LANDSCAPE INSPECTION REPORT

Summary & Zone 1

The following are action items for Pinnacle Landscapes to complete. Please refer to the item \square in your response listing action already taken or anticipated time of completion. Red text indicates deficient from previous report. \square old Red te \square t indicates deficient for more than a month. Green text indicates a proposal has been requested. Blue indicates irrigation. Orange indicates an issue to be handled by Staff and \square old \square underlined \square lack indicates an update or question for the BOS.

- Zone 1 Penzance, Guardhouse & Paseo Grande
- Zone 2 Condos, west of Paseo Grande,
- Zone 3 Condos, east of Paseo Grande
- Zone 4 Rosalinda, Provencia, Mercado & Sarita (includes Bibiana to Emilia and Javiera to Nalda)
- Zone 5 Paseo Drive (starting at Paseo Grande and including bridge)
- Zone 6 Adelio, Dario & Adora
- Zone 7 Esteban, (both sides) & Macario
- Zone 8 Hidalgo, Falisto & Renata
- Noting that Mexican petunias are still growing through the trinettes and other shrubs at the Penzance and Palomino intersection landscaping.
- 2. Firebush is pushing through the trinettes and other shrubs along Penzance, especially near the Palomino intersection.
- 3. Likely due to prior saturation, the drainage trench had become overgrown, and after the recent cut, large clumps of grass were left behind. This area needs to be mulched or blown out. (Pic 3
- Broadleaf weeds are occupying roughly 20 percent of at least two beds on Penzance. Please schedule a chemical treatment for Penzance. (Pic 4□)
- 5. The missed seed pods on the Alexander palms are still present. During the next trim cycle, ensure all palms are properly pruned.
- 6. Turf is growing between the walkway and landscaped beds near Musket Ln.







- Noting a sabal sprout at Penzance and Cannon Lane, located slightly east of the crosswalk.
- 8. Vines that were growing on the bracing cables of the powerlines appear to have been treated. Continue monitoring to ensure they remain in decline or fully die off, as they are likely to return. (Pic, 7)



- 9. On the western portion of the Penzance landscaping, the majority of the Alexander palms still have their seed pods.
- 10. The beds on the western portion of Penzance have a large mohawk of missed grass between the trench and the bed, indicating incomplete string trimming. (Pic 10)



11. Schedule an extensive cleanup on the western portion of Penzance. It is clear □ ...

□ the crews have not been servicing this portion of the property at the same frequency as the rest. The shrubs are uniformly overgrown, soft edging has not been completed in some time, and as previously noted, the seed pods remain on the palms. The list could continue. Please provide a timeline for when the entirety of Penzance will receive uniform maintenance. (Pic 11)



- 12. Noting improvement in the volunteer plants that were previously growing through the landscaped shrubs ☐ it appears many have been removed.
- 13. Hot spots are appearing in areas where irrigation coverage may be poor along Paseo Grande Blvd, on the eastern portion near Izarra Way (Pic 13).





- 14. Palm sprouts, broadleaf weeds, and other unwanted vegetation are visible in the beds nearest the lake on Paseo Grande, especially among the cypress trees.
- 15. The gazebos, which looked fantastic one month ago, are now showing signs of weed regeneration. There may be oversaturation in this area, so its worth assessing whether less irrigation is needed.
- 16. Evidence of chemical spray is visible in some of the gazebo beds, indicating that weed regrowth is not due to lack of effort but rather highly favorable growing conditions. How can we best address this to maintain long-term control?
- 17. Near Lightpole 77, a foxtail palm shows signs of fungal growth consistent with remnants of Ganoderma. Please test the palm or propose immediate removal and soil remediation. (Pic 17)



