THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on September 26, 2025

Ms. Blandon presented the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' meeting held on September 26, 2025, and asked if there were any questions, comments, or changes to the minutes. There were none.

On a Motion by Mr. Pate, seconded by Mr. McGibbon, with all in favor, the Board approved the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on September 26, 2025, for the CFM Community Development District.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ratification of the Operations and Maintenance Expenditures for the Month of September 2025

Ms. Blandon advised that operations and maintenance expenditures for the period of September 1-30 totaled \$106,520.78. She asked if there were any questions. The Board inquired about 3 fountains at a higher cost to operate. The Board discussed that the pond is deeper and larger than the others.

On a Motion by Mr. Gile, seconded by Ms. Lieberman, with all in favor, the Board Ratified the Operations and Maintenance Expenditures for the Month of September 2025, totaling \$106,520.78, for the CFM Community Development District.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion Regarding Roadway Classification and Gate Access

Supervisor Streeter asked to put this on the agenda due to community access issues. She informed the Board that she was advised by the Lake County Sheriff's Office that the community is very safe with minimal calls received involving people coming in causing issues and problems. Ms. Streeter opened the floor for discussion for resident Howard Michalski to discuss his opinions on the matter. Mr. Michalski stated for the record his goal is to clarify a few facts regarding the roads and asked the Board to approve his proposed motion allowing the HOA to explore and implement lawful access control measures without being constrained by the ongoing public road interpretation. Mr. Michalski then gave an overview of his statement to the Board regarding the roadways and access control. Tucker Mackie commented on the roads and explained why they are public. She stated that at the end of the day, the District cannot deny access but can request information in the event of an incident. The Board then went into discussion regarding post orders. Ms. Streeter stated that gate access for those who have no identification is minimal and are usually vendors or deliveries.

Howard Michalski asked Ms. Mackie about liability regarding a non-resident causing damage on private roads not associated with a homeowner. Ms. Mackie

explained the liability and security to Mr. Michalski. Discussion regarding post orders will be reviewed by the HOA, Ms. Streeter will send Mr. Michalski the post orders for review.

Supervisor Streeter then commented on opposing the FDOT permit for Emerald Lakes delineation poles in front of the community and requesting they look into the submitted traffic study for signalization. Ms. Mackie informed the Board that the District is the permittee and is not responsible for signalization requirements. Ms. Mackie advised that Mary Molten with Forestar, will attend the November meeting to direct the Board on how they will be engaging with FDOT to provide for and start the process to signalize the intersection.

Supervisor Streeter also presented a question as to whether a resident petition to FDOT to proceed with signalization might be something that has positive influence on future decisions. Ms. Mackie stated that they will know more information from Forestar at the November meeting. Ms. Streeter agreed to wait for the November meeting, Ms. Mackie will prepare a letter to FDOT to encourage them to move forward after speaking with Forestar at the November meeting.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Staff Reports

A. Landscape Inspection Report

Spencer Gonzales reported updates on the community. Mr. Gonzales reported the community is improving but has a higher standard moving forward to sustain the level of work. Progress has been made on Crosswater, not all weeds have been removed but 80% have been cleared. Mr. Gonzales reported on declining magnolias around the community and recommends a different species. He addressed clippings in the lake and will reach out to Yellowstone regarding communication. He reported that the east side of Cherry Palm has a fence line that needs to be cut back. Ms. Blandon informed the Board and Mr. Gonzales she has obtained clearance from SFWMD for trimming the overgrown fence line.

Ms. Blandon spoke on a homeowner trimming a buffer on Pigeon Plum that will lead to compliance issues from SFWMD. Ms. Blandon will reach out to the HOA to send a letter to the homeowner. Supervisor Streeter stated there is a dead palm on the other side of the buffer and needs to be removed by either the homeowner or Yellowstone. Ms. Streeter then inquired about the fence line on Cherry Plum and why it has been neglected. Ms. Blandon stated it was the Golf Course's responsibility to trim up to the fence line but confusion began with the placement of the conservation signage. Ms. Blandon will ask Yellowstone to review the area and report back.

