CHAIRMAN LEWIS: Two very good questions. So we started this endeavor four or five years ago. We had been approached by some residents -- actually, more specifically, in Glencliff Park, to the south, about poor reception in Harbor Links, portions of Harbor Links, Glencliff Road or street or drive -- whatever it is -- and then also in the area -- I'm sorry, Andy, is there a way to -- can he mute himself if he's not -- thank you. We started working on -- with a developer -- Vertex, who is the one who is developing the tower back this way.

Went through a very long process. It had to deal with the county, land use communities, things like that. Because we wanted to improve -- we felt it was a safety issue. COVID had

list. We actually, at the time, had a little bit different board. Different supervisors at the time, but we did a blind, you know, study of what was our top priority and every one of them blindly was safety for residents and improved cell service.

So nobody had anything to do with, you know, monetary revenue or anything like that. It's just sort of icing on the cake, if you will.

MR. SANTOS: And I wasn't insinuating that that was the main --

CHAIRMAN LEWIS: No, no, I know you didn't. I'm just letting you know because we've had that question come up with a lot.

The other thing was -- your other question about carriers. We have been told by the developer that -- is it --

MS. McCORMICK: Yeah, they have two -they have two subleases for any tenants that are going to be going up on the tower. The first one is T-Mobile and the second one is AT&T. I don't know if there will be others after that, but at least those two carriers, right now, have sublease agreements to go on

just hit. There was issues with people being -- you know, no landlines. I'm sure the majority of people don't have a landline anymore and so it became more of a safety issue for this board and we wanted to help improve the community that way. So we went down that

The one at Glencliff Park was not approved by the county. Apparently, they don't do cell phone towers in parks anymore, but we did have a parcel B, which is the one here in the TECO easement.

So to answer your question in a very short sense, that's -- that's the reason. Is there revenue from the tower? Yes, there will be revenue from the tower. We actually worked with --

MS. McCORMICK: There already is, some has already --

CHAIRMAN LEWIS: There is, that's correct. We worked with a consultant that helped us to kind of negotiate that. There is actually consultants that deal, specifically, with cell phone tower developers and so -- it's not something that was like at the top of our

the tower.

MR. SANTOS: So they can only have the two --

MS. McCORMICK: Right.

MR. SANTOS: Just -- they can only have two at a time?

MS. McCORMICK: No, that's why I'm saying, there may be others that are going to co-locate, but at this point, they have those in place and -- and of course, the antennas have not been put on the tower yet. The tower will probably -- I talked with Vertex's manager today and he said that they are expecting they'll probably get the CO next week and then the first carrier, T-Mobile, will start its process of getting the antenna up and he was going to check on their schedule, but it typically takes them a few weeks and then, you know, maybe another few weeks after that before they are operational.

MR. SANTOS: Okay. And just to -- if the -- if the reason was to help the residents, then how are we going to -- can we at least try to get a couple more carriers because the major ones, like Verizon -- I'm lucky to have AT&T,

I think that we've had some just e-mailed in because of other frustrations -- we have tried -- I know I have tried to informally work with the homeowners association to get this resolved and that's why, at this point, we -at least I feel like one of these boards needs to do something to potentially prevent something that would be very detrimental to our community.

MR. GILLIS: The exchanges between golfers and residents or visitors are in the control of the HOA and in both cases, they've elected to say, "I don't have a" -- "a say in that."

MR. WIMSATT: Yeah, and I think I would say that the difference between aggressive dogs in the parks is that the parks are under our control. It's something we have power to -our jurisdiction. We don't have jurisdiction over the -- you know, the HOA documents or the ability to force them legally or do anything, really, with them at all. So -- you know, a motion to clarify the position, I think that's great. They can take a stand because it's about the extent of what we can do.

MR. GILLIS: Because the issue here is easements. So if you look in your folders, the golf course has supplied them, that golf course could not be in existence without easements around it. Period. It could not be there. And unfortunately, those easements are -- over This is not like -- so I would say, the WOW published an article. Karen was not here to verify the information, but she told me that one of the residents that disagreed called and threatened the WOW to sue them over false information published. The WOW just simply said, "The information is accurate and we're not going to do that," and I can tell you I've heard that same argument screamed at me on the golf course by a resident repeatedly.

So we can keep doing this or we can do something about it.

CHAIRMAN LEWIS: Did you have something? MR. CHESNEY: Well, has the golf course owner like taken any action on your behalf -on behalf of its customers?

MR. GILLIS: Well, they -- they came and provided all this -- it's a lot worse than what we're describing. The answer is they've become more aggressive with the police because we've got residents -- well, I keep saying you should not say it's residents for sure, but we are constant break-ins at the golf course, we have a lot of issues going on with the edges of it and there's no proof. I've suggested they put

But what the general manager pointed out to me is that there is no doubt that annually, they lose revenue based on a negative impression. There are plenty of negative reviews about the Westchase golf course from visitors, like for example, Canada. Specifically, on one hole -- as these golfers will tell you -- it's very -- it's almost inherent that you're going to have a bad exchange because of the design of the golf hole. There is nothing else there. The golf course as well as the golf lake -- we've done everything we can. We even changed the golf rule for that hole so that you don't tee off twice simply to try to avoid the confrontation with residents and nothing seems to be helping.

My -- I'm not an engineer and I'm not here to offer engineering solutions, but all of this starting happening when they had that development. So yes, we had six homes impacted, and I just got to tell you, it all seems very academic until you see your neighbor, but these are our neighbors. Everybody in here is our neighbor and could, very easily, have been us. But three places -- two on Montague and one on Bayboro -- totally impassable, so the entirety of the Bridges -- hundreds of homes -- could not get and out of their community for at least two days.

