, and service Him in this life so as to be happy with Him forever. In short, we all become beacons of light that radiate Christ!

In fact, reading Archbishop Schnurr's pastoral letter Radiate Christ would be a great thing to do this Advent as we prepare to welcome Jesus Christ the light of the world into our homes and hearts at Christmas. Eventually information about Beacons of Light will appear in the Catholic Telegraph, so stay tuned. Meanwhile, monthly prayer and reflection resources, as well as updates on the process, will be available at <u>www.catholicaoc.org/beacons</u>. Let us prayerfully anticipate this opportunity to grow together as beacons of light. After all, Advent is the season of awaiting the dawn!