Mr. Gonzales reported on a space by the mailboxes that Yellowstone went ahead and removed the weeds. He stated that the Mexican petunia is invasive and should be taken out. He commented on the lakes on Palmetto and other landscape priorities. Supervisor Streeter inquired about sidewalks being unkept and what the policy is for trimming back. Mr. Gonzales informed Supervisor Streeter that Yellowstone is flexible regarding trimming and he will reach out regarding the issue.

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Ms. Blandon informed the Board the monument sign was pressure-washed but the vendor missed the top and will be back out to complete the work. Ms. Blandon also informed the Board of the schedule for painting the monument sign and once painting is completed she will schedule Yellowstone to implement the annuals so that they are ready for the holidays. Ms. Blandon shared the email from Howard Michalski with the Board and will circulate as well. She also informed the Board she has been working with Yellowstone regarding the enhancements and enhancement proposal. She will meet with Michael Sealey to talk about the areas that the Board wants renderings for which will primarily be the medians and guard house improvements. Once she has that she will put it in the agenda packet for November for consideration and will ask them to attend the meeting. One of the biggest issues that is still being addressed is the irrigation repairs that have not been completed. Ms. Blandon reported that they will have to address this with the HOA because of the concern of dead areas during dry season due to the irrigation not working. Ms. Blandon received Yellowstone's response to the Landscape Inspection Report and will send to the Board for review. She also mentioned working with Spencer on the structural pruning of the oaks along the main and will put out for bid.

The Board inquired about Lake Bank repairs moving forward. Ms. Blandon informed the Board that she will speak with Mark Zordan regarding the lake bank repairs but recommended review of the linear erosion first in order to be in compliance with the permit. Ms. Blandon will make sure the maps are updated. She advised discussion and review of lake maps at the next meeting, Afterward, they will move forward with obtaining bids.

