- Make sure you child attends school regularly. Remember, tests do reflect children's overall achievement. The more effort and energy a child puts into learning, the more likely they will do well on tests.
- Make sure that your child is well rested on school days and especially the days of a test.
- Give your child a well-rounded diet. A healthy body leads to a healthy, active mind.
- Provide a good breakfast, including a protein.
- Encourage your student to do their best.

- Tell me something you know today that you didn't know yesterday.



#### **Meadow Lane Construction Update**

We are thankful for the good weather we had this last month. When the construction zone parking lot is full we get excited. It is so fun to watch the progression of construction. We had a building walk through mid March which allowed us to visualize the new spaces. The new gymnasium/cafeteria is enormous! It will be able to fit two basketball courts side by side when the bleaches are stored and allow room for more than one activity to happen at a time in the space. We are hopeful that it will be complete by the end of the calendar year however there are still parts and shipping delays happening.

Construction workers finished covering all the roof areas with plywood this month. They are working on getting the new building areas "dried in" which means that they will not be affected by bad weather anymore. The roof will be covered in a thick moisture barrier and then the roofing material will be installed. Installation of doors and windows will complete the dried in process. We hope to see those materials arriving on site soon. The large door frame with window panels is currently onsite, it will be installed in the large opening across from the current office. It will be the main access point onto campus from the new school office.

Electricians have been onsite working. They have been busy installing electrical conduit in the framed walls in anticipation of electrical outlets, electrical connections for kitchen equipment, and more. They have begun installing the first stage of canned lighting in ceilings.

Each month Meadow Lane spotlights a different Character trait.

This month our character trait is *Forgiveness*. *Forgiveness* means letting go of angry feelings towards the person who hurt vou and refocusing on positive emotions.

Each teacher and all of our staff will be looking for students who are exhibiting this trait. Please talk to your child about what *forgiveness* looks like for you and your family at home as well as ways they can demonstrate *forgiveness* at school.

Each teacher nominates students from their class who have been "caught" often demonstrating the character trait of the month. These students will receive a award from our Principal.

### Three steps to help children with the process of forgiveness with friends



- 1. "I understand that forgiving my friend will wipe away my bitterness."
- 2. "I will stay committed to our friendship and respect my friend and his feelings."
- 3. "I realize that forgiveness will make me happier and more loving towards others".

#### **Friendship band**

What better way to encourage your child to forgive than to let them make their own friendship band and tie it around the wrist of a friend they find difficult to forgive?

#### Stick puppets

Use magazines or newspaper to cut out pictures representing mother, father, and children and paste them to ice cream sticks. Use these as puppets and weave a story to help your child understand forgiveness.

#### 'Clean' heart

Cut out the shape of a heart from chart paper, scribble on it and give it to your child. Now, ask your child to clean the pencil marks on the heart using an eraser. Explain how important it is for them to erase any differences they have with their friends and forgive them.

#### The 'Gift' of forgiveness


Ask your child to gift-wrap an empty box and decorate it. Then, explain to them how forgiveness is like that gift, a gift that only they can give to someone. Ask them to imagine how happy their friend would feel to receive that gift.

#### Walk in another's shoes

Give your child your pair of shoes and ask them to walk in it for a while. Then, explain how it is difficult for them to walk as the shoes aren't theirs. Similarly, only if they try to walk in a friend's shoes will they understand a friend's point of view and learn to forgive.

#### Sport a 'smile'

Have a role-play with one sibling saying something harsh to the other. In return, the other sibling should smile back. A smile can do wonders. It can wipe away hurt and bitterness.