- 18. At the southwest corner of the gazebo, an irrigation leak was observed. While unverified, it appears to be a break in a lateral line beneath the surface. (Pic 18□)
- 19. Several newly planted trees on-site were observed with nursery guide poles still attached, which is not compliant with UF/IFAS planting standards and should be

corrected immediately. Nursery guide poles are meant only for transport and short-term nursery stabilization □eaving them in place after installation interferes with the tree s natural establishment by restricting trunk movement that strengthens structure and root anchorage. Additionally, the materials can trap moisture against the bark, creating decay and disease risk, and may cause girdling or injury to the cambium and apical meristem, resulting in poor upright growth and long-term deformities. To ensure proper development and compliance with IFAS standards, all nursery guide poles should be removed at planting, and trees should only be re-staked when necessary based on sitespecific conditions. (Pic 19)







- Hedge maintenance was underway at the time of the visit, with debris present and the project still in progress. It is understood that the area, particularly along Tulio Way, was cleaned upon completion of the work.
- 2. A mohawk of grass was missed around the lake edge on the Bibiana Way side.
- 3. Tree rings on Bibiana way are in need of a soft edge. Please schedule for this area.
- 4. Around the mailboxes, a variety of weeds ☐ including palm sprouts, crack weeds, broadleaf bed weeds, and torpedo grass ☐ are present. While trimming appears to be maintained, the finer details in this area seem to be getting overlooked.
- 5. For the third inspection in a row, the guide poles have been left in the black olives, already causing apical damage. (Pic 5)



- 6. The lack of mulch around the foxtails on Bibiana is allowing bed weeds to establish. Does Pinnacle provide mulch for this area?
- 7. Treat broadleaf turf weeds in the pavers on Bibiana Way and Adoncia. Also, a few car parking areas are in need as well.
- 8. Noting the construction materials have been moved off Adoncia near Emilia St. Need turf repair in this area.



- 1. The pruning of the hedges along Palba appears to have stopped near the end of the current trimming cycle. Was this area completed at a later date?
- 2. The recently laid sod on Palba has died and is now overrun with weeds. When can replacement be expected? (Pic 2)



- 3. Crack weeds are numerous along the pathway between Javiera and Nalda. Please schedule a treatment for this area.
- Another example of a broken apical stem was observed on Javiera Way, caused by improper installation with the guide pole still attached.



5. Another hot spot located near the corner of Sarita and Javiera Way (Pic 5□)





- The Sarita roundabout remains filled with invasive grasses. If no installation proposals are approved, at minimum remove the weeds from the bed and maintain the area.
- 2. The entrance of Sarita has new growth that may been sprayed but not entirely sure. Can clarity be provided?
- 3. Almost zero much is present around the Mercado roundabout. And broad leaf bed weeds are moving in. (Pic 3)



- 4. The ixora within the Mercado roundabout are showing clear signs of nutrient deficiency.
- 5. A large portion of the Mercado entrance is covered with broad leaf weeds. (Pic 5)



- The Provencia beds have broadleaf weeds beginning to cover the exposed soil. Please schedule a treatment.
- 7. Scalping observed around the Provencia roundabout. (Pic 7)



- 8. Palm sprouts are visible pushing through the Mexican petunias in the Provencia round about.
- 9. The Felisa Ct median has a significant portion of turf that is either heat-damaged or overtaken by turf weeds. (Pic 9)



- 10. The Felisa Ct roundabout needs a soft edge, as the turf is growing into the bed.
- 11. Please remove the dead plant material near the lake-edge oak across from the Rosalinda Roundabout.



 The rocks on Paseo Drive need a barrier separating them from the mulched area. Washout and other causes of rock movement have mixed the rocks into the mulch, leaving exposed soil between the curb and the rocked section (Pic 1).



- 3. Remove guide poles from newly planted trees on Paseo Drive.
- 4. The trinettes in the rocked areas have several large weeds growing among them. (Pic 4)
- 4
- 5. More crotons are dying along Paseo Drive. Please get a count and inform the board whether these are under warranty or need to be proposed for replacement. (Pic 5□)
- 6. Still some turf areas that need to fill in on Paseo Dr. by Esteban Dr. N.