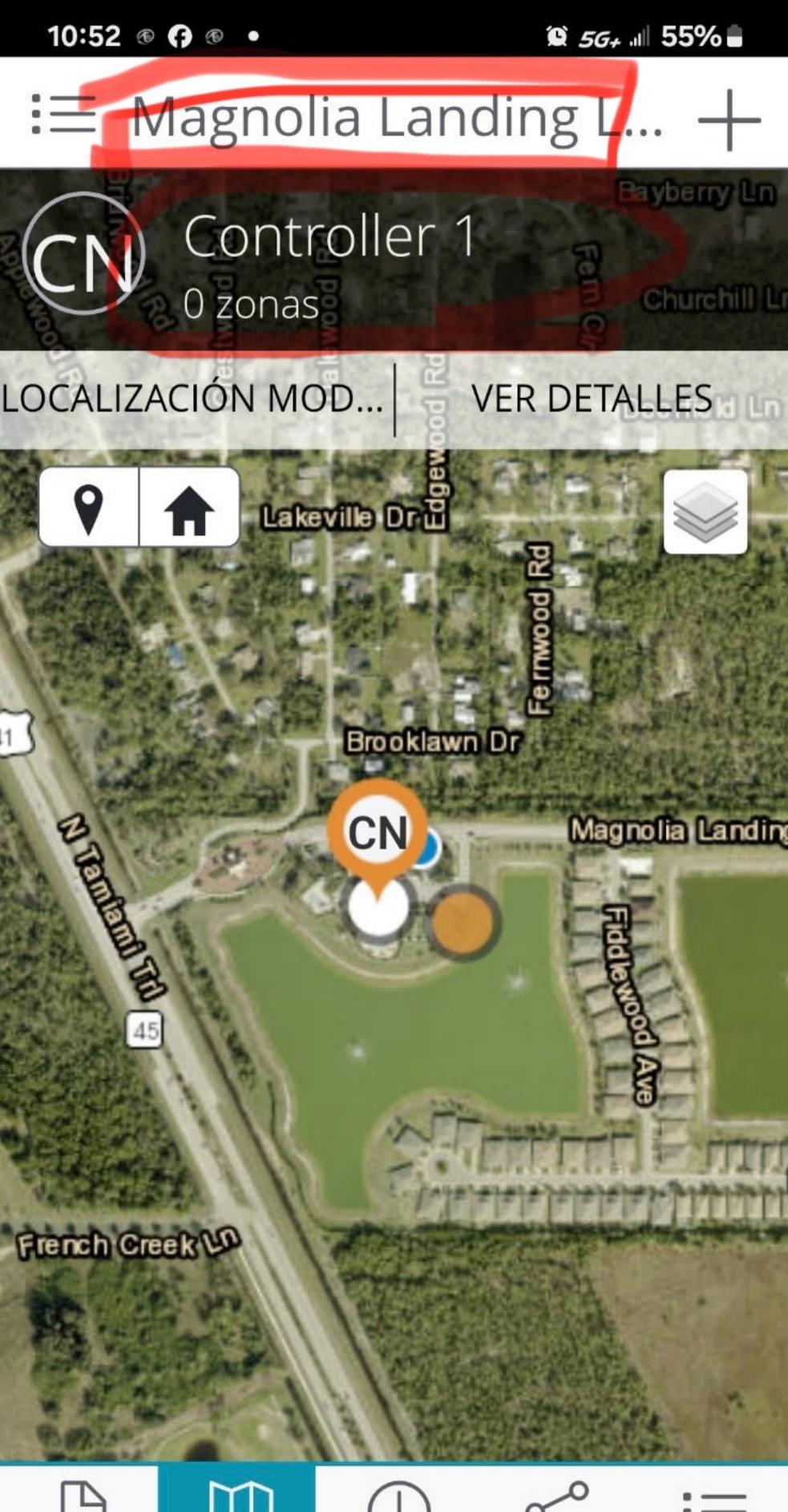

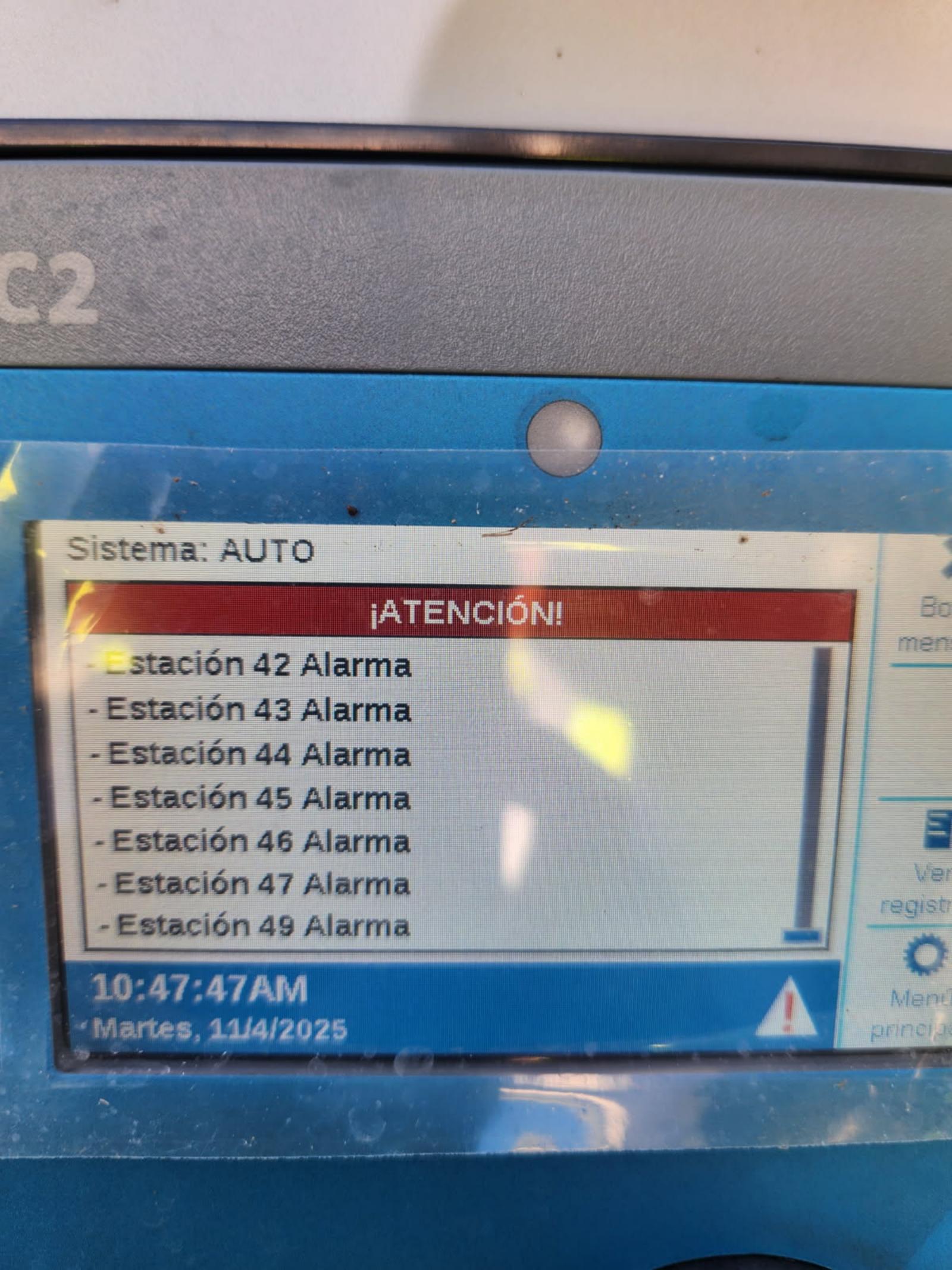

Compliance Audit Overview

The Community Website Compliance Audit (CWCA) consists of a thorough assessment of Florida Community Development District (CDD) websites to assure that specified district information is available and fully accessible. Florida Statute Chapter 189.069 states that effective October, 2015, every CDD in the state is required to maintain a fully compliant website for reporting certain information and documents for public access.

The CWCA is a reporting system comprised of quarterly audits and an annual summary audit to meet full disclosure as required by Florida law. These audits are designed to assure that CDDs satisfy all compliance requirements stipulated in Chapter 189.069.

Compliance Criteria

The CWCA focuses on the two primary areas – website accessibility as defined by U.S. federal laws, and the 16-point criteria enumerated in <u>Florida Statute Chapter</u> 189.069.



ADA Website Accessibility

Several federal statutes (American Disabilities Act, Sec. 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973) require public institutions to ensure they are not discriminating against individuals on the basis of a person's disability. Community websites are required to conform to web content accessibility guidelines – WCAG 2.1, which is the international standard established to keep websites barrier-free and the recognized standard for ADA-compliance.



Florida Statute Compliance

Pursuant to F.S. <u>189.069</u>, every CDD is required to maintain a dedicated website to serve as an official reporting mechanism covering, at minimum, 16 criteria. The information required to report and have fully accessible spans: establishment charter or ordinance, fiscal year audit, budget, meeting agendas and minutes and more. For a complete list of statute requirements, see page 3.

Audit Process

The Community Website Compliance Audit covers all CDD web pages and linked PDFs.* Following the <u>WCAG 2.1</u> levels A, AA, and AAA for web content accessibility, a comprehensive scan encompassing 312 tests is conducted for every page. In addition, a human inspection is conducted to assure factors such as navigation and color contrasts meet web accessibility standards. See page 4 for complete accessibility grading criteria.

In addition to full ADA-compliance, the audit includes a 16-point checklist directly corresponding with the criteria set forth in Florida Statute Chapter 189.069. See page 5 for the complete compliance criteria checklist.

* NOTE: Because many CDD websites have links to PDFs that contain information required by law (meeting agendas, minutes, budgets, miscellaneous and ad hoc documents, etc.), audits include an examination of all associated PDFs. PDF remediation and ongoing auditing is critical to maintaining compliance.

