1. What are the credit requirements to graduate from Perry High School?

2. How many courses should I register for?

You must register for 8 required courses and 4 alternate courses.

3. What is community service?

Community service provides an opportunity for Juniors and Seniors to assist in classroom and throughout the school. This course does not have a credit value.

#### 4. How do I register for Perry Service Learning (PSL)?

When registering for PSL (senior course) you will need to register for the 3 sections of PSL:

- PSL –CS Perry Service Learning
- PSL - SS Perry Service Learning
- PSL –LA Perry Service Learning

#### 5. How do I register for College Credit Plus classes?

- You can select a CCP course from the registration tab if you are planning on taking CCP courses at PHS.
- You can select a College Credit Plus placeholder for as many CCP classes you plan to take. These placeholder courses can be used as a required or alternate course. *This does not mean you are registered for the course, you will need to apply and register at the college you plan to attend.*

#### 6. Who can help me choose the classes for which I need to register?

- You can ask your school counselor for assistance in selecting courses that will meet both PHS and state graduation requirements.

#### 7. Should my student take an Honors or AP course?

- Please check with the current teacher in that subject area for a recommendation. The decision is ultimately a family decision; however, a teacher's recommendation is helpful.