CHAIRMAN LEWIS: Okay. Well, let me just

understand hydrology and hydraulics and -- and I'm hoping that I can explain that -- at first or at least initially -- with a little bit of background on what's going on and what the -- how the past is sort of affecting the present.

If you went back a hundred years ago, the drainage patterns back then were pretty much the same as they are now. Everything runs from the north, runs to the south and to the southwest. It would travel through -- over land and get into wetland areas and wetland areas would dump into other wetland areas and it would work its way right down to Tampa Bay. And eventually, the property became a farm. It was -- it was used for agriculture and the farmer that owned the land cut ditches and crisscrossed the property in order to make it drain more effectively. They made -- they made these ditches in order to get water off the property so that they could graze cattle and grow crops.

And so when you -- when you look at the TECO easement -- which you guys are all familiar with because it's across the lake -- on the far side of that easement, there's a

and it directs it further south. And of course, now -- I mean that's -- Westchase gets developed and when Westchase got developed, that property was not even part of the parcel that became Westchase.

So the -- the drainage design within the community is such that the run off from your roofs and your streets and your yards all go into -- you see this storm water pond. Right? The -- there's ponds dotted throughout the community, and these ponds were -- are mandated by the Water Management District to provide water quality benefits. In other words, to treat the dirty water that comes off the streets, and it also was designed to discharge at a certain rate because if you take farmland and make it rooftops and roads, you're going to increase the amount of runoff that happens. So to prevent all this additional runoff from flooding the person downstream, you hold it back in a pond and it discharges through a structure and then from there, it goes into the same wetlands that were there a hundred years ago and it works its way down to Tampa Bay. And when you look at the area that is

ditch that runs north and south. That was there from back in the farmers days. That's how old that ditch is. 50 years old, probably.

So -- and then you have the lake -- not just our lake -- well, the lake to the north, the lake that we're talking about, the lake on the other side of the TECO easement, were dug by the farmer. Those were borrow pits. My guess is they sold the fill and the lakes were created by the farmer. There was not a single house around. That lake has been there since the early '90s, probably the mid '80s. And to facilitate drainage, they took that ditch that runs along the TECO easement, interconnected some pipes and the two lakes that are on either side of the easement are interconnected by a series of pipes on the TECO easement.

So our -- the water that comes from the north goes into the lake behind your houses and it has to go across the TECO easement, and once you get it over to the other lake, there is a -- there's a -- Linebaugh Avenue -- and Linebaugh was in place back when they dug those lakes and there's a pipe that goes under Linebaugh and it takes the water from that lake

draining into -- and not a single drop of
Westchase water drains to that lake. Not a
single drop. Maybe a little bit from the backs
of your lots, but there is not a pipe that
connects to that lake. There's not any
drainage. All of that drainage is to the north
and all the way to the east to Sheldon Road.
It all comes down from the east to the west to
that TECO easement, comes south down the TECO
easement and it goes into the lake on the east
side and it goes into our lake.

And then, it -- it fills up and then it goes into a wetland area on the south side of Linebaugh and goes through a structure -- a control structure on the south side of Linebaugh. All of these -- this legacy infrastructure was not designed to provide a certain level of service. In other words, when you design storm water systems in our community, they provide attenuation for a 25-year storm. They are designed to contain, in the banks, a hundred-year storm. These lakes were not designed to anything. There is absolutely no expected level of service. There is nothing -- there is

Page 63

no -- they were dug by a farmer, they were interconnected by a farmer and -- and so the expectation is when you live on a storm-water pond, it better contain a hundred-year storm. That's what it was designed for. These lakes were not designed for anything and -- and we've had a lot of growth and a lot of additional development in that watershed.

And the fellow that said, "Hey, this didn't start until that apartment complex came in," I 100 percent believe him. That's 100 percent believable to me. I didn't live here and I didn't see it personally, but that doesn't surprise me at all because what we have is a large area that's draining into these lakes and it's got a very limited outfall capacity. There is very little ability for water to drain out because you have pipes under TECO that are -- were not sized to provide any level of conveyance. You have a pipe under Linebaugh that was -- it's probably been in place for 40 years and it was sized for conveyance of like a bunch of pastureland. And so the idea is -- or the point I'm trying to get across is the CDD has no ability whatsoever

they are just very limited.

So a long-term solution -- when we say that -- you got to imagine you're looking at getting a -- a county agency involved. I don't know if Linebaugh -- Linebaugh is not a state road, is it?

MS. WHYTE: No, it's county.

MR. DVORAK: It's a county road. You've got TECO -- another bureaucracy -- and then you've got the Water Management District. So all of these agencies have to be working together with someone driving the ship and then -- and then being able to get permits because you don't just go do something that affects like -- you know, affects things regionally. You have to go through a permit process with the county and you have to go through the Water Management District. That's a long-term -- that's a long-term project.

The short-term project was exactly what you said. You mentioned it. You said, "Listen, we have this water that comes through in between houses all the time. Can we get that addressed," and that's exactly what my short-term solution addresses. It's building

That's part of the regulatory infrastructure that is in place nowadays.

So when you -- when you listen to the -- when we talk about short-term solutions, what I am getting at is this CDD has basically one strip of property around that lake that it can control. It cannot control anything else. All these other factors, all these other things, are out of the CDD's control. So its ability -- and they have been very attentive in listening to some of the ideas that I have, but

up the berm to a point that would prevent those annual storms from saturating your yard and coming through in between your houses and into your lanais and that's -- that's what the short-term project is. We have a design. It's on paper -- it's been designed.
