- 3. 25% more trash is generated between Thanksgiving and New Year's than any other time of year.
- 4. Giftwrap and shopping bags total 4 million tons in our landfills each holiday season
- 5. Styrofoam peanuts will remain in landfills for 500 years.
- 6. Approximately 30-35 million real Christmas trees are sold each year.
