### Dear Carpenter Families,

It was an exciting start to the school year! Nothing beats the energy of approximately 400 students all returning to school for the first day of the year. Well, it will be even better when our Kindergartners join us on Friday!

As a follow-up to my construction update email from last week, I'm happy to report that our air conditioning was up and running on the first day of school. With the support of our district office administration, custodial overtime, and hours of work from last Thursday to over the weekend, several repairs were made to damaged boards and our rooms were cool for the first day. will go over the basics of Google Drive and highlight some of the great ways Google Apps are used for student learning.



#### Parking/Driving

- Elm Street is closed in the bus pick up and drop off area between Hamlin Avenue and Broadway Avenue before and after school.
- Because of the lack of parking space around the building, students living within reasonable distance from the school are strongly encouraged to walk, rollerblade, or ride bikes to

- school. Please remember that students should be of third grade age or older to ride a bike to school unaccompanied by an adult. Please see the helmet policy in the Handbook.
- When students must be driven to school, strict adherence to drop-off/pick-up procedures is critical for our students' safety. Those who do not comply risk being cited by Park Ridge Public Safety officers.
- Please do not drop off or pick up children in the staff parking lot or the blacktop area on the north side of the school.
- Student Kiss 'n' Go Zones are on the north side of Elm Street between Broadway Avenue and the staff parking lot, and on the south side of Cherry Street between Hamlin Avenue and Broadway Avenue.
- Never ask children to get out of the car on the side of the street away from the school and cross in mid block! Students should always cross at corners and obey the Safety Patrols.
- When students are dropped off and the first bell has not yet rung, they are expected to enter the building through their assigned doors. No students should enter the building at the main front door unless they arrive after the second bell has rung.

#### **School Entrances**

Students are asked to please enter and exit the building by these doors: Grade 5 – north end; Grade 4 – north end, near gym; Grade 3 – northwest corner, near gym; Grades 1 & 2 – southwest corner; Kindergarten – south end. The main entrance (southeast corner) is to be used by students

arriving after 8:50 a.m. and for visitors throughout the day; please ring the doorbell. All visitors must enter the main entrance. See the Handbook for building entry procedures.


