The School & Community:

The Lyme Central School District is located in northern Jefferson County, 14 miles northwest of Watertown and 20 miles west of Ft. Drum US Army Installation. Lyme Central School is a single building district housing 40 teachers, administrators, and support staff, and approximately 330 students. The township includes the villages of Chaumont and Three Mile Bay, and many miles of beautiful eastern Lake Ontario shoreline. The area is predominantly rural, and supports a large summer seasonal community of cottagers who enjoy fishing and boating. On the doorstep of the Thousand Islands region, short trips of 2-3 hours can place you in the heart of the Adirondack Mountains or the Finger Lakes region of New York State.

School Curriculum and Graduation Requirements:

The school year consists of four, 10-week quarters beginning on September 4th and ending on June 25th. Our school day consists of nine, 40-minute periods and one 20 minute period for our character development program.

Minimum graduation requirements include the completion of 22 units of credit, with specific courses in the following subject areas: English-4 credits; Social Studies-4 credits; Math-3 credits; Science-3 credits; Foreign Language-1 credit; Health-½ credit; Physical Education-2 credits; and the Arts-1 credit.

To graduate with a New York State Regents Diploma: NYS Regents Examinations must be passed in the areas of English, US History & Government, Global History & Geography, one Regents-level math course, one Regents-level laboratory science course.

To graduate with a New York State Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation: NYS Regents Examinations must be passed in the areas of English, US History & Government, Global History & Geography, three Regents-level math courses, two Regents-level laboratory science courses, and two Foreign Language local exam.