- 7. Cut back Ornamental Grasses starting to encroach the Croton on the exit corner of Adelio Ln. and Paseo Dr. intersection.
- 8. Need to finish pruning the rest of the Firebush on Paseo Dr. It was cut back hard across the street from Dario Way. Asking if they will flush out soon?
- 9. Treat weeds in the beds growing up in the shrubs on Paseo Dr. between light poles □364 and □365.





 Dario Way entrance has a Florida strangler growing in the bed. Please remove mechanically. (Pic 1)



2. Adora Ct has damaged turf that is healing unevenly from previous damage. Continue monitoring for future growth and self-correction. (Pic 2)



- 3. The trinettes around the Adora roundabout need to be reduced, as the Croton Petras are barely visible behind them.
- Schedule a trim for the bougainvilleas around the Adario and Adelio Lane roundabout. (Pic 4□)





- 1. Noting the patch of dead turf near Esteban.
- Noting slight ruts visible on both the Esteban and Macario roundabouts. The Macario roundabout, in particular, showed heavy rutting during a previous inspection. What size mowers are being used in these areas? The tracks appear quite large.
- 3. At the East Esteban entrance, palm sprouts are popping up in force. Please treat this area. (Pic 3)



- 3. Bromeliad in the East Estaban entrance have signs of decline.
- The west Esteban landscaped area has overtrimmed shrubs that may be nearing the end of their lifespan. Please remove any dead plant material. (Pic 4)





 The Renata roundabout has ruts with patches of exposed soil forming around them. The sod may need replacement if it does not recover (Pic 1).



- 2. Please schedule a trim of the jasmine around the Renata roundabout.
- 3. Broadleaf weeds are emerging between the plant material in the roundabout. A soft edge is also needed in the same area. (Pic 3)

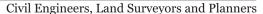

For the Paseo CDD BOS meeting scheduled for October 29, 2025, Barraco and Associates, Inc. ("BAI") ("District Engineer") offers the following updates under 3F. Staff Reports:

- Street lighting easement requests: District staff identified several locations where existing street lighting owned, operated and maintained by the District near the community entrance falls outside of the dedicated right-of-way. BAI staff survey-located the street lighting in this vicinity and identified three such light poles. Subsequently, BAI staff prepared a legal description and sketch for anticipated easements extending over those areas. A signed and sealed digital copy of the legal description and sketch was provided to District Management for further use in establishing easements over those areas described therein; a copy of the provided legal description and sketch is enclosed herein this memorandum. BAI staff is taking no further action on this item at this time.
- Comprehensive inspection of drainage storm sewer system: At the most recent BOS meeting, BAI staff was authorized to perform a comprehensive inspection of the community's 300+ storm sewer drainage structures. These structures are currently being inspected for sediment accumulation and/or any other noted deficiencies or signs of distress, with conditions noted within individual inspection reports for each structure. These individual reports will be compiled into a comprehensive overall inspection report provided to District Management. The storm sewer inspections are actively being performed and it is anticipated that all inspections will be completed for the upcoming BOS meeting. Additional updates will be provided during the BOS meeting should any further activity take place between now and the date of the meeting.
- In addition, BAI staff is continuing to obtain information on the following, outlined below.
 Additional updates will be provided during the BOS meeting should any further activity take place between now and the date of the meeting.
 - o Phase 2 condominium restoration fluid spill identification;
 - o Perimeter berm Phase 1 restoration limits;
 - Comprehensive lake bank inspection report (last lake bank inspection report provided June 2024).

CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Contractor Agreement (Hereinafter "Agreement") is made on this day between **Paseo Community Development District** c/o Rizzetta and Company (Hereinafter "Client")

and Crystal Clean (Hereinafter "Contractor")

It is agreed as follows:

1.1 RETAINER.

The Client hereby agrees to retain the Contractor to provide cleaning services as the Client and the Contractor may from time to time agree upon, (the "Services") and the Contractor hereby agrees to provide such Services to the Client.

