## School Profile 2023-2024

### Our School

John Stark Regional High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school with an enrollment of approximately 650 students in grades nine through twelve.

### Our Community

John Stark Regional High School combines students from Henniker and Weare, NH which are both rural townships. The combined population of both communities is approximately 15,000.

### Class Schedule

Modified block: full year & semester classes. Mondays include eight class periods plus Advisory. Tuesday through Friday, there are four class periods plus an academic support period.

### Grade reporting and rank information for 2020-21 and beyond:

Students demonstrate their learning in relation to specific Learning Targets and Course Level Competencies. Our grading system includes the following:

- Reporting student behaviors separately from academics.
- Rolling grades (90% Summative and 10% Formative) are calculated by averaging competencies, not quarters.
- Students must demonstrate basic proficiency in each competency to earn course credit.
- A student's cumulative GPA is updated after credit is awarded for their courses.
- Class rank is determined by GPA using the weighted system.
