




- I am comfortable with my child(ren) participating in "in-person" learning, following ISBE and IDPH guidelines (see above). I plan to send my child(r...




- Yes - I am interested in a full-day Remote Learning program hosted by District 64.

As you consider sending your child(ren) to school, please rate your overall level of concern about the potential health risks to your child/family.



Summary & Other Considerations

In the comment section of the survey, families shared additional thoughts:

- Families are as anxious as we are to return to school:
 - Two-thirds of families are comfortable sending their kids to school if ISBE and IDPH guidelines are implemented.
 - Many parents are hopeful for a return to school five days per week. If this is not possible, parents prefer even a limited in-person schedule to a full schedule of remote learning with no in-person opportunities.
- Almost 7% of families indicated they are *uncomfortable* with in-person learning and *over a quarter are still undecided*.

Summary & Other Considerations

In the comment section of the survey, families shared additional thoughts:

- Families expressed a need for a *detailed plan* in order to make a decision about their child's possible return to in-person learning (e.g., protocol if a student becomes sick, student participation in classes like Art/Music/PE, air quality in classrooms, opportunities for students to learn outdoors, opportunities for siblings to attend on same days if students are not attending all five days).
- There are some *areas of diverse opinion*, including:
 - students wearing masks vs. not students not wearing masks
 - the desire to have a plan ASAP vs. waiting for more information about infection rates in Illinois

Summary & Other Considerations

In the comment section of the survey, families shared additional thoughts:

- The survey comments reflect the June survey data which includes the *desire for a Remote Learning program that is more robust in terms of live instruction and teacher interaction with students* (should we need to move into Remote Learning either full or part-time).
