

District 64 Worlds of Wonder Summer Program 2018 at Lincoln Middle School (for students who have completed Grades 4-7)

Welcome!

We are excited to have your child enrolled in “Worlds of Wonder 2018,” District 64’s summer school program. Teachers and support staff have prepared a wonderful program filled with learning, enrichment and fun!

Safety First

If your child is walking or riding a bike to summer school, please help your child plan the safest route prior to the first day of class.

- **Crossing Guards:** Remind your children to pay close attention to crossing guards. Crossing guards will be stationed at: **Belle Plaine and Greenwood, Western and Touhy, Western and Crescent, Western and Stewart, and Western and Talcott.** Crossing guards for the District 64 Worlds of Wonder Summer School program will be at their stations at the beginning of the school day from 8:15-8:45 a.m. and at the end of the school day from 11:25-11:55 a.m. **Crossing guards are only available mid-morning between classes 1 and 2 at two stations: 1) Western and Stewart and 2) Western and Talcott. Crossing guards will be at these two stations only from 9:50-10:20 a.m.**
- **Bike Riders:** Bicycle helmets are required and bikes should be locked. The bike rack is located on Crescent Avenue.
- **Dropping Off/Picking Up Students:** Please drive carefully. Signs will be placed outside each day to serve as a visual reminder of where cars should park. Students must be dropped off on time and picked up at dismissal. No supervision is available for students left unattended after school.

Student Health, Absences and Tardies

Your willingness to disclose details due to illness will help us prevent the spread of influenza. We will continue to promote District 64’s commitment to proper hand hygiene, especially in classes where students handle and consume food. We expect students to arrive on time and to be in attendance. ***Absences must be called into the summer school office - 847-653-3783.*** Students who are tardy must report to the office and sign in before going to class.

Building Security, Student Entry and Class Locations

Students are to enter using the door on Lincoln Avenue. Staff will be outside to help students enter the building and find their classrooms.

Class Times and Supervised Break

It is important that students arrive on time for their classes. The first class begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 10:00 a.m. The second class begins at 10:10 a.m. and ends at 11:40 a.m. Students enjoy a supervised outdoor break in front of the school between 10:00 -10:10 a.m. Staff will be outside to help students re-enter the building and find their classrooms.

Meet the Teacher (optional)

On June 8 and June 29, teachers will be available from 8:20 to 8:30 (1A and 2A) and 11:40 to 11:50 (1B and 2B) to meet parents. These gatherings will end after the 10 minutes as teachers have other summer school responsibilities. Feel free to meet the teacher at this time.
