#### PARCC SCHEDULE - HELP YOUR CHILD BE READY

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The PARCC Test, an assessment for all students in Illinois, will be administered in District 64 from April 11-22.

The best preparation for the PARCC has been the quality instruction our teachers have provided this school year. However, there are things you can also do to promote your child's success:

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast before each day of testing.
- Provide your child with words of encouragement. While we don't want our students to feel anxious about any assessment, we do want them to do their best.
- Please send ear buds/headphones (nothing expensive!) to school by Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup>. We will be using these for the English Language Arts test and Math test. These items will be kept at school and returned at the end of testing.
- The PARCC is an online assessment and students will be using their Chromebooks to complete these tests. Please make sure your child brings his or her Chromebook to school each day, in its case, fully charged.

Below is our schedule for test administration:

Tuesday, April 12: ELA I & Math I Thursday, April 14: ELA II & Math II Friday, April 15: Math III & ELA III