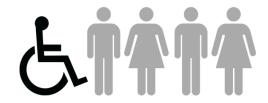

Accessibility overview

Everyone deserves equal access.

With nearly 1-in-5 Americans having some sort of disability – visual, hearing, motor, cognitive – there are literally millions of reasons why websites should be fully accessible and compliant with all state and federal laws. Web accessibility not only keeps board members on the right side of the law, but enables the entire community to access all your web content. The very principles that drive accessible website design are also good for those without disabilities.

The legal and right thing to do

Several federal statutes (American Disabilities Act, Sec. 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973) require public institutions to ensure they are not discriminating against individuals on the basis of a person's disability. Community websites are required to conform to web content accessibility guidelines, WCAG 2.1, the international standard established to keep websites barrier-free. Plain and simple, any content on your website must be accessible to everyone.



ADA Compliance Categories

Most of the problems that occur on a website fall in one or several of the following categories.



Contrast and colors

Some people have vision disabilities that hinder picking up contrasts, and some are color blind, so there needs to be a distinguishable contrast between text and background colors. This goes for buttons, links, text on images – everything. Consideration to contrast and color choice is also important for extreme lighting conditions.

Using semantics to format your HTML pages

When web page codes are clearly described in easy-to-understand terms, it enables broader sharing across all browsers and apps. This 'friendlier' language not only helps all the users, but developers who are striving to make content more universal on more devices.



Text alternatives for non-text content

Written replacements for images, audio and video should provide all the same descriptors that the non-text content conveys. Besides helping with searching, clear, concise word choice can make vivid non-text content for the disabled.

Ability to navigate with the keyboard

Not everyone can use a mouse. Blind people with many with motor disabilities have to use a keyboard to make their way around a website. Users need to be able to interact fully with your website by navigating using the tab, arrows and return keys only. A "skip navigation" option is also required. Consider using WAI-ARIA for improved accessibility, and properly highlight the links as you use the tab key to make sections.

Easy to navigate and find information

Finding relevant content via search and easy navigation is a universal need. Alt text, heading structure, page titles, descriptive link text (no 'click here' please) are just some ways to help everyone find what they're searching for. You must also provide multiple ways to navigate such as a search and a site map.

Properly formatting tables

Tables are hard for screen readers to decipher. Users need to be able to navigate through a table one cell at a time. In addition to the table itself needing a caption, row and column headers need to be labeled and data correctly associated with the right header.

Making PDFs accessible

PDF files must be tagged properly to be accessible, and unfortunately many are not. Images and other non-text elements within that PDF also need to be ADA-compliant. Creating anew is one thing; converting old PDFs – called PDF remediation – takes time.

Making videos accessible

Simply adding a transcript isn't enough. Videos require closed captioning and detailed descriptions (e.g., who's on-screen, where they are, what they're doing, even facial expressions) to be fully accessible and ADA compliant.

Making forms accessible

Forms are common tools for gathering info and interacting. From logging in to registration, they can be challenging if not designed to be web-accessible. How it's laid out, use of labels, size of clickable areas and other aspects need to be considered.

Alternate versions

Attempts to be fully accessible sometimes fall short, and in those cases, alternate versions of key pages must be created. That is, it is sometimes not feasible (legally, technically) to modify some content. These are the 'exceptions', but still must be accommodated.



Feedback for users

To be fully interactive, your site needs to be able to provide an easy way for users to submit feedback on any website issues. Clarity is key for both any confirmation or error feedback that occurs while engaging the page.



Other related requirements

No flashing

Blinking and flashing are not only bothersome, but can be disorienting and even dangerous for many users. Seizures can even be triggered by flashing, so avoid using any flashing or flickering content.

Timers

Timed connections can create difficulties for the disabled. They may not even know a timer is in effect, it may create stress. In some cases (e.g., purchasing items), a timer is required, but for most school content, avoid using them.

Fly-out menus

Menus that fly out or down when an item is clicked are helpful to dig deeper into the site's content, but they need to be available via keyboard navigation, and not immediately snap back when those using a mouse move from the clickable area.