1.2 TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement will stay in effect and continue until both parties agree to edit or modify the pricing and terms herein. Upon completion of this Agreement the Contractor shall return any property or documentation belonging to the Client and the Client shall return any property or documentation belonging to the Contractor.

1.3 COMPENSATION DETAILS AND SCHEDULE

The Client agrees to make payment to the Contractor before the end of each month for the completion of all services specified within this Agreement for the individual service or the month in which contracted services were rendered. All outstanding balances more than 60 days old will be marked unpaid and, subject to a 2% per month late fee penalty, and sent to a collection agency for credit bureau reporting. There may be an additional fee if the client requires a special "waiver of subrogation" for insurance coverage.

If the client uses an invoicing process service that charges Crystal Clean an annual fee for processing Crystal Clean invoices. Said fees, paid by Crystal Clean, will be reimbursed by the client.

The monthly cleaning fee equals the total weekly amount times 52 weeks and then divided by 12 months. The 5 main Holidays (New Years Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas) are paid holidays by Crystal Clean and thus do not adjust the monthly amount. Thus, the monthly fee is consistent and is not adjusted up or down based on the number of days in the month or the number of cleaning days in each month. For Holidays falling on non-cleaning days the closest cleaning service day would be considered a Holiday. Ex. If Christmas falls on a Saturday then the previous day, Friday, would be considered a Holiday. Special event cleaning and additional tasks beyond the agreement will be billed at an agreed upon hourly rate.

In order to help keep pace with inflation and cost of living increases: On January 1st of each successive year there will be a price increase of 3% unless both parties agree otherwise.

1.4 UNAUTHORIZED HIRING OF COMPANY EMPLOYEES

Personnel supplied by Crystal Clean are, for purposes of this agreement, deemed employees of Crystal Clean and will not for any purpose be considered employees or agents of the Client or any management company hired by the Client. The Client agrees to NOT contract with, offer employment to, or hire any of the employees or sub-contractors of Crystal Clean during the term of this agreement and for a period of 24 months following the termination of this agreement. The Client agrees to inform any management company hired by the Client of this provision in the contract, and to bind any such management company to the terms of this contract as well. Client agrees to indemnify Crystal Clean for any violation of this provision by its management company. The Client and Crystal Clean recognize that it can be difficult to place a value on the damages to Crystal Clean, should the Client or its management company violate this non-compete agreement, as they include such damages as lost productivity, training expenses, and increased operations costs among other damages. Accordingly, the Client and Crystal Clean agree that upon a violation of this provision, a liquidated damages amount shall be due Crystal Clean in the amount of Two (2) times the average annual billings for the client.

1.5 TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY CLIENT or CONTRACTOR

The Client or Contractor may terminate this agreement at any time by giving a full 30 day's notice of agreement cancellation in writing. The 30-day cancellation notice does not qualify if the client owes any outstanding, unpaid invoices.

1.6 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement between these parties with respect to all of the matters herein and its execution has not been included by, nor do any of the parties rely upon or regard as material, any representations or writings whatever not incorporated herein and made a part hereof and may not be amended or modified in any respect except by written instrument signed by the parties hereto. Any schedules referred to herein are incorporated by reference and form part of the Agreement.

1.7 GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida and Lee County without regard to the jurisdiction in which any action or special proceeding may be instituted.

