
- ▲ In early September, Perry High School earned a 5-Star Rating from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce. This rating reflects our success in achievement scores,

As Perry Elementary School students began a new school year in August, some disembarked from buses and were greeted by teachers, administrators, our SSO, and Captain. Others were dropped

off by their parents in the middle school bus loop, where Mrs. Gall and our SROs greeted them. These greetings, like much

of what the students returned to at school, are PES traditions.

The students' day starts with the Pledge of Allegiance and our PEEPs chant led by fourth-grade students. They learn language arts, math, social studies, and science, of course, but also art skills, vocal music, instruments, the love of reading, resilience, kindness, and how to move to be healthy. They've already begun practicing for their musical

programs, attended the book fair, and spent many days playing on the wooden playground. These activities are part of a typical day and year at Perry Elementary School. At the end of the day, they head off campus on buses or with their parents, and many participate in a variety of programs offered through our community partners and organizations.

Alongside the traditions they are used to, students may notice a few additions to Perry Elementary School in the 2024/2025 school year. This year, we are piloting a new reading program, Benchmark Advance, which not only aligns with our Literacy Vision for Perry Elementary School, but also with the Science of Reading learning that we have done over the past two years. Students are reading texts that challenge them at their grade level and developing content knowledge and vocabulary that will build as they move from kindergarten through fourth grade. As always, the best thing students can do to increase their reading ability is to read with their families daily.

Not only do we have a new reading program, but we also have expanded our PEEPS program to promote positive behavior throughout the school day. Students learn about our expectations in their PSL special and their main classrooms. They know that

we expect them to be responsible, respectful, ready to learn, and safe in all parts of their day. They continue to earn PEEPS tickets for behavior that represents these expectations. Positive behavior is recognized in the classroom, lunchroom, during specials, on the playground, and the buses through the distribution of PEEPS tickets. In addition to the individual PEEPS winners that we select every week and the trophies that are awarded to the classrooms

with the most PEEPS tickets, this year we have introduced the Golden Spatula Award. The Golden Spatula is awarded daily to the lunch table with the most PEEP-like behavior. Students have several opportunities during their school day to celebrate success for on-path behavior!

We have a tradition at Perry of challenging students to be the best that they can be academically and to be good PEEPS personally. We hope to continue that work and to enhance our school with new practices that will become traditions in years to come.