No pop-ups

Pop-up windows present a range of obstacles for many disabled users, so it's best to avoid using them altogether. If you must, be sure to alert the user that a pop-up is about to be launched.

508	An amendment to the Rehabilitation Act that eliminates barriers in information technology for the disabled
ADA	American with Disabilities Act (1990)
Screen reader	Software technology that transforms the on-screen text into an audible voice. Includes tools for navigating/accessing web pages.
Website accessibility	Making your website fully accessible for people of all abilities
W3C	World Wide Web Consortium – the international body that develops standards for using the web

General Updates, Recent & Upcoming Maintenance Event

- There has been a discrepancy regarding some small areas to maintain at the end of ADV. After reviewing the site, speaking with the resident, consulting the GIS, and considering the scope changes since the contract was awarded, it is my opinion that this area should continue to be maintained by Yellowstone until a new scope is developed that accurately reflects the CDD landscape vendor's responsibilities. At which point if needed, this area can be reassessed.
- Along those same lines, it's important to keep track of the proper scopes as they develop.
 Institutional knowledge must be built to ensure that, if Yellowstone is no longer the vendor in the future, we can clearly communicate to any successor what falls within the bounds of their scope.
- The walkway on Magnolia Landing was inspected closely. There will be several items in this report regarding these observations.

The following are action items for Yellowstone Landscape to complete. Please refer to the item # in your response listing action already taken or anticipated time of completion. Red text indicates deficient from previous report. Bold Red text indicates deficient for more than a month. Green text indicates a proposal has been requested. Blue indicates irrigation. Orange is for Staff. Bold underlined is either info or questions for the BOS.

 Behind the wall at the end of Crosswater, it was recently understood by the vendor that the hedge is CDD responsibility. Please schedule the trimming in this area. (Pic 1)



- 2. Hedges overgrown at the end of Crosswater, please schedule a trim in this area.
- 3. Brazilian pepper is still pushing through....

... the hedges at the end of Crosswater.



- 4. Please schedule a treatment for the weeds that have began covering the beds to the right, or, east of the wall going towards the lake.
- 5. String trimming was not performed at.....



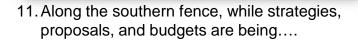

.... the time of my visit at the eastern most, or beds to the right of the wall at the end of Crosswater. It's expected these areas will be trimmed and maintained at the same consistency as the rest of the property. (Pic 5)



- 6. Lake 151 had a mowhawk of grass around it. Are measure being take to avoid having to string trim overgrown grasses around the edge and spilling turf into the lake?
- 7. Along the cart path, just before it enters the preserve near the mailboxes by Lake 175, there has been clear effort to clean up the area. Let's keep this maintained in preparation for eventual re-landscaping.
- 8. Behind Rolling Water, the area highlighted in orange on the maintenance map was becoming overgrown. This section remains part of Yellowstone's scope. (Pic 8>)
- When entering the cart path from the Rolling Water side into the preserve, areas missed by the mowers were not followed up on by the string trimmers, leaving visible mowhawks. (Pic 9>)
- 10. Near the preserve cart path entrance on the Rolling Water side, debris such as wooden survey stakes and reel mower clippings were left behind. How can we.....

reviewed, it's important to ensure there is no further encroachment each cycle. While full removal of invasive vegetation to the border isn't expected, consistent string trimming and pruning should be performed each cycle to prevent further spread. (Pic 11)



- 12. At the end of Cherry Palm, simply noting to continual monitoring the space in between the hill and the preserve fence. No changes to report.
- 13. Within the landscaped area bordering Lake 165, the carrotwood was cut back to the ground. Excellent work.
- 14. In the same landscaped area, remain vigilant in keeping unwanted grasses out and maintaining a clean edge.
- 15. There is still a hanging branch within the landscape contract area, clearly extending below 8 feet from the ground. No proposal should be needed, expected, or presented—this limb should simply be removed with a pole saw. (Pic 15>)
- 16. Along the rim of Redstone Park, on the Redstone side adjacent to the sidewalk, newly formed turf yellowing was observed. Please inspect the park's sod for potential pest issues or overwatering.