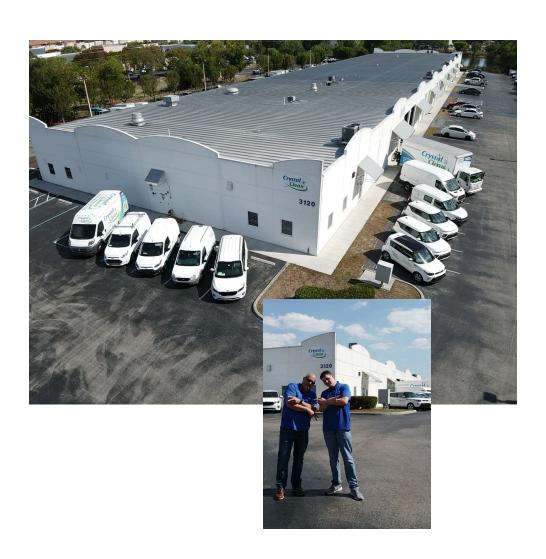

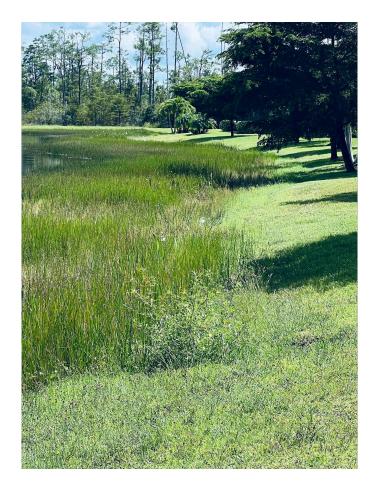

THIS SERVICES AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is effective as of the date indicated above (the "Effective Date"), by and between SOLitude Lake Management, LLC ("SOLitude" or "Company"), and the customer identified above (the "Customer"), in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

- 1. <u>SERVICES</u>. SOLitude will provide services (the "Services") at the Customer's property in accordance with the Scope of Services attached hereto as Schedule A.
- 2. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Any deviation from the requirements and Services outlined in Schedule A involving extra cost of material and labor will result in extra charges. Such additional services will be provided by SOLitude only upon a Change Order mutually approved by the parties in writing (the "Change Order").
- 3. <u>PRICING</u>. The Customer agrees to pay for the Services, as well as any applicable sales or other taxes, in accordance with the Pricing Schedule attached hereto as Schedule B.
- 4. PAYMENT. SOLitude shall invoice Customer following completion of each required Service. Payment is due within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. Any disputes with an invoice or invoices must be brought to the attention of SOLitude by written notice within one hundred and twenty (120) days from the invoice date, otherwise Company will not be liable for any potential credits or adjustments. The parties agree to use good faith efforts to resolve any disputed invoice amounts within thirty (30) days after written notification of a dispute. Disputed amounts shall not affect payment of all undisputed amounts, and Customer agrees to pay all undisputed amounts owed on any disputed invoice within the applicable due dates. Invoices not paid on or before the invoice due date shall accrue interest charges at a rate of one percent (1%) per month, accruing as of the invoice date, until the time that such amounts are paid in full. Additionally, the Customer is liable for payment of all costs of collection of past due accounts, specifically including, but not limited to, court costs, expenses, and reasonable attorneys' fees. In addition to the compensation paid to SOLitude for performance of the Services, Customer shall reimburse Customer for all of the expenses paid or incurred by SOLitude in connection with the Services, including, but not limited to non-routine expenses, administrative fees, compliance fees, or any other similar expense that are incurred as a result of requirements placed on SOLitude by the Customer that are not covered specifically by the written specifications of this Agreement ("Reimbursable Expenses").

COMPANY DISCLAIMS ANY LIABILITY OR RESPONSIBILITY REGARDING THE PRACTICES AND OPERATIONS OF THE CUSTOMER, AND BEARS NO RESPONSIBILITY OR LIABILITY FOR WHETHER THE CUSTOMER CARRIES OUT THE RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY COMPANY AND IN NO EVENT WILL COMPANY BE LIABLE FOR CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT, OR ECONOMIC DAMAGES. THE CUSTOMER SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD COMPANY HARMLESS FROM AND AGAINST ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, LIABILITIES, OBLIGATIONS, AND ATTORNEYS' FEES OR COSTS BROUGHT BY ANY THIRD PARTIES, ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT OR BY FAILURE OF THE CUSTOMER TO ACT IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY LEGAL REQUIREMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SERVICES DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE A. COMPANY SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY DELAY IN PERFORMING THE SERVICES, NOR LIABLE FOR ANY FAILURE TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES, DUE TO ANY CAUSE BEYOND ITS REASONABLE CONTROL. COMPANY WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ONLY THOSE DAMAGES, CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, INJURIES, OR LEGAL COSTS CAUSED BY ITS OWN DIRECT NEGLIGENCE OR MISCONDUCT, BUT THEN ONLY TO AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THE ANNUAL FEES CHARGED UNDER THE AGREEMENT.

