Christine "Kelly" Chandler-Distler
Class of 2005





Christine Kelly Chandler-Distler, a Perry High School alumnus, along with her friend Angela Pohl combined their passions of avid running with an incredible commitment towards helping others. The two paired and founded the local non-profit organization Good Running. The organization functions as a fitness group which promotes healthier living and increased personal fitness goals while benefitting charities and other nonprofit causes throughout Northeast Ohio. Good Running is now on it's 28th month (as of the date of the nomination in June) and has aided the causes of nearly 50 other organizations by generating over \$50,000 dollars of charitable donations. The organization has been instrumental in strengthening our local community while forming a motivational and encouraging following, personally bettering themselves each day. Kelly's innovation, kind heart, and leadership qualities are driving forces that help make Good Running such amazing organization. The Perry High School Alumni Association is so proud that she is a fellow Perry High School alum and is doing such wonderful things that reach a wide array of worthwhile causes. Kelly and her husband John are the proud parents of two boys, Landon and Chandler, and make their home in Perry. After graduating from Mount Union College, Kelly began teaching Spanish at Madison High School and also coaches their cross-country program. Classmate News

Mike Boyce, Class of 1990, attended California College of the Art with a double major in Graphic Design and Illustration. While living in San Francisco he was amazed at the size and visibility of the homeless population and their treatment by the city's residents. Mike decided that he wanted to become a part of the solution and came up with the idea of giving some awareness to children. He used his Critical Studies class to begin development and illustration of his book "Homeless". He wanted it to be friendly and attractive with bright colors, reflecting diverse cultures without putting emphasis on gender for the main character so that each child reading it could see themselves in the role. He drew upon a number of others for their expertise in various fields as well as interviewing the homeless. The book for children, targeting ages 2-10 explains homelessness and helps create a dialogue about this growing community and how it affects us all. The book tells the story of a child and their family experiencing homelessness and steps involved in getting help. Mike self-published 2,000 copies using a GoFundMe account. Every school in San Francisco has a copy.

Mike isn't done! This is just the beginning of what he hopes will become a series of children's books to address difficult subjects. He is working on his next book, "Sickness", which addresses how children handle three types of illness: cancer, HIV and cerebral palsy and has met with doctors and nurses, as well as staff at Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital.

Mike sees himself as just an illustrator on a mission. "I'm tackling difficult subjects," he said "But I want to tackle it in such a way that it's still beautiful"

Amber Strnad, Class of 2007, lost a number of friends to the battle against addiction. She has become the founder and director at Northeast Ohio's Fight Against Addiction, a community awareness and outreach ministry seeking to positively impact the community and offer hope to those affected by addiction. She had a vision for a local rally to support those who were struggling with their addiction, with it becoming a reality that has grown into a two-day event with about 4,000 attending in 2017. Amber described Hope Over Heroin as a 3-tiered approach in battling the opioid epidemic at a recent presentation as reported by the Gazette Newpapers:

- Hope Over Heroin is a faith-based ministry believing in the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to transform lives. It has been acknowledged by those in the industry that the faith- based element is a missing and necessary link in treatment and can be the difference between life and death.
- The City of Resources: uniting a city's Addiction Recovery Service providers with civic, education, medical, first responders, church and business leaders who share the passion to provide tangible assistance to every person who seeks help and to make an impact in the lives of every family affected by the opioid epidemic.
- One Call & Ongoing Support: provides ongoing support for everyone who responds. One Call is a registry that matches service providers with those seeking help.

"Hope Over Heroin provides the whole program," she said. "They strategically plan this program to draw in people who are struggling. Sponsorship opportunities are available." Not all organizations in the City of Resources are faith-based, Strnad noted, adding that everyone is welcome. "Recovery looks different for everyone. If somebody needs help we want to help them," Strnad said, noting many of the group's volunteers "each have a heart for the Lord. Our message at the event is the gospel."

Plans for the weekend family event in 2018 include opening with a memorial march, haircuts, face painting, a bounce house for kids, free food, and backpacks / giveaways. The event, funded through donations and sponsorships, is free to the community.