- 17. At the end of ADV, the triangular vegetated area in question appears to fall largely within the CDD's jurisdiction and should therefore be maintained by the CDD's landscape vendor. However, the map exhibits do not show this space highlighted in any maintenance color, though it does appear in the GIS as CDDowned. During an on-site inspection with a Yellowstone representative, the resident stated the area was last maintained between May and October 2024 and that she planted most of the material along her edge, believing the golf course was previously responsible and she discussed with the landscaper that her plantings would be allowed—though this may have been a misunderstanding. Overall, this reflects general mismanagement by all parties. Until the scope is formally updated to reflect accurate responsibilities, this space should continue to be maintained by the vendor, especially since they no longer maintain the large section previously highlighted in yellow. Once responsibilities are clearly defined, the RFP should be reviewed to ensure it accurately represents the updated maintenance areas.
- 18. Noting an increasing lack of water along Magnolia Landing Lane (MLL). The turf is drying out rapidly, and some shrubs are also showing stress. If the grass dies out completely, weeds will quickly take over.

19. On MLL, on the berm between the road and the preserve area next to 3200 MLL, several shrubs are being shaded out. As part of long-term planning and decision-making, should more suitable, shade-tolerant species be considered for this space, or would it be more practical to allow them to decline without replacement since this is not a highly visible area? (Pic 19)



20. A long-dead sabal has fallen among the magnolias and petunias on MLL. If the opportunity arises, include its removal in any future proposals for the area. A quick flush cut will suffice. (Pic 20)



21. Two dead pines along MLL, just west of Chestnut Ridge before the ornamental grasses, are noted for future removal. If out-of-scope tree trimming is approved in this area, please include these flush cuts.

- 22. Noting a dead pine near 3200 MLL on the edge of the preserve.
- 23. A common complaint has been that the ornamental grasses are spilling over into the walkway. During my visit, I did not find overgrown grasses obstructing pedestrian movement. Using linear photos with the sidewalk edge as a reference line, it was clear there was little to no spillover into the walkway—certainly not enough to impede passage. Even in comparison to an entirely bare edge, two people walking side by side would likely just require a wider sidewalk. The few plants that do slightly protrude have root balls directly against the concrete, meaning the only way to permanently prevent any encroachment would be to remove those plants entirely. Yellowstone currently trims back grasses monthly and performs full cutbacks in midwinter as part of standard regenerative pruning. Any further measures would fall outside normal industry standards and require a specialized maintenance scope. (Pic 23a>, 23b>)
- 24. Behind Lake B-208, the feature rock that was requested for herbicide treatment appears to have been primarily string-trimmed, leaving grass stalks behind. If not already done, please ensure this area is sprayed to remove all remaining growth from the rock.....

... additionally, the grass reduction revealed a large ant pile—please include this location in the next round of ant treatments. (Pic 24)



25. In the same area near Lake B-208, the palmetto was heavily cut back, creating a much more usable common space for nearby residents—exactly as intended, given the immense value this adds for those who enjoy spending time outdoors. Excellent work improving this area; let's carry this same approach and attention to detail across all areas we maintain. (Pic 25)



- 26. The dead palm near the pigeon plum was inspected. Since it does not match the surrounding plant palette used throughout the CDD, it was most likely planted by the HOA or a homeowner. However, it is located within the CDD-maintained landscape area.
- 27. The main entrance is developing significant hotspots as high heat persists and rainfall has slowed considerably. Manual watering may be necessary at times to prevent turf loss during the dry season, especially if elevated temperatures continue into late November.

PROPOSALS

1. With the holidays approaching and families expected to visit, the monument and main entrance could use some attention—at minimum, the installation of annuals and verification that irrigation is functioning properly in key areas. While several proposals are already in place to address the entrance, adding annuals would provide a short-term boost of color as the grass and other plants begin to dry out. (Pic 1)