"Confidential Information" means any information disclosed by one party ("Discloser") to the other party ("Recipient"), either directly or indirectly, in writing, orally, or by inspection of tangible objects, other than information that the Recipient can establish (i) was publicly known and made generally available in the public domain prior to the time of disclosure; (ii) becomes publicly known and made generally available after disclosure other than through Recipient's action or inaction; or (iii) is in Recipient's possession, without confidentiality restrictions, at the time of disclosure by Discloser as shown by Recipient's files and records immediately prior to the time of disclosure. Recipient shall not at any time (a) disclose, sell, license, transfer, or otherwise make available to any person or entity any Confidential Information, or (b) use, reproduce, or otherwise copy any Confidential Information, except as necessary in connection with the purpose for which such Confidential Information is disclosed to Recipient or as required by applicable law. Recipient agrees to take all reasonable measures to protect the secrecy of and avoid disclosure and unauthorized use of the confidential information. All Confidential Information shall at all times remain the property of Discloser, and all documents, electronic media, and other tangible items containing or relating to any Confidential Information shall be delivered to Discloser immediately upon the request of Discloser.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if Recipient is required by law, regulation, subpoena, government order, regulatory agency order, judicial order, or other court order to disclose any Confidential Information, Recipient shall give the Disclosing Party timely and lawful written notice of such a requirement prior to such disclosure, and shall reasonably and lawfully cooperate with the Disclosing Party to seek a protective order, confidential treatment, or other appropriate measures for such Confidential Information.



- 11. <u>FORCE MAJEURE</u>. The Company shall not be liable for any delay in performing the Services, nor liable for any failure to provide the Services, due to any cause beyond its reasonable control.
- 12. <u>RIGHT TO SUBCONTRACT</u>. The Company, in its sole discretion, may subcontract or delegate to an affiliate or third party any of its duties and obligations hereunder.
- 13. <u>FUEL/TRANSPORTATION SURCHARGE</u>. Like many other companies that are impacted by the price of gasoline, a rise in gasoline prices may necessitate a fuel surcharge. As such, the Company reserves the right to add a fuel surcharge to Customer's invoice for any increase in the cost of fuel as measured above the same time period in the prior year (by the National U.S. Average Motor Gasoline-Regular Fuel Price per Gallon Index reported by the U.S. Department of Energy). The surcharge may be adjusted monthly (up or down) with the price of gasoline.
- 14. <u>ANTI-CORRUPTION AND BRIBERY.</u> Each party represents that neither it nor anyone acting on its behalf has offered, given, requested or accepted any undue financial or other advantage of any kind in entering into this Agreement, and that it will comply with all applicable laws and regulations pertaining to corruption, competition and bribery in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Any claim, dispute or controversy, regarding any contract, tort, statute, or 17. otherwise ("Claim"), arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the relationships among the parties hereto shall be resolved by one arbitrator through binding arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association ("AAA"), under the AAA Commercial or Consumer, as applicable, Rules in effect at the time the Claim is filed ("AAA Rules"). Copies of the AAA Rules and forms can be located at www.adr.org, or by calling 1-800-778-7879. The arbitrator's decision shall be final, binding, and non-appealable. Judgment upon the award may be entered and enforced in any court having jurisdiction. This clause is made pursuant to a transaction involving interstate commerce and shall be governed by the Federal Arbitration Act. Neither party shall sue the other party other than as provided herein or for enforcement of this clause or of the arbitrator's award; any such suit may be brought only in Federal District Court for the District in which the services were performed or, if any such court lacks jurisdiction, in any state court that has jurisdiction. The arbitrator, and not any federal, state, or local court, shall have exclusive authority to resolve any dispute relating to the interpretation, applicability, unconscionability, arbitrability, enforceability or formation of this Agreement including any claim that all or any part of the Agreement is void or voidable. Venue for arbitration hereunder shall be within the state where the customer's property, that is the subject of the services provided, is located.
- 18. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. The Company may assign this Agreement to a related or affiliated entity upon written notice to the Customer.



- 19. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices, requests, consents, claims, demands, waivers and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be directed to the individuals and addresses listed in the signature block. Notices sent in accordance with this Section shall be deemed effectively given: (a) when received, if delivered by hand (with written confirmation of receipt); (b) when received, if sent by a nationally recognized overnight courier (receipt requested); or (c) on the third (3rd) business day after the date mailed, by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid.
- 20. DISCLAIMER. SOLitude is not responsible for the failure of any treatment, equipment installation, or other work that may result from dam or other structural failures, severe weather and storms, flooding, or other acts of God that are outside of the control of SOLitude. Customer understand and acknowledge that there are irrigation restrictions associated with many of the products used to treat lakes and ponds. The Customer is responsible for notifying SOLitude in advance of the contract signing and the start of the Agreement if they utilize any of the water in their lakes or ponds for irrigation purposes. The Customer accepts full responsibility for any issues that may arise from the irrigation of turf, ornamentals, trees, crops, or any other plants as a result of treated water being used by the Customer for irrigation without the consent or knowledge of SOLitude. Although there is rarely direct fish toxicity with the products used for treatment when applied at the labeled rate, or the installation and normal operation of the equipment we install, there is a risk under certain circumstances of significant dissolved oxygen drops. This risk is most severe in times of extremely hot weather and warm water temperatures, as these are the conditions during which dissolved oxygen levels are naturally at their lowest levels. Oftentimes, lakes and ponds will experience natural fish kills under these conditions even if no work is performed. Every effort, to include the method and timing of application, the choice of products and equipment used, and the skill and training of the staff, is made to avoid such problems. However, the Customer understands and accepts that there is always a slight risk of the occurrence of adverse conditions outside the control of SOLitude that will result in the death of some fish and other aquatic life. The Customer also understands and accepts that similar risks would remain even if no work was performed. The Customer agrees to hold SOLitude harmless for any issues with fish or other aquatic life which occur as described above, or are otherwise outside the direct control of SOLitude, unless there is willful negligence on the part of SOLitude.
- 21. <u>BINDING</u>. This Agreement shall insure to the benefit of and be binding upon the legal representatives and successors of the parties.
- 22. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter and replaces any prior agreements or understandings, whether in writing or otherwise. 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Α.

Ms. Blandon advised that Mr. Fowler was not present, but Board members are welcome to send questions via email. She advised that rust spots have been noticed and asked Mr. Galeano if the additive was still being used in the irrigation system. Mr. Galeano confirmed. Mr. Cabell expressed the importance of weed control in the right of way and the curb cut out parking areas, he further advised of sucker growth on a Shady Lady along Paseo Drive.

B. Landscape Liaison

Ms. Johnson provided an overview of proposals executed since the last meeting advising that most were on the July and/or August Landscape reports. She advised that Pinnacle has been advised to focus on the following: restoration of plants at the Southeast gazebo, plants along Paseo Drive, and Weed control/edging. Mr. Cabell inquired as to a sod concern on Esteban Drive. Ms. Johnson advised that the area of concern is part of a proposal that has been approved.

C. Condo Assoc. Liaison
